Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - Be my protector, O God, / a mighty stronghold to save me. / For you are my rock, my stronghold! / Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

First Reading - God allows us to make choices, but we are not to choose injustice or sinfulness (Sirach 15:15-20).

Psalm - Happy are those who observe God's commands (Psalm 119).

Second Reading - God's wisdom is mysterious and hidden (1 Corinthians 2:6-10). **Gospel** - Jesus has come not to abolish but to fulfill the law and the prophets (Matthew 5:17-37).

Family Discussion of the Week: Implications of the New Law

Jesus said, "So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift." (Matthew 5:23-24) Adults: How do you reconcile with those who have offended or hurt you? *Kids:* When have you taken the first step to make up with someone who has hurt you or whom you have offended?

God and Lord

Only God is Lord. The Creator alone can touch us gently at the deepest core of our being. God does not invade us from outside to break down our resistances and rob us of our freedom, as a human tyrant does. The Spirit is already within, at the very heart of our being. Yielding ourselves to God is opening ourselves to that life-force that creates us and carries us on to ever fuller life. By yielding ourselves to God we do not lose ourselves or find our dignity compromised. We discover ourselves in a new and exciting way.

More than any external work that Jesus did, his power to touch and transform the human heart marks him as divine. His is not the destructive dominance that is seen too often in human beings, but the creative dominance that is God's alone. The Christian discovers that Jesus is Lord, and therefore knows him as God.

The new law of the kingdom, as we hear it proclaimed in today's Gospel, places exacting demands on the Christian. It is not merely our religious practice or external behavior that comes under its scrutiny but our inner motives and desires. From the Pastor's Desk...

It's Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023 Promotion Sunday! Due to your generosity during last year's CSA we were able to replace the chapel roof, replace the HVAC system in the rectory, and to contract for the replacement of the hardware for the entrance doors as well as provide more security cameras in church. I say contract, because unfortunately due to challenges in labor and supply chain, we have yet to be able to install the new equipment for the doors and cameras. I assure you that as soon as the supplies arrive the project will be completed. Thank you for your generosity!

The theme of this year's Catholic Services Appeal is "Fueling the Mission Together." As an individual parish, we are called upon to join with our Catholic community throughout northwest Pennsylvania to build up the mission of the church. Only through our support can the Diocese of Erie continue its mission to evangelize, educate, serve, proclaim the Word, celebrate the sacraments, and give hope to thousands. Many of these needs are beyond the scope and resources of any one parish. We are all in this together.

Our assessment from the Diocese this year is \$137,000; and I remind you that every dollar raised over that amount stays in our parish to fund different projects. This year the project identified by our parish Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council is the replacement of the plexiglass covering the outside stain glass windows of the church. The plexiglass will be replaced with tempered glass which will give the church a cleaner look that enhances the beauty of our beautiful windows, protects them for many years to come, and prevents any yellowing as happens with plexiglass.

In order to fund this project our overall parish financial goal for CSA 2023 is \$212,000. Below is a summary of the numbers for 2023:

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Bystanders can **help** - Bystanders can play a big role in stopping bullying. When people do nothing, it sends a message that it's no big deal to bully. If people say something, it sends a social message that bullying is not OK. If you see someone being bullied, you can help by doing these things: Speak up to help: If it feels safe and natural to speak up, say, "Come on, let's get out of here" to the person being bullied. It is okay to let the bully know people are watching and will get involved. Report It: Let a trusted adult know what you witnessed. This isn't tattling, it is standing up for what's right. Offer support: Check in with the person who was being bullied. Ask how they are doing. Remind them that the bullying is not their fault. 


