



Family Discussion of the Week: The Rich and the Poor

There was a rich man and at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table. (Luke 16:19-21)

Adults: What are the "rewards" of caring for the needs of the poor?

Kids: What is one thing you and your family could do this week to help those who are poor or sick?

CARE FOR EACH OTHER

Don't delude yourselves, Jesus says through the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. We really are supposed to care for others. It is not enough to go to Mass and occasionally serve at a parish or outreach function. We cannot remain complacent and consider ourselves followers of Jesus. No matter how much or how little material wealth we have, we always have something to give—our time and attention, care, and, when possible, our money. The way we treat and care for others, especially the poor and vulnerable, is the manner in which we show our love of God. As disciples, we must "pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness." Jesus calls us to see and respond to the least among us, because, as God's children, we are all part of one another.

From the Pastor's Desk...

In two weeks, our parish will conduct a survey to measure the effectiveness of our programs and to assess the greatest needs of our parish community. This is an opportunity for all of those who come to this parish to make their needs and opinions known. The results will help us better serve all those who attend Mass here. The survey is being conducted through the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA), a Catholic research center. It will be distributed and collected in-pew during all Masses on the weekend of October 8/9. There will also be an online option; but we hope to get most responses at the Masses that weekend. Our parish will receive a report summarizing our results within 12 weeks of the survey, and the findings will be used as we plan for the next five years. ****Anointing of the Sick Mass will be Sunday, October 2nd at 11am Mass.** Remember that this sacrament is not for everyone but for those who fit in one of the following categories:

- those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)
- a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness
- elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill
- sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament
- sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if ...they would have requested it if they had been in possession of their faculties

If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated as well. If this applies to you or someone you know, please join us at this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in and find your seats.

We ended up selling over 3,100 tickets which was short of our goal of 3,700 but still allowed us to raise over \$40,000 for our parish mission. It was truly an inspiring evening which should give us all great hope and awareness that the Holy Spirit is alive at OLP!




