To my spiritual family of Our Lady of Peace-

A blessed Palm Sunday and beginning of Holy Week to you! We join those who honored Jesus during his triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of our Masses this weekend. We take palms as a symbol of the ways that we can honor and adore Jesus more in our lives and to reaffirm our desire to welcome Him and never take Him for granted. I always like to walk you through Holy Week to reinforce its importance and to help you understand the significance of this week as well as reminding you that this week should not look the same as any other week of the year.

Monday, April 11th, is the Mass of the Sacred Chrism at St. Peter Cathedral in Erie (at 2pm). There Bishop Lawrence Persico will bless the holy oils for the Diocese for the new year (the Oil of the Catechumentate, the Oil of the Infirmed, and the Sacred Chrism). Also at that Mass the priests of the diocese renew their promises with the Bishop to serve the spiritual needs of our diocese and parishes as ordained clergy. I always promised myself that if I ever became a pastor in Erie that I would make every effort to invite my parishioners to be a part of this great Diocesan Liturgy. Consider yourself invited- I would love to see you there!

Holy Thursday, April 14th, we gather at 7pm for the celebration of the Lord's Supper as we remember the first Mass that Jesus celebrated at the Last Supper with the apostles. Recall this Mass includes the significant ritual of the Washing of the Feet where your clergy wash the feet of members of our parish community in imitation of Jesus' washing of the apostles' feet to remind us that we are all called to serve each other. We conclude that Mass with a Eucharistic procession which concludes in the School Cafeteria where we "go to the garden" with Jesus. There the Eucharist will be reposed in the tabernacle until 11pm at which time we will say the Night Prayer of the church with those who are present. I thank the members of the Knights of Columbus who will help with the procession and help keep watch in prayer for that extra time after Mass.

Good Friday, April 15th, is our most somber day of the whole year and we should all make an extra effort to be prayerful and quiet, especially during the hours of Noon-3pm (the traditional hours that Jesus spent on the cross). We will gather for our celebration of the Passion of the Lord at 1:30pm. Recall that this is the only day in the whole year that we have no Mass and the tabernacle is empty (extra hosts are consecrated at the Holy Thursday Mass and are reserved privately in the sacristy for distribution during the Good Friday Service). The service also includes special intercessions and the veneration of the cross. We will also have a special Tenebrae Service at 7pm (in particular for those who are unable to attend the 1:30pm service). This is something new at OLP this year. It is a prayer tradition that comes from the Latin word for "darkness" or "shadows." It starts with a candelabra being lit and then slowly extinguished as excerpts from Scripture are read and songs are sung. It is a meditation on the darkness Jesus entered into through his passion, suffering and death (and ultimately conquered through his Resurrection). The service ends in darkness. The church will be open Friday from 7am to 8pm for those who may want to stop and pray or meditate on the Way of the Cross privately (there will be copies of the Stations of the Cross that we have used this Lent available at the doors).

The highlight of this special week and the whole liturgical year is **the Great Easter Vigil**, **which will be held Holy Saturday night**, **April 16th**, **at 8:30pm**. It starts outside with the Easter fire and candle procession. It continues with a special Liturgy of the Word which walks us through salvation history and then leads up to the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation for our RCIA candidates. It is the most unique and powerful liturgy of the year in our Catholic Tradition and everyone should experience it.

Then of course we have our **Easter Sunday, April 17th**, Mass celebrations (7:30AM, 9:00AM & 11:00AM) with incense, special music (the Gloria and Alleluia return), and decorations. We will talk more about the significance of Easter next week, but I wanted to spend some time outlining Holy Week as a way to inspire you to participate in part or all of it. If you do, I guarantee that Easter will be more meaningful for you.

May God bless our Holy Week ahead!

THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST'S LOVE

From the proclamation of the Gospel at the beginning of the liturgy, we know that today is different, not only because we hear two Gospel passages, or because we hold palms and move in procession. Today begins Holy Week, a time set apart, a week in which to listen, pray, reflect, and take to heart the truth of Christ's passion, crucifixion, death, and ultimately, resurrection. It takes a week, and a lifetime, to truly hear the message of Christ's love. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus willingly sacrificed himself, so we must hear the story again and again. Let this week be for us a new moment of faith in which we, together with the criminal who was crucified with Christ, cry out, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."




