Family Discussion of the Week: Made New by Christ

Clean out the old yeast so that you may be a new batch, as you really are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed. (1 Cor. 5:7) **Adults:** What change could the hope of the resurrection of Christ inspire you to make?

Kids: What bad habit would you like to "clear out" during the hopeful time of this Easter season?

EVERYTHING IS CHANGED

Easter changes everything. Having been raised from the dead, Jesus shatters the frightful images that haunt humanity. Betrayal, torture, crucifixion, death, burial—these terrors pale in the brilliant glory of Jesus resurrected. Today's psalm guides our response to God's power: "it is wonderful in our eyes." Today is indeed a day for wonder, for gasping in astonishment at Jesus' resurrection. For all of human history, death had been final. In the Acts of the Apostles, though, Peter testifies that Jesus, who was publicly executed, was raised to life by God. John's Gospel admits that the disciples "did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Even Jesus' closest friends were not expecting this innovation: life after death. In response to the Easter miracle, Paul tells us to become "a fresh batch of dough." Everything, even our very selves, must become new. Easter changes everything.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Easter! And "Christ Is Risen...He is Risen Indeed!" Every Easter I talk about this traditional Paschal greeting which is still used in many Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches, and some Roman Catholic Churches. This greeting goes back to the early church and reinforced the ultimate significance of what we celebrate on Easter Sunday... that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the defining truth for all Christians. It was said in a dialogue form in which one Christian would greet another with "Christus resurrexit!" (Latin for Christ is Risen!) and the other would respond "Vere resurrexit!" (He is Risen Indeed!). This form of greeting reminds us that our identity as Christians should be the first and most significant dimension of who we are and should bring great joy, hope and peace into our daily lives.

Part of our mission at Our Lady of Peace is to ensure that the Christian way of life continues not just in our generation, but for generations to come. One new way we can do that is by supporting our Parish Endowment, established with the Catholic Foundation of Northwest PA. This year, all the money raised by our annual Faithful to the Finish 5K Run/Walk will go toward the OLP Parish Endowment. The race date is May 14th, and like last year, it will be virtual. The virtual option allows for the most flexibility; we look forward to gathering in person next year. Look elsewhere in the bulletin for more information on the 5K and hopefully you received a mailing from the parish in the last week which also explains it further.

A lot of good things are happening at OLP, and I continue to be grateful to all those in our parish who volunteer in support of the various ministries that serve not only our parish but the greater Erie community. Back in January we postponed our **annual Appreciation Dinner**, and I am excited to announce that the dinner will take place on **Saturday, May 21st at 6:15pm in the school cafeteria** following the 5:00PM Mass. We welcome Deacon Chris Wheeler back to OLP for the Sacred Triduum! Unfortunately he is due back at the seminary in Latrobe on Monday. Please continue to pray for Deacon Chris as he enters his final month of preparation for his ordination to the priesthood on Friday, May 27, 2022, at 7pm at St. Patrick Church. His Mass of Thanksgiving at OLP will be Sunday, June 12th at 9am, please mark those dates in your calendar. I look forward to celebrating these special moments for Chris, our parish and our Diocesan Church! **Easter Octave The celebration of Easter (like Christmas) cannot be exhausted or limited to one day, so we as Catholics reserve eight of them, the OCTAVE of EASTER, to celebrate as Easter Day. The celebration of this most central part of our Christian faith, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, reminds us that the resurrection of Jesus, and its result, the conquering of sin and death FOREVER, requires a full week, plus one, to celebrate. We know that the celebration of the hope and joy the resurrection brings is what we celebrate EVERY SUNDAY (and what we celebrate for the 50 days of the Easter Season), but in these eight days we amplify the FESTIVE REALITY of Easter. The most concrete way we celebrate the octave is at daily Mass where the prayers for Easter Sunday are said every day and we incorporate song throughout the liturgy. The Gospel readings at Mass recount many of the post resurrection appearances of Jesus to the apostles and disciples. Also, the Easter dismissal at Mass ("Go in Peace, Alleluia, Alleluia") is used all week. Consider celebrating Easter all week at daily Mass or joining on our parish YouTube channel. **Divine Mercy Sunday (April 24th) In addition to our Masses that will celebrate this special Feast which is also the end of the Easter Octave, we will have Confessions from 2-3pm and a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration from 3-4pm. **Liturgy of the Word for Children (LOWC) Volunteers **Needed We hope to start up Liturgy of the Word for Children in the Easter Season, please contact Sarah Beaver at the parish office if you would like to volunteer for this important ministry to our children. LOWC will take place during the 11am Mass where children ages 4-7 are dismissed to the social room (basement level) to have their own experience of God's Word. They return to the church at the preparation of the gifts and rejoin their families. This can be a good way to engage our younger children while also allowing their parents to have a more focused experience of the Liturgy of the Word.

