Family Discussion of the Week: **Don't Look Back** Another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home." Jesus said to him, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:61-62) **Adults:** When have you faltered or looked back during your journey of faith?

Kids: What can you do to be a stronger follower of Jesus this week?

#### DISCIPLESHIP'S COSTS

In today's first reading, God tells the prophet Elijah to prepare Elisha to succeed him. Succeeding Elijah will be no easy task; he has spent his life facing threats from the kings he has confronted about their infidelity to the God of Israel. The psalm illustrates the emotional and spiritual distress that the prophets' steadfast faithfulness to God brought them. Paul's description of the Christian's freedom from the law as opposed to "the desire of the flesh" puts this struggle at the very heart of Christian identity. The reading from Luke's Gospel recounts Jesus' decision to journey toward Jerusalem, where he knows he will meet his earthly fate. Following Jesus—like succeeding Elijah as prophet—will now become more difficult. Unlike his calls to the first disciples, Jesus encounters those who are not ready or are not strong enough to journey with him.



# ARCHDIOCESE OF KISUMU

The Catholic Archdiocese of Kisumu is located in Nyanza Province, Kenya. The first Missionaries, Mill Hill Fathers, came to the area in 1903. It was then part of the Vicariate of the Upper Nile. In 1925, it became a separate territory under the name of Prefecture Apostolic Kavirondo. It was raised to Vicariate Apostolic of Kisumu in 1932. It was established a diocese in 1953. In 1990, it was raised to Archdiocese of Kisumu. Its main mission of propagation of faith among the local living around Lake Victoria.

The Archdiocese covers an area of 4,616 km<sup>2</sup> with a population of about 3,443,161 of which 1,936,400 (56.2%) are Catholics. The main economic activity of the region is subsistence farming.

The Archdiocese has 63 parishes served by 111 priests (76 diocesans and 35 religious).

Currently, the archdiocese has 48 seminarians in various major seminaries in Kenya undergoing formation to priesthood. Your generous contribution will go towards formation of these future priests for the Archdiocese as well as for the universal church.

To the OLP Community,

My time at Our Lady of Peace has passed all too quickly. It seems like it was yesterday that Fr. Rich was greeting me at the front door as a new seminarian and introducing me to the staff and parishioners and explaining how things work in the parish. Now, a few short years later, as I prepare to leave for a new assignment, I would like to express my gratitude.

First, thank you to the parishioners for your enthusiastic welcome, your loving support, and for making OLP a second home. It has been an honor to serve you. Second, I want to thank the staff for their efforts that often go unnoticed, for their advice, humor, and dedication which has made my time at OLP a joy. Thank you for allowing me to learn from you.

Finally, I want to thank Deacon Joe, Deacon John, Fr. Mark, and our pastor Fr. Rich for their guidance, mentoring, and support that has helped me embrace the challenges of priestly life and service. Your fraternity and presence have enriched my life. My final thought comes from 2 Corinthians 13:11, "Rejoice, mend your ways, be comforted, be like-minded, live in peace; and the God of love and peace with be with you".



Dear family and friends of Our Lady of Peace,

Just a brief note to say farewell to all of you. I arrived in June of 2019 in order to assist the parish with the need of a parochial vicar and to allow me to attend to my parents in their time of need due to health issues. Now, with an extraordinary need for priests the bishop has asked me to take on a new assignment as the pastor of Our Lady of the Lake Parish in Edinboro, as well as chaplain to the Catholic students at Penn West — Edinboro Campus.

More than several people have asked me how I feel about moving on. My response is consistent: "excited and nervous." I am excited because I have a lot of experience to bring to a parish. But also nervous because I will be a bit farther from my parents who at this time appreciate my ability to respond rather quickly to any problems or issues which may arise. I have had to tell myself, "it's only 20 minutes further... it's going to be ok."

I have really enjoyed my ministry here at OLP. Praying with you has been my privilege.

I also enjoyed the other aspects of my ministry such as facilitating the renewal of the ministry of Altar Servers, the re-formulating our Ministry to the Sick for those who are home-bound, in local hospitals, or living in convalescent homes. I am also grateful for the opportunity for me to work with the principal of our school to enhance the quality of our school liturgies and be present to the students over the years.

As I said in my homily this week, "If I have served you well, it is because of your kindness and God's holy will. Know that I really loved this assignment. But, if I have slighted anyone in any way, please accept my sincere apologies. If you want to honor me, please let me go into the history of the parish, and embrace my successor, because he has a lot of good work to do."

Some have asked me, will you be back to visit? My personal policy is to return to previous assignments only when invited by the pastor. Why? Because I need to show respect to the clergy who are currently serving the parish. Father David Whiteford will be a capable assistant to the pastor and a brother to our deacons and the pastoral staff. I know he will serve you in faith and charity. As St. John the Baptist said about Jesus, "He must increase, and I must decrease." I have every trust that Father Whiteford will do a great job. New priests bring a fresh perspective. Please support him.

This has been a wonderful experience! I want to thank our pastor, deacons, and entire staff for their "go-get-'em" attitude and support. The families of Our Lady of Peace are exceptional people, and your support has made these three years among the happiest years in my ministry.

As you may recall, I am the  $8^{th}$  of the 10 of us native sons of OLP to become priests. But in some ways, I am the luckiest of the ten of us.... I was given the opportunity to come home and to serve the parish of our youth. I leave a blessed man. Our Lady of Peace... I will miss you.
