

Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, / and shall sing to you, / shall sing to your name, O Most High!

First Reading - The glory of the Lord shows through Israel, a light to all nations, that salvation may reach to the ends of the earth (Isaiah 49:3, 5-6).

Psalm - I am here to do as you ask, O Lord (Psalm 40).

Second Reading - All those who call upon the name of the Lord are called to be holy (1 Corinthians 1:1-3).

Gospel - John the Baptist testifies: The one who comes after me, on whom the Spirit comes down and remains, is the Son of God (John 1:29-34).

Family Discussion of the Week: Jesus, the Son of God

(John said,) "I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might me revealed to Israel." (John 1:31)

Adults: We witness to Christ as John did, by living lives full of generosity, forgiveness, and mercy toward others. When do you find it most difficult to do this?

Kids: Who has surprised you by doing something kind for you when you did not expect it?

OUR STRATEGIC GOAL

As a Church, we now move into Ordinary Time. "Ordinary" comes from the Latin root for "order," which is why we line the Sundays up on the calendar and count them—with "ordinal" numbers—one by one. The orderly way we proceed through the liturgical year reminds us that our faith offers a strategic goal for our lives: eternal happiness with God, who is love. Today's readings share stories of believers who order their daily activities toward the goal of sharing God's love. Isaiah embraces his role as God's servant and works to bring glory not only to Israel, but to the entire world. In a similar way, Saint Paul identifies himself as Christ's witness in the world and reminds the Corinthians of their life goal: "to be holy." The Gospel shows us John the Baptist, servant and witness, attentive to God's loving orders, the divine plan for salvation.

A blessed Ordinary Time to you! As we enter this time between the Christmas Season and Lent, I encourage you to consider a retreat as a way to be renewed in relationship with God. I will be on the team for the Divine Mercy Encounter (DME) Retreat February 3-5, 2023 and I would love to have you join me. So, what is DME? From the DME website.... "DME (Divine Mercy Encounter) is a three-day retreat program. Each day has a different focus: Friday is the Day of Invitation, focusing on how God is inviting us into relationship. Saturday is the Day of Encounter, where we encounter God through the sacraments, Adoration, and others. Sunday is the Day of Commission, where we as a community are empowered to evangelize and share our faith. The weekend includes talks, exposure to different types of prayer, Mass, community, and much more. The weekend runs from 10am on Friday to 5pm on Sunday, and retreat participants stay onsite for the weekend." For more info or to sign up for a retreat weekend, visit: www.divinemercyencounter.com. The other upcoming DME retreats in 2023 are March 31- April 2 (Erie- St. Joseph Bread of Life Community); July 7-9 (Erie-SJBOL) and August 11-13 in St. Marys, PA (November Retreat dates haven't been set vet).

There are also some upcoming Cursillo Retreats this year. From the Erie Cursillo website... "Cursillo (kur-SEE-yo) literally means "little course" and is an intense three-day spiritual retreat, the purpose of which is a deep personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Those who experience the Cursillo Movement know it is more than just three days of religious instruction. It is an effort to change the spiritual environment, to bring Jesus Christ into the world." **Holy Hour for Life This Thursday, January 19th we will have our annual Holy Hour for Life at 9:30pm. The Holy Hour kicks off our pilgrimage to Washington DC for the March for Life. All are encouraged and invited to attend even if you are not going to DC. We must keep praying for an end to abortion in in our country and world even after the Roe vs. Wade Supreme Court Decision was overturned. We also pray for healing and conversion for all who experienced abortions or promote them.

**The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18-25 every year. It dates back to the 19th century when Pope Leo XIII encouraged the practice of a Prayer Octave for Unity. The Vatican and the World Council of Churches came together in 1966 to jointly prepare prayer materials for what has become an annual event. During the week, Catholic, Orthodox, Lutheran, Baptist, Pentecostal and other Protestant denominations are invited to pray in a particular way for unity among Christians. Please keep this intention for greater unity among Christians in your prayers this week and considering coming to the Masses for Christian Unity at OLP on January 18th.

**Eucharistic Revival Parish Mission Our Lady of Peace Parish will host a Eucharistic Revival Mission on January 22nd, 23rd and 24th featuring Anthony Digmann who is part of the Catholic Speaker Organization. He is a husband and father of a young family, author, speaker and educator who has served professionally in Catholic schools, parish ministry, and on councils of his home Archdiocese of Dubuque since 2006. He has appeared on national and international Catholic media outlets such as EWTN, Catholic Digest, and Radio Maria. Anthony is the author of three books including: Using the Force: Star Wars and Catholicism; Made for Holiness: A Catholic Introduction to Demons and Exorcism; and Sign of Contradiction: Contraception, Family Planning, & Catholicism. The mission will be called "Eucharistic Revival" which includes Eucharistic miracles, Saints' devotions, Theology, history, personal testimony, and apologetics to help Catholics re-encounter our Lord, Jesus Christ, in the Eucharist both spiritually and intellectually.

**Pilgrimage in Thanksgiving for Life We are planning to take one last trip to Washington, DC for the March for Life that has occurred annually since 1973 in protest of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court Decision that legalized abortion in the United States. On June 24, 2022, that decision was finally overturned and was a true answer to the Church's prayers. This was a providential highlight of the 2022 year! This trip now becomes for me, a prayer of thanksgiving rather than a protest. I have gone to the March for Life at least 15 times over my priesthood and I feel deeply compelled to make this last pilgrimage of thanksgiving before turning our attention to Harrisburg and petitioning our state government to make abortion illegal (which we will do in September 2023).

I invite you to join me on this pilgrimage of thanksgiving. We will start with a Holy Hour for Life on Thursday, January 19th at 9:30pm in the church. Then we leave for DC at 10:45pm and drive through the night. We will attend a Mass at the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception at 7:30am and then eventually make our way to the political rally at Noon at the National Mall. Speakers at the rally include Jonathan Roumie (who plays Jesus in the Chosen and is Catholic) and Tony Dungy (a hall of fame former NFL football coach and strong Christian). We will then march to the Supreme Court to thank God and the court for their decision and then head back to Erie arriving around I Ipm/Midnight that night. I encourage families, individuals and youth to join me in this pilgrimage of thanksgiving. See page 7 for more information.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH Calendars

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after Epiphany (today), but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year. So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U.S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact.


