

Jesus prayed, "I pray not only for them, but also for those who believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 17:20-21)

SENT FORTH

Today we celebrate Jesus' return to heaven. If we struggle to know how to feel about this event, we take our cue from Jesus' disciples. These disciples are first-hand witnesses to the Ascension, returning afterword to Jerusalem, where "they were continually in the temple praising God." Long-time companions of the Lord, they surely feel the pain of physical separation from Jesus. Yet they praise God continually. They accept God's plan, looking forward to the day when Christ will come again. As our reading from Hebrews affirms, Christ will return to "bring salvation to those who eagerly await him." This Good News is almost too much to take in; the Acts of the Apostles explains that an angel has to wake the disciples from their stupor, reminding them to start the Lord's work. Today's readings are our own angel, sending us forth in joyful hope.

Happy Memorial Day Weekend! Please see below for my thoughts on this civil holiday that traditionally begins the celebration of summer. I would like highlight two new opportunities at our parish to help bring us more peace of mind... One for our parish and one for you personally. The first is an AED/CPR/First Aid Training which will allow our new Emergency Response Team as well as our ushers and ministers of hospitality to be prepared for emergencies that may arise at Mass or another parish community event. The new OLP Security Committee is organizing this training, which is open to ALL parishioners, for CPR, AED and first aid on Saturday, June 4th in the school cafeteria from 8am-12noon. Ushers and future ministers of hospitality are asked to attend if possible. Please call or email Cynthia (814-833-7701x0, cynthia.berarducci@olp.org) to reserve a spot.

The second opportunity is for your personal peace of mind, particularly for our senior parishioners. It is called the Total Tune Up Fair. There will be three Total Tune Up Fairs held in June. OLP is the host on Thursday, June 9th, St. George on June 10th and Blessed Sacrament is June 13th. Each event will be held from 9:30am to Noon at which time a lunch will be provided. Those attending will get clarity on their legal and financial concerns, health issues like confusing medications, and dental questions. There will be assessments for fitness, balance and blood pressure as well as COVID boosters and more. There will also be presentations on taxes, increased income, improved distribution options, living wills, estate and funeral planning. Stop by the parish office to pick up a ticket for any Total Tune Up Fair option. A freewill offering can be made for the ticket which is valued at \$20.

I hope you consider attending one of these opportunities that will help us all attain a greater peace of mind. May God bless our veterans, living and deceased, and our last week of Easter ahead!

**Baby Food Drive for the Ukraine will be THIS weekend, May 28/29. Bring one or more jars of baby food for the Ukrainian exiles and refugees and it will be sent with donations from the First Ukrainian Pentecostal Church in Erie. **Memorial Day Mass/Praying for the Dead/Purgatory

Join your OLP family on Monday at 9am to not just commemorate those who have given their lives in service to our country, but to more importantly to pray the most effective prayer we have in our Catholic tradition for them... come join in offering Mass for them. We do so, following

the example of Judas Maccabee in the Bible. Remember that in the Second Book of Maccabees, Judas takes up a collection for an expiatory sacrifice for those who had died in battle against the Greeks. It was found out that those slain had worshiped false gods and Judas makes atonement for them so that they might be freed of sin. Scripture says that "in doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way." (2 Macc. 12: 38-46). This event in the Bible shows the efficaciousness of praying for the dead. It reaffirms our fundamental Catholic belief that in a mysterious way, our prayers can assist those who have died and are experiencing the purifying process of purgatory. In its section on the final purification, or purgatory, the Catechism (#s1030-1032) explains it this way: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." So to all those who ask "does the Catholic Church/do we still believe in Purgatory?"- hopefully the example of Judas Maccabee and 2,000 years of tradition of praying for the dead help you to see the answer to your question is YES!

**Pentecost Sunday Next weekend is the great feast of Pentecost which is unofficially considered the birthday of the Church and conclusion of the Easter Season. Remember that the liturgical color for Pentecost is Red (Masses of the Holy Spirit) so you are encouraged to wear red to Mass next weekend to reinforce our desire for the Holy Spirit to renew His power and inspiration in our parish and in our individual lives. Also, we will have exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after the 4:30pm Mass (around 5:15pm) until 6pm at which time we will celebrate Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction to conclude the Easter Season. There will be birthday cake for all those who attend because that's what you do as a family when celebrating a birthday, right?? I look forward to celebrating our birthday next weekend together as a spiritual family!

**New Pastoral Council Members Congratulations and thank you to Jim McDonnell, Pete Piotrowski and Joe Rys who were chosen as new members of the Our Lady of Peace Pastoral Council. They begin a three-year term. Please pray for them and the rest of the council in their important work of leading our community in the vision and mission of Jesus Christ.



Baby Bottle Fundraiser:

The Our Lady of Peace Knights of Columbus have joined all the Erie and Crawford County councils to conduct a Baby Bottle fundraising drive to benefit the Women's Care Center of Erie in their goal of purchasing a mobile ultrasound van. This medically equipped vehicle will visit rural areas, as well as our five local universities to provide valuable lifesaving services.

In 2021, the KofC provided an ultrasound machine to the Care Center, and in less than a year 63 previously abortion bound women chose life for their unborn children, after viewing them on this state of the art machine. While this is

certainly an achievement, we are now focusing on helping to raise \$250,000 to purchase a mobile ultrasound van. If the KofC along with other entities are able to achieve this goal, the KofC Supreme council in Connecticut will pay the entire cost of the mobile ultrasound machine, (around \$45,000).



Baby bottles are available at the church office. If you are able, we ask that you fill them with spare change, cash or checks (made out to: Ultrasound Fund) and return them on Father's Day.


