

Entrance Antiphon - I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. / You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. / Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

First Reading - Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen (Acts 10:34a, 37-43).

Psalm - Let us be joyful in this day of the Lord (Psalm 118).

Second Reading - Christ our Passover is sacri-ficed; therefore let us celebrate (1 Cor. 5:6b-8). **Gospel** - Three witnesses, Mary, Peter, & John; each responds to the empty tomb (John 20:1-9).

Family Discussion of the Week: Witness to Faith

Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed. (John 20:8)

Adults: What is your experience of resurrection in your own life or the life of your family? **Kids:** Jesus is with us today. How can you see him in the people around you in Church?

REJOICE AND BE GLAD

If Christmas is the "most wonderful time of the year," then Easter is the most joyous, glorious, awesome time of the year! Really? Today's readings don't exactly brim over with the kind of holiday cheer we find at Christmas—except for the responsorial psalm, which admittedly rings with gleeful joy. But otherwise, not so much. In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter gives a dry, condensed rendering of the story of Jesus to a group of Gentiles in Caesarea. The Colossians reading actually does have us looking forward to glory. Most underwhelming, though, is the Gospel proclamation of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we want to hear about angels and earthquakes and trumpets and glory, we hear about a dark, silent, empty tomb. This Easter Sunday story from John's Gospel is startling in its emptiness. Like Peter in the story, we must enter into this mystery.

From the Pastor's Desk...

"Christ is Risen, Alleluia! . . . "He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!" On behalf of Fr. Dave, Deacon John, the parish staff and leadership team, I offer you and your families a Happy Easter! (See below for a further explanation of my greeting). Back in October we asked all parishioners to participate in a survey to gain your input on how we are doing at serving the needs of our community and to identify areas for growth and improvement. Included in the bulletin is the executive summary that we received from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) which helped us with the survey. I would like to share some of my observations about the summary.

- 1. We received 932 valid responses to our survey. 80% were from registered parishioners (746) and according to our latest census, that is approximately 19% of the 4,000 parishioners (members) at Our Lady of Peace.
- 2. Nearly 97% of those surveyed gave the parish an overall positive evaluation with 60% of those rating it as excellent. This is great news and something to be celebrated. The top seven highest ratings included (5) in the area of liturgy as well as leadership and youth ministry. We thank God for the great liturgies we have at OLP and all the ministers and staff who put much time into planning and executing our liturgy as well as the youth ministry program and our staff and volunteers who help to lead the parish.
- 3. Areas of growth identified in the survey are in outreach to the those in the LGBTQ+ community, single parents, those with special needs and young adults. I would like to acknowledge a few things that have been done in these areas since my arrival while still acknowledging these are areas were we need to grow.
 - a. We conducted a "Church in Dialogue" Session regarding Same Sex Attraction and Orientation in 2018. We have not followed up on that in any substantial way, so this survey is a good impetus to another look at that.
 - b. In the area of special needs...
 - We have been the sponsor parish for The Tim Tebow Foundation's "Night to Shine" for the last five years.
 NTS is a prom night experience for people in the community with special needs.
 - Our Knights of Columbus Council at OLP has provided ongoing support for our local and state Special Olympics for decades.
 - For "The Chosen" Series (Seasons I and 2) we have had a small group for people with special needs.
 - These are all a good start, but we need to consider ways we can build on them.
 - c. In the area of young adults, our coordinator of youth ministry, Sarah Beaver, has organized some ministry and activities for young adults in the last two years but again it is something that still needs more consideration and attention.
 - d. In the area of single parents, there has been no direct ministry at OLP to our single parents. The "Kids Night Out" Program does offer some "babysitting" support to all our families, including our single parents. Previously, we did have a nursery for one Sunday Mass a week to support our parents, but it was discontinued due to

- lack of use. We do provide a "Liturgy of the Word for Children" experience at the I I am Mass each week which can support our single parents in their efforts to join us in worship. As in the other areas for growth, these are good to acknowledge while still seeing the need for more.
- 4. The last of the lowest scoring areas in the parish was "spreading the Gospel message to others." I believe the Amazing Parish Movement (see below) that we began participation in back in May 2022 will significantly address and help us in this area. So keep praying for the Holy Spirit to inspire this model of leadership and movement in our parish and be willing to be a part of the solution to this recognized need to improve our efforts to spread the Gospel!
- 5. One goal of our survey was to help identify the needs of our parish and to restart our "Hearts and Hands" Ministry. This is a focused ministry to people in need within our parish community. The Parish Prayer Line and Homebound Communion started as a part of that ministry; but we are looking to add to that and possibly revitalize others ministries that faded over the years. So, look for more updates on this over the next few months as our staff, PLT and Pastoral Council come up with a plan to move forward.

