#### Family Discussion of the Week: Source of Light

For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as Children of light - for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. (Ephesians 5:8-9) Adults: What are you doing in your life right now to move toward light rather than darkness? Kids: How can you let the light of your faith in Jesus shine for others to see?

#### SEEING THE LIGHT

Our Lenten journey continues this Sunday as we hear of Jesus healing a blind man in the Gospel of John. Jesus proclaims himself the light of the world, a light that overcomes darkness and enables a new capacity to see. The man, blind from birth, was able to begin his path to sight by first acknowledging his blindness. We are reminded of God's ongoing invitation to us to journey from blindness to sight. We begin by acknowledging our own capacity for "blind spots," and so open ourselves to uncomfortable truths and to God's healing. We are invited to see beyond appearances, as the reading from Samuel indicates, and to look into the heart of things. We are invited to "live as children of light" as the letter to the Ephesians teaches. Like the man bealed from blindness, we may gradually learn to see fully and to follow Jesus. Copyright @ J.S. #### From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Laetare Sunday (and feast of St. Joseph)! Laetare Sunday is the traditional name of the fourth Sunday of Lent and is Latin for "rejoice." So three and half weeks of Lent down and two and half weeks to go. We wear Rose this Sunday and add a little decoration and joy to celebrate that we have passed the halfway point of Lent. It is a good reminder that our Lenten efforts in prayer, fasting and almsgiving have the purpose of helping us grow in the Holy Spirit and its fruits of love, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, self-control and JOY. It is also a good time to recommit to our Lenten initiatives if we have gotten away from them and to remember to take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent if we have not already done so.

I mentioned the feast of St. Joseph above because March 19<sup>th</sup> is the feast but since it falls on a Sunday, we celebrate it on Monday, March 20th this year. We will have music at the 12:10pm Mass and the school Mass this week will be moved from Tuesday to Monday at 1:30pm. Our St. Joseph Table will begin at 6pm in the school cafeteria. No registration and no need to bring a dish to share; but you are asked to bring a donation for the food pantry (either monetary or a nonperishable food item) since part of the tradition of the Table is to celebrate God's abundant grace in our lives and to be generous in sharing that grace with others.

Lastly, the Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord is Saturday, March 25<sup>th</sup> and is a solemnity that not only celebrates Mary's fiat to God's will to be the mother of His Son, but also Jesus' conception in her womb after her consent. We then celebrate his birth nine months later on Christmas Day (December 25<sup>th</sup>). These are the two days a year that we genuflect during the words of the Creed... "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man." May we never take for granted the gift of the Incarnation in our lives!

May God bless our 4<sup>th</sup> week of Lent ahead! Fr. Rich

\*\*Deacon John Mang's Birthday and Reassignment to OLP Happy 60<sup>th</sup> birthday to Deacon John Mang whose

**birthday was March 11<sup>th</sup>!** Also, we are grateful that he was assigned to Our Lady of Peace for another 5 years by Bishop Persico a few weeks ago. Deacon John is a blessing to our parish as well as me in my ministry through his support, spiritual wisdom, and multi-faceted ministry in our parish. So I thank and congratulate Deacon John for all of us and encourage you to do so in person as well.

**\*\*OLP Prayer Wall** We are making our way through the different types of prayer represented by the acronym ACTS, A.C.T.S. A is for Adoration, C is for Contrition (the focus this month), T for thanksgiving which we did back in November, and S for Supplication which includes Intercession for others and Petition for self which we covered in September and January. We are focusing on Prayers of Contrition during Lent. All are encouraged to take a strip of cloth and make a genuine act of repentance as you tie it to the fence.

**\*\*Masses this Week** Monday, March 20<sup>th</sup>- Feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary; *Tuesday, March 21<sup>st</sup>*, *Wednesday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>*, and *Friday, March 24<sup>th</sup>*- Weekdays in Lent; *Thursday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>*- St. Turibius of Mogrovejo. Bishop (16<sup>th</sup> Century South American leader); *Saturday, March 25<sup>th</sup>*- The Annunciation of the Lord.

**\*\*Lenten Confessions** In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. There will also be the **"the Light is On for You" on Wednesday, March 29<sup>th</sup> from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).** 

\*\*Stations of the Cross will be held on Friday in Lent (March 24 and 31) at 7pm. Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm before Stations.

**\*\*Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023 UPDATE:** 362 pledges for \$184,124– that means we have already exceeded our Diocesan assessment of \$137,000 and are \$28,000 from our goal of \$212,000 which will go toward replacing the yellowed and worn plexiglass over the outside of the stain glass windows of the church with new tempered glass. If you have not yet handed in your CSA pledge, please send, drop off or bring it to Mass in the next few weekends and include it in the offertory. Thank you for your support. **\*\*Fast from the Closing Song at Mass during** 

Lent Recall that during the Lenten Season we also enter a liturgical fast by omitting the Gloria

and Alleluia during Mass (two of the most celebratory Mass parts that we sing). To extend that further; and as a way to encourage us to spend more time in silence in the Lenten Season, we will not sing a hymn at the end of the Mass. For the past few weeks we had instrumental music at the end of Mass, and this weekend (Laetare Sunday) we will have a song. Then no music at all at the end of Mass for the next two weekends. As part of that, I ask you to leave the church in silence and wait until you are in the vestibules or outside to have conversations. This also allows those who want to stay in the church for silent prayer to do so. I know that many of you like to stay and socialize after Mass in the pews, so I am asking you to make a little sacrifice and to adjust your process to help us remember that in Lent things are supposed to be different.

\*\*Social Media/Catholic Apps There are many great resources to help you go deeper in your spiritual life and relationship with God during Lent. Among those many I mention a few here:

- Holy Moments (through Dynamic Catholic and Matthew Kelly)- The parish is sending out daily emails during Lent utilizing these videos. OLP Parishioner Guy Fustine's niece, Victoria Taylor, is one of the main presenters on this series and it challenges us to consider real ways to put our faith into action.
- The Word Among Us- This is a daily meditation resource to support your prayer life- I subscribe to Magnificat and there are many others as well). The parish gives out copies of this for Advent and Lent each vear.
- The Hallow App- Also this Lent, after having the Hallow App recommended to me many times, I finally subscribed (they are offering 30 free days right now) and I am doing the "Pray40" Challenge which includes daily meditations with Mark Wahlberg, Jonathan Roumie (plays Jesus on "the Chosen"), Jim Caveziel (played Jesus in "the Passion of the Christ" movie) and Fr. Michael Schmitz among others. This App, as do most, allows you to set daily routine reminders and has a great variety of prayer options from music meditations to lectio divina to regular Catholic Devotions.
- Other Catholic Prayer Apps- Our parish continues to have a subscription to FORMED which has incredible content. Others have mentioned the Amen App, Laudate, Pray As You Go, Relevant Radio and Magnificat (also has an App).
