



Mark, the entire parish staff and those who volunteered to help with hospitality and logistics as we hosted the viewing and memorial Mass for Bishop Emeritus Donald Trautman last Sunday. I received many compliments regarding our parish's effort; and I commend you on doing what OLP has always done, which is stepping up to what is asked of you. Well done!!

Speaking of stepping up, I again thank Gina Adams and Joe Bell who have been our lead facilitators and organizers of our synod meetings at Our Lady of Peace. **Medical Team at OLP

At the initiative of the Pastoral Council, we have established a Security Committee at OLP. Their first goal is to establish a Medical Team that would help respond to medical emergencies at all our Masses and other community events. This weekend we will be taking sign ups from members of the parish who are medical professionals who would be willing to be part of a schedule and to take the lead at any medical emergencies if they arise. We would love to have a team of 25 volunteers. If you are a medical professional please consider this ministry that would put all of us more at ease in the case of an emergency.

**Holy Hour of Prayer for Peace in Ukraine Our monthly holy hour on Monday, March 21st will focus on praying for the situation in Ukraine. The 7pm Holy Hour will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as well as song and the Litany of Peace.

**Optional Face Masks for Liturgical Ministers Starting this weekend (March 12/13), face masks will no longer be mandatory for those who serve as liturgical ministers at Masses at OLP. We are doing this for the same reasons that the schools and public indoor places are no longer requiring masks. We will continue to have a section on the far east of the church that is reserved for only those wearing masks and everyone is still welcome to voluntarily wear a mask. ALSO: Ministers of Holy Communion will continue to mask while distributing the Body of Christ. I also want to stress that if the COVID status of our area rises back to HIGH (we are presently at MEDIUM) that we reserve the right to reimplement the masking for ministers if we feel it is for the common good. As always feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.

**Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm

(before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. There will also be a Penance Service on Sunday, March 27th at 6pm and "the Light is On for You" is Wednesday, March 30th from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).

**Stations of the Cross This great Lenten devotional is held on Fridays of Lent at 7pm.

**Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2022 The theme for CSA 2022 is "Vibrant Dynamic Church Needs You." The work of our church takes more than the efforts of any one parish, school or ministry. Our assessment from the Diocese this year is \$131,755; and I remind you that every dollar raised over our assessment stays in our parish to fund different projects. This year the project identified by our Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council is three-fold: ONE- the replacement of the HVAC system of the rectory at OLP (we raised \$16,000 for this during Erie Gives in 2021 but the total cost is between \$26,000-30,000). TWO- replacement of the Chapel Roof. THREEreplacement of the doors at church. To fund this project our overall parish financial goal for CSA 2022 is \$200,000. Please place your pledge envelopes in the offertory at Mass or send/drop off at the parish office. Currently, we have received 345 pledges for \$121,765. Thank you for your support of OLP and the diocesan church.

**Pilgrimages: England July 18-28, 2022 and Holy Land November 6-18, 2023 I realize with COVID it's hard to commit to the England pilgrimage but I wanted to remind you that you can purchase insurance for both trips in case you have to cancel. My hope is to stick with both trips regardless of whether we reach 40 pilgrims. 206 Tours, who is handling both pilgrimages, has said they hope to run both and will wait until spring to see where things stand for England. It would be very helpful if you could contact me if you are considering going to either England or the Holy Land. Please contact me at fr.rich@olp.org so I can get a better sense of where we stand. Lent is a 40-day journey of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Each day during Lent, we have the opportunity to be



Presently our main doors toward 38th Street are not up to code and the south doors are worn out.

- Pastoral Services: The CSA supports the pastoral leadership that shepherd our church and provides ongoing education
 to priests and deacons. Other pastoral services providing expertise throughout the diocese are offered by the Office
 for Protection of Children and Youth.

The Diocese of Erie, its parishes and Catholic institutions operate 20 elementary, three middle and seven secondary schools. - Catholic Charities: Catholic Charities agencies, ministries and programs respond to the call of the poor and promote a consistent life ethic. The Catholic Charities network of agencies and diocesan programs enables effective outreach and services far beyond what any one parish could provide alone.
- Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania: CSA funds provide a grant to the Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania. The foundation is in service to all parishes, schools and Catholic ministries in the diocese, helping to build our Catholic legacy through endowments. It also provides professional fund development services to the Diocese of Erie.
- Communications: The diocesan Communications Office shares news and inspiration throughout the diocese in many ways, including its flagship publication, Faith magazine, the weekly Diocese of EriE-news, www.ErieRCD.org and Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.


