

Family Discussion of the Week: Authentic Living

Jesus said, "How can you say to your neighbor, 'Friend, let me take out the speck in your eye,' when you yourself do not see the log in your own eye?" (Lk. 6:42a)

Adults: When have you most felt like a hypocrite? How did you overcome this feeling? **Kids:** Is it a good thing or a bad thing to act differently from what you are really feeling? Why?

WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how we speak. If our hearts are filled with kindness and compassion, those qualities will be evident in our speaking, just as beautiful, wholesome fruit comes only from healthy trees. And vice-versa. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

It is our last Sunday in Ordinary Time before the Lent and Easter Seasons (the next Sunday of OT is June 12th!). That means it's time for Mardi Gras and Ash Wednesday. See below for the Mass times for Ash Wednesday and the guidelines about Lent.

I want to invite you to our annual Mardi Gras Party that will take place THIS Tuesday, March 1st from 6-8pm in the cafeteria. Food will be provided by the Families Together Ministry, drinks by the Knights of Columbus, and dessert by the Rosary Society; children's activities will also be available. No need for you to bring anything. If you do not regularly come to parish social events; I strongly encourage you to consider coming on Tuesday. I cannot stress enough the benefits of getting to know each other better; not only does it strengthen the sense of belonging that is so essential for church, it helps us be more effective in our work as church. The more connected we are, the more effective we are at knowing each other's gifts and our ability to network. The better we network and work together, the more efficient we become in responding to people's needs and spreading the Gospel. So coming to Mardi Gras is not just about a momentary grace of being together for a few hours, but it lays the foundation for and contributes to future graces for our parish mission. For those who do regularly attend, I want to challenge you to help me ensure that everyone who comes feels welcomed and as though they belong. Invite others to your table so no family or individual sits alone. At one of our synod meetings, one of the participants said they came to several community meals and sat alone each time and so was not inclined to come again. As a community, we should not accept this; each one of us is called to create a welcoming place whenever we gather. This is not Fr. Rich's parish where I am solely responsible for welcoming people... This is ALL OF OUR PARISH and we are all responsible to ensure everyone feels welcome. So come celebrate with your spiritual family and help advance the mission of our church this Tuesday before we enter the great season of Lent!

**Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. There will also be a Penance Service on Sunday, March 27th at 6pm and "the Light is On for You" is Wednesday, March 30th from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).

**Lenten Guidelines from Bishop Persico

- 1. Traditional Lenten practices of PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2. ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older. In 2022, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (March 25) falls on a Friday of Lent. Thus, abstinence from meat is not mandatory on Friday, March 25, 2022.
- 3. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
- **Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2022 Through last year's CSA we were able to upgrade the lighting in the church at Our Lady of Peace. Now we have much more energy and cost-efficient lighting which is brighter and has more ability to program. Thank you for your generosity!

It is time to prepare for CSA 2022, the theme is "Vibrant Dynamic Church Needs You." The work of our church takes more than the efforts of any one parish, school or ministry. Each diocesan office or ministry supported by the CSA, serves our sprawling diocese. The CSA supports the offices that oversee Catholic schools, faith formation, charitable agencies, and, quite importantly, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth. Please be assured that funding from the CSA is strictly designated for spending on the services coordinated through diocesan offices. No funds donated to the CSA have been or will be used to defray expenses related to the sexual abuse scandal.

Our assessment from the Diocese this year is \$131,755; and I remind you that every dollar raised over our assessment stays in our parish to fund different projects. This year the project identified by our parish Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council is three-fold: ONE- the replacement of the HVAC system of the rectory at OLP (we raised \$16,000 for this during Erie Gives in 2021 but the total cost is between \$26,000-30,000). TWO- replacement of the Chapel Roof (the only part of the church/office areas that has not been replaced). THREE- replacement of the outer entrance doors at church. Presently our main doors toward 38th Street are not up to code and the south doors are worn out.

In order to fund this project our overall parish financial goal for CSA 2022 is \$200,000.


 If you are cleaning out your closets or spare rooms and find any unwanted cotton, flannel or fleece material, please consider donating it to the "Sew What" group.

2022 Catholic Services Appeal Vibrant, Dynamic Church Needs YOU!

Each year, the bishop asks the faithful throughout the Diocese of Erie to support the CSA, the annual fundraising campaign of the diocese. Gifts to the CSA are put to work immediately to support the ministries and day-to-day programs of the Catholic Church in our diocese and are not invested or reserved for future use.

The 2022 Catholic Services Appeal Commitment Sunday will be held next weekend in our parish. The church serves each of us and our support is essential in continuing God's work in our area.

Every CSA donation also brings us closer to being able to complete our own parish projects: ONE- the replacement of the HVAC system of the rectory at OLP (we raised \$16,000 for this during Erie Gives in 2021 but the total cost is between \$26,000-30,000). TWO- replacement of the Chapel Roof (the only part of the church/office areas that has not been replaced). THREE- replacement of the outer entrance doors at church. Presently our main doors toward 38th Street are not up to code and the south doors are worn out.

Donations to the CSA make the following work of Christ possible:

- Pastoral Services: The CSA supports the pastoral leadership that shepherd our church and provides ongoing education to priests and deacons. Other pastoral services providing expertise throughout the diocese are offered by the Office for Protection of Children and Youth.
- Education: Catholic schools have traditionally been the most effective way to pass on the faith to future generations. The Diocese of Erie, its parishes and Catholic institutions operate 20 elementary, three middle and seven secondary schools. Lifelong faith formation initiatives throughout the diocese include youth and young adult ministry opportunities, family life outreach and support for parish-based faith formation efforts.
- Catholic Charities: Catholic Charities agencies, ministries and programs respond to the call of the poor and promote a consistent life ethic. The Catholic Charities network of agencies and diocesan programs enables effective outreach and services far beyond what any one parish could provide alone.
- Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania: CSA funds provide a grant to the Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania. The foundation is in service to all parishes, schools and Catholic ministries in the diocese, helping to build our Catholic legacy through endowments. It also provides professional fund development services to the Diocese of Erie.
- Communications: The diocesan Communications Office shares news and inspiration throughout the diocese in many ways, including its flagship publication, Faith magazine, the weekly Diocese of EriE-news, www.ErieRCD.org and Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.
- Facilities Management and Financial Services: Consultation on physical plant matters, safety issues and accident prevention, and environmental and regulatory compliance is available to pastors and parish staff through diocesan offices, as well as expertise on property and health insurances and financial services.
- **Tribunal:** In addition to involvement with canonical issues, the Tribunal processes requests for marriage dispensations and permissions, and oversees implantation of the Common Policy for Marriage.
