

Family Discussion of the Week: **Salvation Through Faith** For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." (Rom. 10:13) **Adults:** How willing are you to profess your faith in Jesus Christ openly to others? **Kids:** Would you still be able to say that you believe in Jesus if others made fun of you for it?

IN THE DESERT

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, and then the devil tested him. Moses and the Israelites had been in the desert for forty years before being led to the land of milk and honey. There were times when they called out to God, sure that, as Saint Paul wrote to the Romans, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." We sometimes spend time in the desert as well. Not a literal desert most of the time, but a desert in which it seems difficult to perceive God's presence, times when we face difficulty and are tempted to leave God's ways behind. On this First Sunday of Lent, Jesus shows us what to do in these moments: stand firm and trust in God.



From the Pastor's Desk...

To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed first Sunday of Lent to you! Please keep our RCIA and RCIC Catechumens and Candidates in your prayers as they celebrate the Rites of Sending and Election this Sunday. This rite represents their shift into their final stage of preparation for full initiation in our Catholic Community called Enlightenment/Purification. These rites mark a significant moment for the candidates, as they pray with and meet the Bishop of Erie who leads the greater Diocesan Church that the candidates are joining.

For 22 years (1990-2012) Bishop Donald Trautman presided at this ceremony and it was always a source of great joy for him. Sadly, we received the news last week that Bishop Trautman passed away at the age of 85. Our Lady of Peace will host his public viewing this Sunday, March 6th from 2-6pm as well as a Memorial Mass (open to the public) at 7pm (which counts for the Sunday obligation). The Funeral Mass on Monday, March 7th is by invitation only at St. Peter Cathedral. I hope that many of you will plan to stop by the visitation and consider attending the Memorial Mass to pray for Bishop Trautman and thank God for his ministry to our Diocesan Church.

I first got to know Bishop Trautman when I worked as interim director of Youth Ministry for the Diocese back in 1995-96. He was the bishop who accepted my application to St. Mark Seminary in 1996 and eventually ordained me a priest of the Diocese of Erie on Friday, September 7, 2001. I think all priests would agree there is a special bond between them and the bishops that walked with them through their discernment and eventual ordination. I am extremely grateful for Bishop Trautman's support and affection not only in those years but also in my 11 years of priestly ministry under his leadership. He assigned me to my first pastorate in 2007 at St. Mary of Grace in Meadville, and he showed confidence in me by assigning me to St. Joseph in Warren in 2010.

Bishop Trautman ministered to our diocesan church with a true desire to serve God in the best way he knew how. I always greatly respected his integrity and his commitment to his flock and desire to do what God asked of him. Our diocesan church owes him a great debt and I hope we can repay that with our prayers and affection during these days of his Christian Burial.

May God bless Bishop Donald Trautman with eternal rest and peace... and our week ahead!

**Lenten Guidelines from Bishop Persico

- I.Traditional Lenten practices of **PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING**, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2.ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older. In 2022, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord (March 25) falls on a Friday of Lent. Thus, abstinence from meat is not mandatory on Friday, March 25, 2022.
- 3. GOOD FRIDAY is also a day of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

****Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2022** Through last year's Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) we were able to upgrade the lighting in the church. Now we have much more energy and cost-efficient lighting which is brighter and has more ability to program. Thank you for your generosity!

Now, it is time to for CSA 2022, the theme is "Vibrant Dynamic Church Needs You." The work of our church takes more than the efforts of any one parish, school or ministry. Each diocesan office or ministry supported by the CSA, serves our sprawling diocese. The CSA supports the offices that oversee Catholic schools, faith formation, charitable agencies, and, quite importantly, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth.

Our assessment from the Diocese this year is \$131,755; and I remind you that every dollar raised over our assessment stays in our parish to fund different projects. This year the project identified by our parish Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council is three-fold: ONE- the replacement of the HVAC system of the rectory at OLP (we raised \$16,000 for this during Erie Gives in 2021 but the total cost is between \$26,000-30,000). TWO- replacement of the Chapel Roof (the only part of the church/office areas that has not been replaced). THREE- replacement of the outer entrance doors at church. Presently our main doors toward 38th Street are not up to code and the south doors are worn out. In order to fund these needed projects our overall parish financial goal for CSA 2022 is \$200,000. Please place your pledge envelopes in the offertory at Mass or send/drop off at the parish office. I am grateful for the sacrifices you and your family make for our parish and Diocesan Church.




LENT AND CRS RICE BOWL

- Education: Catholic schools have traditionally been the most effective way to pass on the faith to future generations. - **Catholic Charities:** Catholic Charities agencies, ministries and programs respond to the call of the poor and promote a consistent life ethic. The Catholic Charities network of agencies and diocesan programs enables effective outreach and services far beyond what any one parish could provide alone.
- Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania: CSA funds provide a grant to the Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania. The foundation is in service to all parishes, schools and Catholic ministries in the diocese, helping to build our Catholic legacy through endowments. It also provides professional fund development services to the Diocese of Erie.
- **Communications:** The diocesan Communications Office shares news and inspiration throughout the diocese in many ways, including its flagship publication, Faith magazine, the weekly Diocese of EriE-news, www.ErieRCD.org and Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.