**Emergency Medical Team At the initiative of the Pastoral Council, we have established a Security Committee at OLP. Their first goal is to establish a Medical Team that would help respond to medical emergencies at Masses and other community events. Call the office to volunteer as part of the team that would help with any medical emergencies if they arise. We would love to have a team of 25 volunteers. **Praver for Ukraine We must continue to pray for an end to the war and for the people of Ukraine during this moment of huge humanitarian need. Pray also for the conversion of Vladimir Putin and the people of Russia who support such aggression and violence. We will offer our daily Masses one day every week (7am and 12:10pm) for peace in the Ukraine and the end of the war.

4-3-2022 Child Abuse Prevention Month - Reporting known or suspected child abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2020 Pennsylvania state report there were 4,941 substantiated reports of child abuse in Pennsylvania. 1,932 or 39% of the substantiated reports were for sexual abuse, 1,384 were physical abuse. To report suspected abuse of a minor, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). For particular questions on reporting abuse, you may call *Cindy Zemcik, Coordinator for the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth in the Diocese of Erie at 814-824-1195*.

4-10-2022 Child Abuse Prevention Month - Be Vigilant- Child Abuse Prevention Month should lead to heightened awareness of the need to be vigilant about providing a safe environment for all within the Church and for our communities. It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children and communicating our concerns to the appropriate parties. Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture of prevention. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. When we witness inappropriate behavior or something that just doesn't seem quite right, we must report our concerns through the appropriate channels. 4-17-2022 Child Abuse Prevention Month - Recent statistics tell us one out of every four girls and one out of every 6 boys are sexually abused before they turn 18. 91% of sexual abuse is perpetrated by someone the child or the child's family knows. This means that on every Sunday in our congregation there are people who have been abused and may continue to experience the pain of that abuse. Reaching out to all victims/survivors of abuse is critical in bringing hope and the love of Christ to them. Counseling assistance for victims/survivors of clergy sexual abuse is available by contacting the Diocesan Victim Assist. Coordinator, Dr. Gerard Tobin, 814-451-1521.






2022 Catholic Services Appeal Vibrant, Dynamic Church Needs YOU!

Each year, the bishop asks the faithful throughout the Diocese of Erie to support the CSA, the annual fundraising campaign of the diocese. Gifts to the CSA are put to work immediately to support the ministries and day-to-day programs of the Catholic Church in our diocese and are not invested or reserved for future use.

The 2022 Catholic Services Appeal Commitment Sunday will be held next weekend in our parish. The church serves each of us and our support is essential in continuing God's work in our area.

Every CSA donation also brings us closer to **being able to complete our own parish projects:** ONE- the replacement of the HVAC system of the rectory at OLP (we raised \$16,000 for this during Erie Gives in 2021 but the total cost is between \$26,000-30,000). TWO- replacement of the Chapel Roof (the only part of the church/office areas that has not been replaced). THREE- replacement of the outer entrance doors at church. Presently our main doors toward 38th Street are not up to code and the south doors are worn out.



Would you value joining others in a conversation about mental health and well-being? Would you like to discover what God, Scripture, and Church have to say in light of the experiences of mental health challenges? Join us for *The Sanctuary Course*. The topics covered feel particularly relevant for our current time, and the course creates an opportunity to connect with and support each other in meaningful ways.

The Sanctuary Course is an eight-part course designed to raise awareness and start conversations in local parishes regarding mental health. Created in collaboration with mental health professionals, theologians, and clergy, it offers faith communities the opportunity to learn about mental health and grow in their ability to support each other. Topics covered include: mental health and mental illness, stigma, recovery, companionship, selfcare, and community. Accompanied with videos of the stories of real people who live with various mental health issues, as well as insights from archbishops, theologians, and psychologists. This course is presented from a Catholic perspective, but is open to anyone and everyone.

The West Millcreek Food Pantry was blessed to provide services for over 100 families. We serve a monthly average of 100 families which include 47 children under 17, 250 adults, and 87 seniors from the Millcreek area every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month. We give out mostly nonperishable foods and meat purchased from the Food Bank as well as bread, dairy and fresh vegetables. We also purchase milk and sweets. We distributed 115 turkeys for Thanksgiving and 100 hams for Easter. We also participate in the Senior Box federal program for needy senior citizens who receive an extra 30 pounds of food and cheese once a month. So far this year we distributed over 65,000 pounds of food plus an additional 9,000 pounds of donated food. Our costs to distribute the food averages \$1,700 per month.

The West Millcreek Food Pantry is an important mission for our 8 contributing churches. (Our Lady of Peace, Westminster Presbyterian, Wayside Presbyterian, Church of the Cross, St. Julia's, Lakewood Methodist, Asbury Methodist and the Universal Unitarians.) We thank each congregation for their unique donations. We also receive donations from McDowell HS, Our Lady of Peace School, Local Service organizations (VFW, American Legion, the Auxiliaries, the Moose Lodge and the Sportsman Club), First Student, Ryan Bizzarro's office. OLP Church also collected personal and household cleaning products and delivered 100 bags for our clients. Through the generosity of these people and organizations, both financial and food items, we are able to provide food for our clients. Through the kind donations from our churches and the Sunshine Girls we provided gifts and gloves, hats and scarves for our clients during the month of December.
