Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; / of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face; / hide not your face from me, alleluia.

First Reading - The Eleven and the women devoted themselves to prayer (Acts 1:12-14).

Psalm - I trust that I will know God's grace in the heavenly land (Psalm 27). **Second Reading** - Glorify God if you suffer for the name of Christian (1 Peter 4:13-16).

Gospel - The Son will give eternal life to all those who are given to him by the Father (John 17:1-11a).

Family Discussion of the Week: **Praying for Others** (Jesus prayed to his Father,) "I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours." (John 17:9) **Adults:** Who needs you to pray for them this week, as Jesus prayed for his disciples? **Kids:** Who will you pray for this week?

PREPARING FOR THE NEXT CHAPTER

There is a simple, detailed intimacy in our reading from Acts today. Instead of just saying "the disciples returned to Jerusalem," each one is listed by name, along with Mary, some other women, and some relatives. The absence of Judas is painfully obvious. In contemporary terms, we might think of this as Jesus' "entourage" or "posse." This was the community devoted to prayer. Psalm 27 is called a "womb to tomb" scripture, as it is commonly used for baptisms and funerals. How appropriate it is as we hear the next chapter in God's plan. First Peter foreshadows the pain and suffering that these individuals will undergo for the sake of Christ as they continue to glorify God. This echoes the language of the Gospel, where Jesus speaks of glorifying God and himself being glorified as he prays for these followers who are now left in the world to carry out the message and the vision.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

As we continue the Eucharistic Revival initiated by the US Bishops last year (recall it's a three-year revival that started in June 2022), I want to bring to your attention three upcoming opportunities to grow in Eucharistic Amazement.

ONE- Relics of Blessed Carlo Acutis and St. Manuel Gonzalez Garcia- the Diocese of Erie is privileged to be one of only 39 dioceses and organizations in the United States to host the relics of two people who were deeply devoted to the Eucharist. They are the relics of Blessed* Carlo Acutis of Italy well-known as the first millennial to be named a blessed - and St. Manuel González García of Spain, sometimes referred to as the Bishop of the Abandoned Tabernacle. "It is an extraordinary privilege for us to host the relics of Blessed Carlo and St. Manuel," said the Most Rev. Lawrence T. Persico, Bishop of Erie. "I highly encourage all Catholics, and anyone seeking grace and a prayerful experience, to make an effort to visit the relics while they are in the diocese." TWO- A Eucharistic Procession will again be held in downtown Erie for the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) which is Sunday, June 11th at 2pm. It will start and end at St. Peter Cathedral. Adoration will also be held in the Cathedral during the Procession if you are unable to participate in the procession itself. This will begin the second year of the revival which focuses on the parish (whereas the first year focused on a diocesan level).

THREE- **"The One Hour to Peace"** is an exciting parish wide formation experience coming this fall. By diving deeper into your faith and the most important hour of every week, you will find yourself less worried, more restful and energized in your daily life. You will realize that one hour with your parish family is not just one more "thing" to add to your busy schedule, but it is the way that we support each other through life's

struggles and challenges. More information will be coming in the fall but for now, plan to join us for a 5-week journey beginning in October.

May God bless our Eucharistic Revival and our 7^{th} Week of Easter ahead!

Other notes from the pastor...

**Pentecost Sunday is next weekend (May 27/28) and ends the Easter Season. We will celebrate with full Solemnity and all are encouraged to wear red when you come to Mass which is the color for Masses of the Holy Spirit.

**Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction will be held on Sunday, May 28th at 6pm to conclude the Easter Season. There will be birthday cake after prayer to celebrate our "birthday" as a church (Pentecost is traditionally considered the birthday of the church).

**Blessed Carlo Acutis, who died of an aggressive form of leukemia in October 2006 at the age of 15, has captured the hearts of people across the globe, in part due to an online site he created documenting Eucharistic miracles from around the world. The official English site for the Association and Cause for the Canonization of Carlo Acutis can be found at https:// carloacutisen.org/. It includes a link to an English version of the website he created about Eucharistic miracles, available at http:// www.miracolieucaristici.org/.

****St. Manuel Gonzalez Garcia** In 1902, the bishop of Seville, Spain, sent Saint Manuel González García to preach a mission in a small town; what the saint found was a discouragingly unkempt and abandoned church. The experience inspired him to kneel before the tabernacle and dedicate himself to Christ, abandoned in tabernacles all over the world. He also was well-known for his care for the poor and hungry. When he died in 1940, he asked to be buried next to a tabernacle, "so that my bones, after death, as my tongue and my pen in life, are saying to those who pass: there is Jesus! There it is! Do not leave him abandoned!" ****Why do we venerate relics?** The veneration of relics in the Catholic Church is an ancient tradition that dates back all the way to the New Testament. We can find its origins in the life of Jesus Christ (think of the woman who touched Jesus' cloak and was healed). The church has always treated the relics of saints in a special manner, preserving them and often putting them on display for the benefit of the faithful. Relics of saints are typically housed in special cases called reliquaries and can either be seen in a permanent display in various churches, or in a traveling presentation like the tour of the relics of Blessed Carlo Acutis and St. Manuel González García in the United States.

Our celebration began with the school Mary's Day Mass on May 5th. Some other opportunities to honor Mary the rest of the month are...

- Monday, May 29th, the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church- 9am Mass which will also be offered for Living and Deceased Veterans since it is Memorial Day. This is a newly instituted feast by Pope Francis in the last 5 years.
- Wednesday, May 31st, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary- we will celebrate our normal daily Masses at 7am and 12:10pm.
- Weekday Rosary at OLP in the main church which starts at 11:40am.

And I certainly encourage you to find other ways to honor Mary through your personal devotions this month as well. Mary was that gift given to us by Jesus from the cross so receive that gift and allow Mary to draw you closer to her Son Jesus this month in a special way!

****COVID Protocols** Last week our Liturgy Committee updated our COVID protocols.

- We eliminated the hand sanitizers in the aisles of the church.
- We reduced the section reserved for masks to the back half of the eastern section of pews in the church (from the split to the back- which is 6 pews).
- The Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion who distributes Communion to the far eastern section will no longer have to mask.
- STILL in place is the protocol that our clergy and EMHCs will sanitize their hands after receiving Holy Communion and before distributing.
- We will continue to Livestream the 9am Mass and say the Spiritual Communion Prayer for those who are unable to come to church for Mass.
- The Diocese of Erie has maintained their expectation that we do not distribute the Precious Blood to the congregation at Mass.



OUR FASCINATING FAITH

World Communications Day


In addition to the liturgical calendar, the Church designates various Sundays throughout the year as days to focus on particular subjects. Today is one such day. World Communications Day was established by Pope Paul VI in 1967 as an annual celebration that encourages us to reflect on the opportunities and challenges that the modern means of social communication (the press, motions pictures, radio, television, and now, of course, the internet) afford the Church to communicate the gospel message.

The worldwide observance of this day came in the wake of the Second Vatican Council, when the Church realized it must engage fully with the modern world. This realization is expressed in the opening statement of the Pastoral Constitution *Gaudium et spes* (The Church in the Modern World), which says: "The joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anguishes of the people of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted in any way, are the joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anguishes of the followers of Christ as well." In setting up this day, Pope Paul VI wanted to draw attention to the communications media and the enormous power they have for cultural transformation.
