MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Although we are five full weeks into the celebration of Easter, today's readings focus on newness. Our Easter food leftovers may be long gone, but the readings insist on every moment's freshness in the risen Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles depicts Paul and Barnabas reflecting on all the innovative work that God has done with them. They have traveled hundreds of miles, introducing faith in Jesus Christ to all who listen, even Gentiles. For the dutiful Jewish scholar Paul, preaching to Gentiles is a completely unique development. Jesus calls Paul, and us, not to be afraid of new challenges: as John the Evangelist reports in Revelation, Jesus promises to "make all things new." In the Gospel reading, Jesus even gives us a new commandment. The Hebrew Scriptures overflow with commandments, but Jesus knows we need one more, perfect mission: "love one another." Copyright © J. 

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Anniversary Our Lady of Peace! Today, May 15, 2022, is the 45th Anniversary of the Dedication of our beautiful church. Since it falls on a Sunday, we will celebrate the anniversary liturgically at our Masses on Monday, May 16th. We will pray for all the living and deceased members of OLP Parish as well as the clergy, religious and benefactors who all helped build our church facility in 1976-77.

I share parts of our history from our parish website in honor of our anniversary. In September 1955, Archbishop John Mark Gannon purchased a tract of land on the south side of West 38th Street in Millcreek Township. Always the visionary, Archbishop Gannon created Our Lady of Peace Parish anticipating the spiritual needs of people who would be moving into the area. On September 23rd, he issued a decree that would establish the parish on September 30th. Father Jim Daily was appointed the founding pastor effective October Ist. His mission: establish both the physical and spiritual makings of a parish.

Plans unfolded quickly. On the first Friday of October, James Wilson, superintendent of Millcreek Schools, assured Father Daily that the Millcreek School Board would grant permission for the use of McDowell High School Auditorium for Sunday Masses. With a major hurdle crossed, the fledgling parish celebrated its first Masses on October 17th. About 150 faithful attended either the 9 or 11 AM. Masses. Each passing Sunday brought more people. Two more Masses - 8AM and Noon - were added in November. The unfinished house on the new parish property became the rectory on November 1,1955. From there, Father Daily began the framework that would support necessary parish activities. On August 23, 1956, the rectory became Father Daily's home and soon after the "historic" basement was converted into a chapel where the Blessed Sacrament was reserved. Weekday Masses also were offered there. Just a few days earlier on August 19th, Archbishop Gannon broke ground for the new school and construction began the next day. Although work was slowed by a long, severe winter, the archbishop laid the cornerstone for the school in June 1957 and presided at a Benediction service in the unfinished lobby of the new building.

On September 8th of that year, the first Sunday Masses were offered in "our own" building, using the cafeteria of the new school as a church. That Sunday, 1,576 people attended Masses, a figure about 10 times higher than the group that attended the first Masses under the Our Lady of Peace banner only two years earlier. The next day, Our Lady of Peace School opened for the first time with a Mass at 9AM. In that initial year 388 students learned religion, reading, writing and arithmetic in eight grades occupying 16 rooms. As the parish grew so did the school. The original school building soon became too small and in 1962 construction began to add eight additional classrooms and an activities room. With this building, the parish was able to continue to use the cafeteria as a church and the activities room for school and church functions. In 1965, the auditorium was built and "doubled" as the church. During the mid-1970s, more than 1,000 students called Our Lady of Peace School home. The figure is a "high water mark" for enrollment.

The growth of the mid-1970s signaled the need for a "real" church. On January 12, 1976, Bishop Alfred M. Watson helped break ground for a parish complex that would include a church, rectory, sacristy, and offices. Construction began in February and the first Mass was offered in the new church on Saturday, February 5, 1977. On May 15, 1977, Bishop Watson officially dedicated the new church at a solemn mass for that purpose and that is now our anniversary day. In the years from the completion of the auditorium to the completion of the new church, a solid team of Father Daily, parish organizations and parishioners raised nearly \$1 million for construction of the parish complex. That effort came after paying off hundreds of thousands of dollars in debt for the construction and expansion of the school.

This weekend and on Monday, let us show our gratitude to God and the living and deceased members of Our Lady of Peace Parish whose faith, dedication, sacrifice and love have brought us to this point in our history. Today, we recommit ourselves to continue this legacy through our stewardship of time, talent and treasure to the glory of God forever!

May God bless our parish community on our anniversary and our Easter week ahead!


Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Bullying - The Centers for Disease Control and Department of Education define bullying as: any unwanted aggressive behavior(s) by another youth or group of youths, who are not siblings or current dating partners, that involves an observed or perceived power imbalance and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated. 20% of students ages 12-18 experienced bullying nationwide. 19% of students in grades 9-12 report being bullied on school property. When adults respond quickly to bullying behavior, they send the message that it is not acceptable. There are ways parents can make a positive difference. Parents should educate themselves on the signs that a child has been bullied or is a bully. They should keep the lines of communication open with their child and model for their child how to treat others. Parents can encourage their child to be inclusive by welcoming others to join their activities and groups. The Knights of Columbus Council of Our Lady of Peace

Baby Bottle Fundraiser:

The **Our Lady of Peace Knights of Columbus** have joined all the Erie and Crawford County councils to conduct a **Baby Bottle** fundraising drive to benefit the **Women's Care Center of Erie** in their goal of purchasing a **mobile ultrasound van**. This medically equipped vehicle will visit rural areas, as well as our five local universities to provide valuable lifesaving services.

In 2021, the KofC provided an ultrasound machine to the Care Center, and in less than a year 63 previously abortion bound women chose life for their unborn children, after viewing them on this state of the art machine. While this is

certainly an achievement, we are now focusing on helping to raise \$250,000 to purchase a **mobile ultrasound van**. If the KofC along with other entities are able to achieve this goal, the KofC Supreme council in Connecticut will pay the entire cost of the mobile ultrasound machine, (around \$45,000).



Baby bottles are available at the church office. If you are able, we ask that you fill them with spare change, cash or checks (made out to: Ultrasound Fund) and return them on Father's Day.


