

Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - Give me justice, O God, / and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. / From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, / for you, O God, are my strength.

First Reading - Thus says the LORD GOD: I will open your graves, have you rise from them, and settle you on your land. (Ezekiel 37:12-14).

Psalm - The Lord is kind and saves us (Psalm 130).

Second Reading - If Christ is in you, the spirit is alive even if the body is dead because of sin (Romans 8:8-11).

Gospel - Lazarus, dead for four days, came out of his tomb when Jesus called his name. Many of those who had seen what had happened began to believe in Jesus (John 11:1-45 [3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45]).

Family Discussion of the Week: Life Everlasting

Jesus said to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26)

Adults: Christ calls us from death to new life. To what new life are you being called during this Lent?

Kids: How does Jesus help you do what is good and avoid what is not?

LIFE FROM GOD

As we approach Holy Week, our readings speak of a God who, in the midst of death, brings new life to the people. In Ezekiel, we hear that God will open the graves of the people of Israel, who faced near extinction. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives new life to Lazarus in a manner that prefigures the resurrection of Jesus. Paul tells the Romans that in Christ, God will not only give life to our bodies after death, but God offers us abundant life here and now. We observe that the external conditions for the people described in these readings did not radically change. Israel was still in exile. Lazarus would eventually face death again. But now God's presence and power are revealed. Even when our situation in life is difficult and perhaps not likely to change soon, we remember that the Spirit dwells within us.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Passion Sunday! Before the revision of the liturgical calendar in 1969, the 5th Sunday of Lent was known as Passion Sunday and began a stretch of days called "Passiontide." The biggest remnant of that tradition is the option to cover all statuary in the church. I like to continue this tradition, as a way to remind us that we are getting closer to Holy Week and Easter and to "double down" on our call to repentance and our spiritual disciplines in prayer, fasting and almsgiving that help God to renew and transform us. This "visual fast" reminds us that all the sacramentals, statues, and other tangible reminders and symbols in our Catholic Tradition point us to one thing that they can never completely represent... God himself! To strip ourselves of even these elements reminds us to not even allow our religious devotions and piety to be an end in themselves but rather a means to deeper relationship with God. Also, this fast invites us to appreciate our images and devotions more as we go without them for a few weeks. We also deepen our liturgical fast of Lent at OLP by ending Mass in silence the next few weeks. See below in my notes for more on that.

Next weekend is the beginning of Holy Week with Palm Sunday. We will have our blessing of palms at the beginning of all Masses and the reading of Matthew's version of the Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem as well as the Passion at the Gospel. At the 9am Mass we will have the blessing of palms outside by the totem pole in front of the Scout House. Then we will process into the church to commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday. Regardless of the Mass you attend, plan on spending a few extra minutes at church as a way to begin our most sacred week of the year.

Other special opportunities for Holy Week include:

- 1. Monday, April 3rd is the Mass of the Sacred Chrism at St. Peter Cathedral in Erie (at 1pm). There Bishop Persico will bless the holy oils for the entire Diocese for the new year (the Oil of the Catechumenate, the Oil of the Infirmed, and the Sacred Chrism). Also at that Mass the priests of the diocese renew their promises with the Bishop to serve the spiritual needs of our diocese and parishes as ordained clergy. Consider yourself invited- I would love to see you there!
- 2. Tuesday, April 4th to Wednesday, April 5th. As we had done for several years, we will have a special 24 hour opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration during Holy Week. It will begin on Tuesday, April 4th at the end of the 12:10pm Mass and continue in the church until 12pm on Wednesday, April 5th. We need two committed adorers for every half hour so please consider signing up for a 30 or 60 minute slot. This is a great opportunity to reflect more deeply on all that the Triduum means to us and to grow in relationship with our God who loves you so much.
- 3. Wednesday, April 5th will include the Jesus Christ Superstar Prayer Experience led by the OLP School 8th grade class. It will be held at 1pm in the church. We thank our 8th grade students and teachers in advance for all the time they put into providing this unique meditation on the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus for the school and parish.

4. **The Sacred Triduum at OLP:** These three most holy days of the year for us as Catholics are fast approaching. Starting Holy Thursday Night (April 6th) and leading until Easter Sunday (April 9th), we walk through the events of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection that CHANGED AND SAVED THE WORLD FOREVER (what we officially call the Paschal Mystery). Please make every effort to prioritize these wonderful celebrations as a way to thank God for our Salvation in Christ and to help us grow in our living them out in our own lives.

Holy Thursday (April 6th) starts with Morning Prayer at 7am (there is no 7am or 12:10pm daily Mass today). Then we celebrate the Mass of the Last Supper at 7pm followed by prayer at the reposition altar in the cafeteria until 11pm Night Prayer. Good Friday (April 7th) starts with Morning Prayer at 7am (there is no 7am or 12:10pm daily Mass today). The Passion of the Lord Service is at 1:30pm (with Confessions from 12-1pm and 3-4pm), and a Tenebrae Service at 7pm.

Holy Saturday (April 8th) starts with Morning Prayer at 8am (there is no 8am daily Mass today). The Blessing of Easter Foods at Noon, and the Great Easter Vigil at 8:30pm.

Easter Sunday (April 9th) Masses at 7:30am, 9am and 11am.

It is my strong hope that ALL Catholics should experience each of these celebrations AT LEAST once so why not make it this year? May God bless our 5th week of Lent ahead!

The new candle will be blessed and lit at the Great Easter Vigil on Saturday, April 8th at 8:30pm and then used until next Easter.

**Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) Update: 415 pledges for

\$204,869. That means we have already exceeded our Diocesan assessment of \$137,000 and are \$23,000 from our goal of \$212,000 which will go toward replacing the yellowed and worn plexiglass over the outside of the stain glass windows of the church with new tempered glass. If you have not yet handed in your CSA pledge, please send, drop off or bring it to Mass in the next few weekends and include it in the offertory. Thank you for your generous support.

**Deacon John Mang's Reassignment to OLP We are grateful that he was assigned to Our Lady of Peace for another 5 years by Bishop Persico a few weeks ago. Deacon John is a blessing to our parish as well as me in my ministry through his

support, spiritual wisdom and multi-faceted ministry in our parish. I thank and congratulate Deacon John for all of us and encourage you to do so in person as well.

**Fast from the Closing Song at Mass during Lent Recall that during the Lenten Season we even enter a liturgical fast by omitting the Gloria and Alleluia during Mass (two of the most celebratory Mass parts that we sing). To extend that further and to encourage us to spend more time in silence in the Lenten Season, we will not be singing a hymn at the end of the Mass for the final weekend of Lent. As part of that, I ask you to leave the church in silence and wait until you are in the vestibules or outside to have conversations. This allows those who want to stay in the church for silent prayer to do so. I know that many of you like to stay and socialize after Mass in the pews, so I am asking you to make a little sacrifice for Lent and to adjust your process to help us remember that in Lent things are a little different.

**Faithful to the Finish 5K Our Annual 5K will be in person this year on Saturday, May 13th at 8pm at Presque Isle. Just as last year, all money raised by our 5K will go towards building our parish endowment which we started with the Catholic Foundation of Northwest PA a few years ago, investing in the next generation of faith.
