### **Sunday's Readings:**

**Entrance Antiphon** - Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. / It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; / hide not your face from me.

First Reading - The LORD said to Abram: All the families of the earth shall find blessing in you (Genesis 12:1-4a)

**Psalm** - We rely on you, O God; show us mercy (Psalm 33).

**Second Reading** - God has called us to a holy life, not because of our works but according to grace (2 Timothy 1:8b-10).

**Gospel** - Atop a high mountain, Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James, and John. (Matthew 17:1-9).

### Family Discussion of the Week: Call to Faithfulness

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. (Matthew 17:1-2)

Adults: What difference does your faith in Jesus Christ make in your life?

Kids: What does it mean to you to be a holy person?

#### **TURNING POINTS**

Our readings today describe turning points for those whom God has chosen. In Genesis, God calls Abram to leave his homeland, with the promise of forming a people in a new land. In the Gospel, the disciples see Jesus literally in a new light, the bright light of Jesus' transfiguration. They begin to see Jesus, and themselves, in a new way. These are times when God presents a new way forward, providing new purpose and energy. Our lives too have their own turning points, where God is working (usually in less spectacular fashion) to lead us into fuller maturity, and into deeper unity with God and others. The road ahead, as with Abram, Jesus, and the disciples, may be long and difficult. Lent can be a time when we reflect upon these turning points in our past, and consider how God may be stirring something new in us today.

### From the Pastor's Desk...

There are many great resources to help you go deeper in your spiritual life and relationship with God during Lent. Among those many I mention a few here:

Holy Moments (through Dynamic Catholic and Matthew Kelly)- OLP is sending out daily emails (through Flocknote) during Lent utilizing these videos. OLP Parishioner Guy Fustine's niece, Victoria Taylor, is one of the main presenters on this series and it challenges us to consider real ways to put our faith into action. If you are not receiving them and would like to, please contact Mary Beth Whitman at <a href="mailto:marybeth.whitman@olp.org">marybeth.whitman@olp.org</a> or \$14-833-7701 x202 or pick up a Flocknote card at church.

The Word Among Us- There may be a few copies of the "Word Among Us" at the doors of the church which is a daily meditational provided by the parish for Advent and Lent. I highly recommend having some daily meditation resource to support your prayer life. There are other daily resources that you can subscribe to such as Give Us This Day or Magnificat, which I personally use.

The Hallow App- Also this Lent, after having the Hallow App recommended to me many times, I finally subscribed (they are offering 30 free days right now) and I am doing the "Pray40" Challenge which includes daily meditations with Mark Wahlberg, Jonathan Roumie (plays Jesus on "the Chosen"), Jim Caveziel (played Jesus in "the Passion of the Christ" movie) and Fr. Michael Schmitz among others. This App, as do most, allows you to set daily routine reminders and has a great variety of prayer options from music meditations to lectio divina to regular Catholic Devotions.

Other Catholic Prayer Apps- Our parish continues to have a subscription to FORMED which has incredible content. Others have mentioned the Amen App, Laudate, Pray As You Go, Relevant Radio and Magnificat (also has an App).

One blessing of the social media movement and the increased use of Smart Phones are the ways it can support our prayer life and relationship with God. I strongly encourage you to take advantage of that this Lent and beyond!

\*\*Stations of the Cross is held on Fridays in Lent (March 10, 24 & 31) at 7pm except March 17 when they will be Monday, March 13<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm every night of the Stations.

\*\*Fast from the Closing Song at Mass during Lent Recall that during the Lenten Season we also enter a liturgical fast by omitting the Gloria and Alleluia during Mass (two of the most celebratory Mass parts that we sing). To extend that further, and as a way to encourage us to spend more time in silence in the Lenten Season, we will not be singing a hymn at the end of the Mass. There will be instrumental music at the end of Mass until Laetare Sunday, when we will have a song, and then end with silence for the last two weekends of Lent. I ask you to leave the church in silence and wait until you are in the vestibule or outside to have conversations. This allows those who want to stay in the church for silent prayer to do so. I know that many of you like to stay and socialize after Mass in the pews, so I am asking you to make a little sacrifice and to adjust your process to help us remember that in Lent things are supposed to be different.

\*\*Feast of St. Joseph/ St. Joseph Table The Feast of St. Joseph will be celebrated on Monday, March 20<sup>th</sup> this year (because March 19<sup>th</sup> is a Sunday). We will have music at the 12:10pm Mass and the 1:30pm School Mass (moved to Monday to celebrate the feast day). Our St. Joseph Table Dinner will take place at 6pm in the cafeteria on Monday, March 20th. No registration necessary, and no need to bring a dish, please bring a donation for the food pantry (either monetary or a nonperishable food item) since part of the tradition of the Table is to celebrate God's abundant grace in our lives and to be generous in sharing that grace with others.

\*\*Masses this Week Monday, March 6<sup>th</sup>, Friday, March 10<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, March 11<sup>th</sup>- Weekdays in Lent; Tuesday, March 7<sup>th</sup>- Sts. Perpetua and Felicity- Martyrs (3<sup>rd</sup> Century); Wednesday, March 8<sup>th</sup>- St. John of God, Religious (16<sup>th</sup> Century Spanish Convert); Thursday, March 9<sup>th</sup>- St. Frances of Rome, Religious (15th Century Noblewoman and Religious Order Founder).

\*\*Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. Confession will be available on Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including the 4:30pm. There will also be the "the Light is On For You" on Wednesday, March 29<sup>th</sup> from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).

\*\*Fr. Rich Assignment at OLP Last month marked the completion of my six-year assignment as pastor of Our Lady of Peace Parish (February 2017). Recall that Bishop Persico transferred many priests at that time in conjunction with the restructuring of multiple parishes throughout the Diocese of Erie as part of the Pastoral Planning Initiative begun in 2014. I received a letter from the Bishop last month stating that he was extending my assignment at OLP for 5 months (July 2023) in order to allow my assignment to be evaluated at the normal time for assignments, that is the summer after ordinations take place (this was done for all priests that were assigned in February 2017). So the next 5 months will allow time for the bishop to evaluate our situation and make a

decision in July whether to assign me for another 6 years at OLP. I hope and expect he will. Please keep this decision process in your prayers as well as the discernment happening for the entire diocese.

\*\*Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023 have had a great response to CSA 2023 so farwe have 310 pledges for \$165,417. That means we have already exceeded our Diocesan assessment of \$137,000 and the rest of our goal of \$212,000 will go toward replacing the yellowed and worn plexiglass over the outside of the stain glass windows of the church with new tempered glass. If you have not yet handed in your CSA pledge, please send, drop off or bring it to Mass in the next few weekends and include it in the offertory. Thank you for your support.
