Family Discussion of the Week: Keeping Jesus' Word

Jesus answered him, "Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them." (John 14:23)

Adults: What difference has it made in your life when you made a decision in accord with Jesus' teachings?

Kids: When will you have to make a decision this week? What will help you make a good decision?

RETURNING TO ORDINARY LIFE

Six weeks into our Easter rejoicing, the Church gives us readings today that start preparing us for a return to ordinary life. The Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel both dwell on proper daily behavior for followers of Jesus, while the reading from Revelation reminds us why we bother with laws at all. In Acts, leaders of the church meet to discuss which essential elements of the Mosaic Law converts must obey if they wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ. John's Gospel reflects back to the Last Supper discourse when Jesus himself emphasizes the importance of obeying God's commandments. Observing God's law, says Jesus, shows a desire to be intimate with the Lord. We follow rules not for their own sake, but to love God and neighbor better. This more excellent love brings us closer to Revelation's vision of paradise, gleaming with "the splendor of God."

****The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is Thursday, May 26th and is a Holy Day of Obligation.** Masses at OLP are Wednesday, May 25th at 5:30pm and Thursday at 7am, 12:10pm and 1:30pm (School Mass).

****Baby Food Drive for the Ukraine will be next weekend, May 28/29.** Bring one or more jars of baby food for the Ukrainian exiles and refugees and it will be sent with donations from the First Ukrainian Pentecostal Church in Erie.

****Masses this Week** **Monday, May 23rd** – Easter Weekday; **Tuesday, May 24th**– Mass in Time of War; **Wednesday, May 25th**– St. Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church (8th Century English Benedictine Theologian), **Thursday, May 26th**– The Ascension of the Lord; **Friday, May 27th**– St. Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop (7th Century Roman Benedictine Monk sent to England- first bishop and primate- Apostle to England); **Saturday, May 28th**– Easter Weekday.



****Total Tune Up Fair**

OLP is the host site for one of three Total Tune Up Senior Fairs to be held in June. **OLP is Thursday, June 9th, St. George is June 10th and Blessed Sacrament on June 13th.** Each event will be held from 9:30am to Noon at which time a lunch will be provided. Those who attend will get clarity on their legal and financial concerns, health issues like confusing medications, and dental questions. There will be assessments for fitness, balance and blood pressure as well as COVID boosters and more. There will be presentations on taxes, increased income, improved distribution options, living wills, estate and funeral planning. Stop by the parish office to pick up a ticket for any of the 3 dates. The value of the event is \$20, a free will offering can be made for the ticket.

****A city-wide Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession will take place on Sunday, June 19th at 1:00PM at St. Peter Cathedral.** This is one of four processions taking place throughout the Diocese of Erie to kick off a three year Eucharistic Renewal in the Catholic Church throughout the United States. Year One focuses on the Diocese, Year 2 on the parish and Year 3 on the Catholic Church on a national level (highlighted by a Eucharistic Congress). More information will be provided as it becomes available but please plan on joining us on June 19th for now.

****Phone Calls to Parishioners** The Pastoral Council will be joining our staff and members of our Welcome Committee to call parishioners to say 'hello' and see how you are doing. Callers may be calling from their private phone, so please be open to receiving their call or returning their message. We hope you will feel the prayers and support of the OLP community. Thank you for your receptiveness to this outreach and let me know if you have any questions.

****OLP Faithful to the Finish 5K and Parish Endowment**

Part of our mission at Our Lady of Peace is to ensure that the Christian way of life continues not just in our generation, but for generations to come. One new way we can do that is by supporting our Parish Endowment established with the Catholic Foundation of Northwest PA. This year, all the money raised by our annual Faithful to the Finish 5K will go toward the OLP Parish Endowment. The race date is May 14th, and like last year it is virtual so you have until May 31st to complete your run/walk. ****History of Our Lady of Peace Parish** May 15, 2022, was the 45th Anniversary of the Dedication of our beautiful church. In September 1955, Archbishop John Mark Gannon had purchased a tract of land on the south side of West 38th Street in Millcreek Township anticipating the spiritual needs of people who would be moving into the Our Lady of Peace area. On September 23rd, he issued a decree establishing the parish on September 30th. Father James Daily was appointed the founding pastor effective October 1st. His mission: establish both the physical and spiritual makings of a parish.

Plans unfolded quickly. In October 1955 the new parish celebrated its first Masses with 150 faithful attending either the 9 or 11AM Masses. In November two more Masses were added to the weekend schedule. On August 23, 1956, the rectory became Father Daily's home and soon after the "historic" basement was converted into a chapel where the Blessed Sacrament was reserved. Weekday Masses also were offered there. Just a few days earlier on August 19th, Archbishop Gannon broke ground for the new school and construction which was completed in June 1957.

On September 8th of that year, the first Sunday Masses were offered in "our own" building, using the cafeteria of the new school as a church. That Sunday, 1,576 people attended Masses. The next day, Our Lady of Peace School opened for the first time with a Mass at 9AM. In that initial year 388 students learned religion, reading, writing and arithmetic in eight grades occupying 16 rooms. As the parish grew so did the school. In 1962 construction began to add eight additional classrooms and an activities room. With this building, the parish was able to continue to use the cafeteria as a church and the activities room for school and church functions. In 1965, the auditorium was built and "doubled" as the church. During the mid-1970s, more than 1,000 students called Our Lady of Peace School home. The figure is a "high water mark" for enrollment.

On January 12, 1976, Bishop Alfred M. Watson helped break ground for a parish complex that would include a church, rectory, sacristy and offices. Construction began in February and the first Mass was offered in the new church on Saturday, February 5, 1977. On May 15, 1977, Bishop Watson officially dedicated the new church at a solemn mass for that purpose and that is now our anniversary day. In the years from the completion of the auditorium to the completion of the new church, a solid team of Father Daily, parish organizations and parishioners raised nearly \$1 million for construction of the parish complex. That effort came after paying off hundreds of thousands of dollars in debt for the construction and expansion of the school.

Let us show at our Masses this weekend and Monday our gratitude to God and the living and deceased members of Our Lady of Peace Parish whose faith, dedication, sacrifice and love have brought us to this point in our



history. And we recommit ourselves to continue this legacy through our stewardship of time, talent and treasure to the glory of God forever!

My hope is to stick with both trips regardless of whether we reach 40 pilgrims. 206 Tours, who is handling both pilgrimages, has said they hope to run both trips. Baby Bottle Fundraiser:

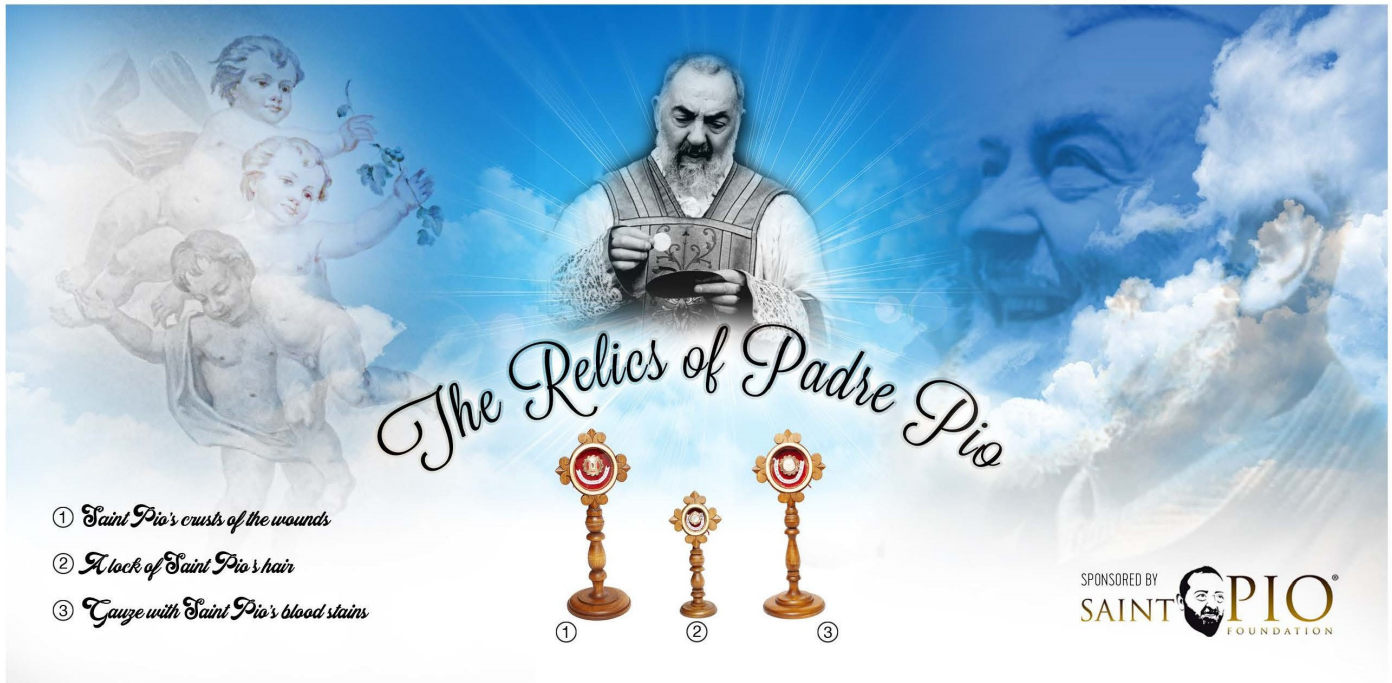
The **Our Lady of Peace Knights of Columbus** have joined all the Erie and Crawford County councils to conduct a **Baby Bottle** fundraising drive to benefit the **Women's Care Center of Erie** in their goal of purchasing a **mobile ultrasound van**. This medically equipped vehicle will visit rural areas, as well as our five local universities to provide valuable lifesaving services.

In 2021, the KofC provided an ultrasound machine to the Care Center, and in less than a year 63 previously abortion bound women chose life for their unborn children, after viewing them on this state of the art machine. While this is certainly an achievement, we are now focusing on helping to raise \$250,000 to purchase a **mobile ultrasound van**. If the KofC along with other entities are able to achieve this goal, the KofC Supreme council in Connecticut will pay the entire cost of the mobile ultrasound machine, (around \$45,000).



Baby bottles are available at the church office. If you are able, we ask that you fill them with spare change, cash or checks (made out to: Ultrasound Fund) and return them on Father's Day.

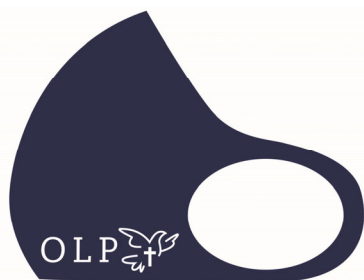
