

Today's readings continue the theme of humility explored last Sunday. All three readings today encourage us to admit that we have limits, and God has none. The poignant poetry of Wisdom resonates with all of us who have ever struggled for peace in situations we cannot control: "For the corruptible body burdens the soul and the earthen shelter weighs down the mind that has many concerns." Saint Paul recognizes his own limitations, both physically (he is in prison) and spiritually: he cannot compel his friend to obey his wishes; he can only propose his request and respect Philemon's free will. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that God alone can complete the good we wish to do in the world. While we thank God for the gifts we receive—and the families we love—we acknowledge that they are temporary, and humbly cling to God.

These events provide a chance to get together with other parishioners and families to build our relationships and connections which in turn strengthens our community.

This scripture quote is taken from the 2nd Reading on August 21st. Last month I was on a pseudo-vacation with my family and it's always interesting when the family is together to see the different approaches to discipline. Our spiritual fathers in the church (specifically our bishops) have different approaches to discipline in the church as well. Currently, we are seeing a significant debate among our bishops in the United States (and Pope Francis) when it comes to discipline regarding Holy Communion. So it's important to understand the issue and know where our shepherds are coming from in these issues even if we do not agree with them.

One side of the debate is Pope Francis who has warned against politicizing Holy Communion, saying that this is a pastoral issue, not a political one. He has said that a priest "must be a shepherd with God's style. And God's style is closeness, compassion and tenderness." On the other side is Archbishop Cordileone of San Francisco who after trying to meet with Nancy Pelosi several times and not getting any response, publicly stated that due to her public support for abortion, she may not receive Holy Communion in the Diocese of San Francisco until she reconciles with the church and publicly changes her stance (since abortion is an objective evil, as Pope Francis stated in the same interview that abortion is murder). The Archbishop took this action not to punish Nancy Pelosi; but to challenge her not to assume she is in communion with the church when she takes such action.

What is the universal church's understanding of the Eucharist and guidelines for Holy Communion? The Eucharist is not just the source of grace, strength and unity in the church but also the most substantial expression of that unity of creed, moral code, hierarchy and liturgy. The church has always held that if you are making grave choices in your life that are in direct contrast with that creed, moral code, creed, moral code, hierarchy and liturgy. The church has always

held that if you are making grave choices in your life that are in direct contrast with that creed, moral code, hierarchy and liturgy, and you are unrepentant, then you are breaking communion with the church and the Mystical Body of Christ. If that is the case, it is a contradiction to receive Holy Communion and so not receiving Holy Communion is not a punishment but rather a consequence of your choice to break communion with the church (to the best of the church's ability to know such things).

These different perspectives above emphasize different sides of that understanding the Eucharist I mentioned above. Pope Francis seems to be emphasizing the Eucharist as the source of the unity and Archbishop Cordileone seems to be emphasizing the Eucharist as the expression of the unity. Last year some US Bishops were pushing to have a national consensus on how to handle this issue. After much back and forth and strong perspectives even from Pope Francis, the US Bishops backed away from establishing a national policy. It was left to the local ordinary (bishop) to handle each situation with their own pastoral prudence. That has led to the spectrum of Cardinal Gregory in Washington DC stating that he has addressed the issue with President Biden and it's between them privately, and Archbishop Cordileone publicly stating his policy with Congresswoman Pelosi.

I believe this is something we must talk about even though it's uncomfortable. The Amazing Parish Model for leadership that we are incorporating continually emphasizes the need not to avoid healthy conflict. Healthy conflict leads to growth. They challenge us to have uncomfortable conversations. So pray with me, be open with me and let's continue to dialogue even if it is a little uncomfortable about this important question of discipline in our church and Holy Communion. I hope to have a Church in Dialogue session at our parish in the next few months to help us do just that.
