#### **DISCIPLES TOGETHER**

Today's readings reflect on our communal identity as disciples. Before we begin Lent together in a few days, we take time to appreciate what God has done by giving us our family of faith. In Leviticus, God tells Moses to "speak to the whole Israelite community" and give them instructions for living in love. Moses passes along the message-to each and every believer-that God's people must strive together for holiness. Saint Paul echoes this message, insisting that we are indeed God's holy children. As temples of the Spirit, we belong to Christ and to one another. This mutual belonging is a blessing and a challenge. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus sets a high bar for Christian community: his followers must love not only those who are easy to love, but also the people who upset us. Together, let us ask God to give us this kind of love.

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

Today is Commitment Sunday for Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023. See below for the details of how you can be involved. This week is also the start of the Lenten Season, so I am including here the NOTICE – LENTEN PRACTICES 2023 from the Diocese of Erie.

"The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2023. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish.

I. Traditional Lenten practices of PRAYER, FASTING, and ALSMGIVING, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.

2. ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT, and GOOD FRIDAY are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

3. In 2023, St. Patrick's Day (March 17 – Principal Patronal Feast Day of the Diocese of Erie) falls on a Friday in Lent. In recognition of the importance of this day for the faithful, Bishop Persico has dispensed all Latin Catholics from the requirement of abstinence from eating meat on March 17, 2023, within the territory of the Diocese of Erie.

4. ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY are also days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

5. On HOLY THURSDAY, no celebration of the Mass is to begin anywhere in the diocese earlier than 4:30pm without the explicit approval of Bishop Persico.

6. Although it does not include the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by its very nature the GOOD FRIDAY service is celebrated by a priest only.

7. All celebrations of the EASTER VIGIL are to begin after nightfall (which is defined as approximately one hour after local sunset.) Nightfall is about 9:00pm this year. To balance pastoral need and liturgical prescriptions, Bishop Persico has decreed that the Easter Vigil in the Diocese of Erie is to begin at 8:30pm or any later time. Any start time earlier than 8:30pm must receive explicit approval from the Bishop.

#### Other notes from the pastor...

**\*\*FEBRUARY 12, 2023, was World Marriage Day** as it is celebrated every year on the second Sunday in February, sometimes coinciding with St. Valentine's Day. World Marriage Day officially began in 1983 in the United States of America. Popularized by the Catholic Church, the purpose of World Marriage Day is to emphasize the beauty of marriage and to honor husbands and wives for their faithfulness and sacrifices.

World Marriage Day highlights the promise of a marital union and the beauty of being a lawfully wedded couple under the eyes of Christ. It was brought into order by the Worldwide Marriage Encounter, an initiative that aims to improve the married life of struggling couples. World Marriage Day propagates the ethos of marriage and honors the sacrifices and faithfulness of husbands and wives. Catholic couples celebrate the day by attending the Sunday mass and recommitting themselves to the values of the institution of marriage.

**\*\*Holy Hour for Those in Public Office** There will be a holy hour of Eucharistic Adoration on Monday, February 20<sup>th</sup> (Presidents Day) at 7pm.

\*\*Burning of Palms Fr. Dave and I will burn the palms for this year's ashes on Tuesday, February 21st at 1:30pm with the OLP School Community in the parking lot. All are welcome to join us as we prepare for Ash Wednesday. \*\*Stations of the Cross will be held on every Friday of Lent (Feb 24, March 3, 10, 24 and 31) at 7pm except March 17 (see the Lenten Practices from the Bishop) when they will be on Monday, March 13th at 7pm instead. Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm every night of the Stations. \*\*Masses this Week Monday, February 20th- Mass for Those in Public Office; *Tuesday, Feb.* 21<sup>st</sup> – St. Peter Damian; Wednesday, February 22<sup>nd</sup>- Ash Wednesday; Friday, Feb. 17th- The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order; Saturday, Feb 11<sup>th</sup>- The Blessed Virgin Mary, Pillar of Faith. \*\*Open Enrollment for Our Lady of Peace School It is not too late to consider Our Lady of Peace School as an option for your children or to encourage your family or friends to consider our school for their children next year (or even now!). There are great things happening at our school and I/we need your help to get the word out! I also want to make it clear that there are financial aids available to families for whom the cost of tuition is prohibitive. Please do not presume you cannot afford it. Come see me or our principal, Shivani Suri, or our Director of Enrollment, Lori Hess, to see what options may be available to you before you decide you cannot send your child/children there. I ask all parents in our parish with school aged children to seriously discern Our Lady of Peace School for your children.

**\*\*OLP Serves** We hope to have our OLP Serves Day on Saturday, August 19th. We want to help fellow parishioners with things at their homes that they cannot do themselves. Contact us if you could use help or are willing to volunteer to help someone else.

**\*\*Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023** Due to your generosity during last year's CSA we were able to replace the chapel roof, replace the HVAC system in the rectory, and to contract for the replacement of the hardware for the entrance doors as well as provide more security cameras in the church. I say contract, because unfortunately due to challenges in labor and supply chain, we have yet to be able to install the new equipment for the doors and cameras. I assure you that as soon as the supplies arrive the project will be completed. Thank you for your generosity!

The theme of this year's Catholic Services Appeal is "Fueling the Mission Together." As an individual parish, we are called upon to join with our Catholic community

throughout northwest Pennsylvania to build up the mission of the church. Only through our support can the Diocese of Erie continue its mission to evangelize, educate, serve, proclaim the

Word, celebrate the sacraments, and give hope to thousands. Many of these needs are beyond the scope and resources of any one parish. We are all in this together.

Our assessment from the Diocese this year is \$137,000; and I remind you that every dollar raised over that amount stays in our parish to fund different projects. This year the project identified by our parish Properties Committee in conjunction with our Finance Council is the replacement of the plexiglass covering the outside stain glass windows of the church. The plexiglass will be replaced with tempered glass which will give the church a cleaner look that enhances the beauty of our beautiful windows, protects them for many years to come, and prevents any yellowing as happens with plexiglass.

In order to fund this project our overall parish financial goal for *CSA 2023 is \$212,000*. Below is a summary of the numbers for 2023:
