Family Discussion of the Week: Actions Worthy of Praise

Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matthew 11:11)

Adults: How do you prepare yourself to meet Christ in those around you? **Kids:** What good thing have you done so far during Advent to be like Jesus?

THE ONE FOR WHOM OUR HEARTS LONG

Put yourself in the scene of today's Gospel passage. John the Baptist is in prison. He has heard stories of what Jesus is doing, and wants reassurance that Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah. John's disciples and those who surrounded Jesus were faithful Jews who would have known Isaiah's prophecies by heart. God would send One who would bring sight to the blind, healing to those who were ill, salvation to all who longed to know God's mercy and peace. Jesus' response to the disciples' question rings as powerfully in our ears today as it surely did for the people who were with him that day. His actions are precisely those that the people had been told to expect. Jesus is the One for whom the people have been patiently yet anxiously waiting, like the farmer who waits for the fruits of his labor. Jesus is the One for whom our hearts long.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Guadete Sunday to you! Gaudete Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. The Introit (opening antiphon) for Gaudete Sunday, in both the Traditional Latin Mass and the Novus Ordo, is taken from Philippians 4:5: "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). As we light the third candle of the Advent wreath, which is traditionally rose-colored, we allow the joy of Christmas that we anticipate soon to buoy us during our final days of hopeful anticipation and preparation.

On another note, part of this build up in anticipation during this week in the liturgy of the church, are the great "O Antiphons" of Advent (see the bulletin for the full antiphons). They are introduced at Evening Prayer on December 17th, and they are seven jewels of liturgical song, one for each day until Christmas Eve (which I see as a kind of Holy Week for Christmas and are traditionally called the days of "Late" Advent). They seem to sum up all our Advent longing for the Savior. The "O Antiphons" are intoned with special solemnity in monasteries at Vespers, before and after the Magnificat, Mary's prayer of praise and thanksgiving from the Gospel of Luke (2:42-55), which is sung or said every evening as the climax of this Hour of the Divine Office.

A vestige of the "Great O's" can be seen in verses of the familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel". Each antiphon is a name of Christ, one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. The "O Antiphons" (Latin in parenthesis) appear below in English translation, with scriptural sources and suggested symbols. The first letters of the titles in Latin taken backwards form an acrostic of "Ero Cras" which translates to "I will be tomorrow," mirroring the theme of the antiphons.

ADVENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PRAYER, GIVING and COMMUNITY AT OLP

I thank our staff and volunteers who are helping organize these opportunities! These are great ways to enter more fully into the true meaning of Advent and help us to prepare our hearts for Christmas so please make an effort to take part in some or all of these events.

Our Parish Advent Service Project is two-fold: (1) We are collecting household items for the 130 families served by the Millcreek Food Pantry. Items needed include: laundry detergent, cleaning products, deodorant, soap/bodywash, dish detergent, toothbrush/paste, and shampoo. (2) We are collecting gift cards for 150 children in the St. Martin Center Shining Stars program. I can promise you that any priest you go to in Erie County will be greatly pleased that you are there and will not condemn or judge you.

**Advent Penance Service/Confessions In addition to the "Light is on for You", OLP will have a Penance Service on Sunday, December 18th at 6:00pm. We also have individual confessions available after every Sunday Mass in Advent; as well as our practice of individual confessions on Wednesdays from 11:15am-12 Noon and Saturdays after the 8am Mass and from 3:45-4:45pm. And, as always, Fr. Dave and I are

be happy to set up an appointment with you for Confession if these other opportunities do not fit your schedule. I cannot encourage you enough to take advantage of this great Sacrament this Advent.

**Nativity Scene at Our Lady of Peace Parish: We are blessed to have a beautiful nativity set at Our Lady of Peace which was purchased in 2012 through the generous donations of many parishioners under the leadership of Fr. Jason Feigh while he was Parochial Vicar (2011-2013). I am very grateful to all those who were part of that effort! I know our manger scene is a significant part of our Christmas decorations every year, and that it certainly helps us meditate on the Christmas truth of the Son of God becoming flesh as a baby in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago.

Shortly after my arrival at OLP, I established a Renovation Committee that was looking at the possibility of building a gathering space for the church. As part of that process, the group studied "Built of Living Stone," the guidelines for liturgical space created by the U.S. Catholic Bishops (USCCB). This process led the Liturgy Committee to prayerfully discern our parish approach with our nativity set. The study indicates the bishops desire to not have any "decorations" in the sanctuary that may take away from the focus of Christ's presence in His Word and Sacrament in the Mass.