Other notes from the pastor...

**Easter Greeting At Easter I like to use the traditional Paschal greeting, which is still used in many Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches, and some Roman Catholic Churches. This greeting goes back to the early church and reinforced the significance of what we celebrate on Easter Sunday... that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is the defining truth for all Christians. It is said in a dialogue form in which one Christian greets another with "Christus resurrexit!" (Latin for Christ is Risen!) and the other responds "Vere resurrexit!" (He is Risen Indeed!). This greeting reminds us that our identity as Christians should be the first ξ most significant dimension of who we are and should bring great joy, hope and peace into our daily lives. **Easter Octave The celebration of Easter (like Christmas) cannot be limited to one day, so we as Catholics reserve eight of them, the OCTAVE of EASTER, to celebrate as Easter Day.

The celebration of this most central part of our Christian faith,

the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, reminds us that

the resurrection of Jesus, and its result, the conquering of sin

and death FOREVER, requires a full week, plus one, to

celebrate. We know that the hope and joy the resurrection brings is what we celebrate EVERY SUNDAY (and for the 50 days of the Easter Season), but in these eight days we amplify the FESTIVE REALITY of Easter. The most concrete way we can do this is at daily Mass where the prayers for Easter Sunday are said every day and we song is incorporated. The Gospel readings at Mass recount many of the post resurrection appearances of Jesus. Also, the Easter dismissal at Mass ("Go in Peace, Alleluia, Alleluia") is used all week. So, consider joining us for daily Mass and celebrating Easter all week long.

**Divine Mercy Sunday (April 16th) In addition to our Masses which celebrate this special Feast and the end of the Easter Octave, there is the opportunity for Confession from 2-3pm and a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration from 3-4pm which includes singing the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

**Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) 2023 UPDATE: 427 pledges for \$208,879. We have exceeded our Diocesan assessment of \$137,000 and are \$3,000 from our goal, which goes towards replacing the plexiglass over the outside stain glass windows with new tempered glass. Your pledge can be dropped off or bring it to Mass and include it in the offertory. Thank you for your support.

Amazing Parish/ Parish Leadership Team (PLT) I take this opportunity to review our parish participation in the Amazing Parish movement, which has been a true blessing to me. I was first approached to consider Amazing Parish (AP) in 2019 by the Faith Formation Office of the Diocese and was moving toward it when COVID hit. I was approached again in 2022 and the AP Movement resonated with me and knew it was what I and the parish needed though it would take much work. Last spring, I created our Parish Leadership Team (PLT). This is a small group that helps lead the parish with the pastor in overseeing our spiritual and organizational health. I identified the following parishioners for our PLT- Gina Adams, Warren Beaver, Justin Miles, Mary Beth Whitman, and myself. The PLT went to the AP conference to be immersed and trained in the culture that AP promotes. Since last June, I have been meeting weekly with this group and they continue to help me guide our parish. I am extremely grateful to them and their commitment to me and our parish.

Here is a brief summary of the Amazing Parish mission... "Amazing Parish exists to revitalize the Church by equipping her pastors and leaders with the training, resources and support they need to create vibrant and thriving parishes. Although every parish is unique, we've found that there are three common 'building blocks' that form the foundation of an amazing parish." Those are: I. A Culture of Prayer. 2. A Culture of Healthy Teamwork. 3. A Culture of Active Discipleship. The PLT is working with the staff, pastoral council and key volunteers to engage in these building blocks and help create the culture they promote.

I plan to share more information about what these "cultures" look like as we grow in them. I am more hopeful about the future of our church now. AP has helped me grown in my spiritual life and ministry. Please pray for this movement in our parish and diocese and pray for our PLT that we can be open to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in leading our parish community forward into new life and purpose.