In this time of Eucharistic Revival in the church, we are called to go deeper in our understanding of, appreciation for, and experience of the Eucharist and Christ's presence in the Mass. The Liturgy Committee and I would like to move the nativity scene out of the sanctuary this Christmas season and into the area of the Sacred Heart Shrine in the back of church. This move will also allow the entire nativity scene to be seen together, all in one place. On behalf of our Liturgy Committee, we appreciate your openness to this decision. After the Christmas season the Liturgy Committee will evaluate this move and welcome your input!

Below I list some of the documentation that the committee discussed as part of this discernment.

Built of Living Stones - § 124 § "Plans for seasonal decorations should include other areas besides the sanctuary. Decorations are intended to draw people to the true nature of the mystery being celebrated rather than being ends in themselves.

Natural flowers, plants, wreaths and fabric hangings, and other seasonal objects can be arranged to enhance the primary liturgical points of focus. The altar should remain clear and free-standing, not walled in by massive floral displays or the Christmas crib, and pathways in the narthex, nave, and sanctuary should remain clear."

<u>Book of Blessings</u>- Blessing of a Christmas Manger or Nativity Scene:

1541 In its present form the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to Saint Francis of Assisi who made the Christmas creche or manger for Christmas eve of 1223. However, as early as the fourth century

representations of the nativity of the Lord were painted as wall decorations depicting not only the infancy narrative accounts of Christ's birth, but also the words of the prophets Isaiah and Habakkuk taken to mean that the Messiah would be born in the midst of animals in a manger."

1544 "If the manger is set up in the church, it must not be placed in the presbyterium (sanctuary). A place should be chosen that is suitable for prayer and devotion and is easily accessible by the faithful."

The "O Antiphons"

December 17: (O Sapientia) O WISDOM, who came from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from end to end and ordering all things mightily and sweetly: Come, and teach us the way of prudence.

Sirach 24:2; Wisdom 8:1. Symbols: oil lamp, open book.

December 18: (O Adonai) O LORD AND RULER of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the flame of the burning bush and gave him the law on Sinai: Come, and redeem us with outstretched arm.

Exodus 3:2, 20:1. Symbols: burning bush, stone tablets.

December 19: (O Radix Jesse) O ROOT OF JESSE, who stands for an ensign of the people, before whom kings shall keep silence and unto whom the Gentiles shall make supplication: Come to deliver us, and tarry not. Isaiah 11:1-3. Symbol: vine or plant with flower (especially a rose).

December 20: (O Clavis David) O KEY OF DAVID, and Scepter of the House of Israel, who opens and no man shuts, who shuts and no man opens: Come, and bring forth the captive from his prison, he who sits in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Isaiah 22:22. Symbols: key; broken chains.

December 21: (O Oriens) O DAWN OF THE EAST, brightness of the light eternal, and Sun of Justice: Come, and enlighten them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Psalm 19:6-7. Symbol: rising sun.

December 22: (O Rex Gentium) O KING OF THE GENTILES and their desired One, the Cornerstone that makes both one: Come, and deliver man, whom You formed out of the dust of the earth.

Psalm 2:7-8, Ephesians 2:14-20. Symbols, Crown, scepter.

December 23: (O Emmanuel) O EMMANUEL, God with us, our King and Lawgiver, the expected of the nations and their Savior: Come to save us, O Lord our God.

Isaiah 7:14; 33:22. Symbols: tablets of stone, Chalice and Host.





OUR FASCINATING FAITH Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12)

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, first appeared to Cuauhtlatzin (Juan Diego) on December 9, 1531 while he was on his way to a Eucharistic celebration in Tlatelolco, Mexico. The Virgin addressed him by his indigenous name, asking him to go to the palace of Archbishop Zumárraga to request that a shrine be erected there at the site of the apparition, in Tepeyac, so as to share her love and compassion for all believers. Juan Diego did so, but the archbishop did not believe him, demanding proof of his story and of the Lady's identity. He returned to Our Lady daily, and on December 12, he conveyed to her the archbishop's request for proof. She showed him Castilian roses blooming there through the stony ground despite the winter's cold. He picked the flowers and carried them in his tilma (mantle) to the archbishop. When he unfolded his tilma to present the roses, Mary's image was imprinted on the mantle! Her blue sash and the flower over her womb were traditional Aztec symbols of pregnancy and new life. But her features were those of a mestiza, indicating mixed Aztec-European heritage. Thus Our Lady of Guadalupe remains the enduring icon of unity-in-diversity, the fruit of our one baptism into Jesus, her Son. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.
