



#### **Sunday's Readings:**

**Entrance Antiphon** - The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world / and that which contains all thing / understands what is said, alleluia.

**First Reading** - Filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles begin to speak in tongues (Acts 2:1-11). **Psalm** - Lord, make the earth new by the power of your Spirit (Psalm 104).

**Second Reading** - In one Spirit we are baptized into one body and given to drink of one Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13).

**Gospel** - Jesus Christ appears to the disciples and sends them on their mission with the power to forgive or retain sins through the Holy Spirit (John 20:19-23).

#### Family Discussion of the Week: Sent to Serve

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:21-22)

**Adults:** What important work does Jesus ask of you at this time in your life? **Kids:** how would Jesus want you to treat your friends and family this week?

#### **GOT SPIRIT?**

When we were in high school, there was an old cheer at ballgames, "We've got spirit, yes we do. We've got spirit, how 'bout you?" We would scream it back and forth with the opposing team's fans. And while, "Got Spirit?" could certainly be the catchphrase today, we see people receiving the spirit in many different ways. In Acts, there appear a loud noise and a driving wind, followed by people being able to understand speech in many languages. It is reminiscent of a booming, "This is my Son, my Beloved." Psalm 104 "Lord, Send out Your Spirit" was also the first psalm used at the Easter Vigil, in response to the creation story. First Corinthians acknowledges that there are many different spiritual gifts, but we must use them together as the body of Christ. The Sequence is a beautiful prayer that calls down the Spirit. In John's Gospel, the Spirit comes through the breath of Jesus. What can we take away from this? That the Spirit of God is not "one size fits all." Rather, the Holy Spirit will come to us, speak to us, be given to us, as each of us needs.



#### From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Memorial Day Weekend! Please see my notes below for more thoughts on Memorial Day. I would like to take a moment to address the incident that occurred at Blessed Sacrament a few weeks ago at the 7:30pm Sunday Mass.

First, I share the statement from Bishop Persico "...at the end of the 7:30PM Mass at Blessed Sacrament Parish, Erie, there was an incident involving a young man and some others attending Mass. Those present had many different experiences regarding the incident. Here are the facts we know:

According to the Erie Police Department, the 20-year-old man walked into the church wearing a hat under a hoodie. Witnesses say that as Mass came to an end, the young man was speaking with some parishioners who noticed he had a pocketknife and what appeared to be a gun in his pocket. One of the individuals speaking with the young man grabbed what turned out to be a BB gun and threw it to the ground. The young man did not brandish the knife or the gun and made no threats. He was held until police arrived and questioned him. The young man was found not to be a threat by the Erie Police Department and released. The District Attorney's Office has been made aware of the incident.

I thank God no one was hurt in this situation. There is a heightened awareness in our communities due to the many tragedies related to gun violence and to so much loss of life in our country, including in recent months. People are understandably paying attention and even taking action in situations that seem suspect. We pray for all of the people who attended Mass last evening — it was a frightening and confusing situation. We also pray for the young man involved. Churches and other places of worship are as at risk as schools and businesses today. We are continually working to create safe and secure places where people can worship in peace and safety. On more than one occasion I have called for stricter gun laws. Until that occurs, people will remain on high alert. At the same time, I have said we must work to strengthen families and improve access to mental health care and early intervention. I encourage all of us to be charitable and kind and to make sure information shared about this incident remains factual."

Several people reached out to me after this occurred to ask what Our Lady of Peace was doing to help create a safe and secure place for worship at our parish. So, I take this occasion to update you on what we are doing. In the fall of 2021, our Pastoral Council created a Safety Committee at Our Lady of Peace. I asked Tom Sargent, who was a pastoral council member at the time, to oversee the committee. We identified members of our community that have experience in this area- past and present members include Tom Sargent, Kevin Raines, Mike Dugan (Retired Millcreek Detective), Gary Carver (President of the West Ridge Fire Department) Mindi Wierzchowski (medical team lead), Matt Benacci (Millcreek Police), Camron Wilkins (owner of The Wilkins Company which specializes on security systems) and Kim Miles (OLP Usher/ Hospitality Representative).

Since its creation the Safety Committee has researched extensively what policies are presently in places of worship throughout the country (including All Saints Parish in Waterford

which is the only parish in the Diocese of Erie which has an official team and policy), met with local emergency intervention experts and had them evaluate our parish and make recommendations for our church and campus, created a medical emergency team and policy as well as improving our inventory for supplies on hand in the church, and organized an AED/CPR/First Aid Training for Ushers and other volunteers at the parish. They are also presently working on a weather emergency policy and a fire evaluation of the church and rectory.

The Safety Committee had also planned an Active Shooter Training for May 20<sup>th</sup> but that had to be postponed. The incident at Blessed Sacrament certainly reinforces the need for our Safety Committee to continue its work and we will reschedule the training in the next few months and communicate the details. We will also communicate some of the basic principles of emergency situations to the entire parish. I hope this affirms that our leadership at OLP takes the safety of our parishioners and guests seriously and we will continue to do our best to create that safe and secure environment that Bishop Persico spoke of in his statement. - \*\*Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction will be held on Sunday, May 28<sup>th</sup> at 6pm to conclude the Easter Season. There will be birthday cake after evening prayer to celebrate our "birthday" as a church (Pentecost is traditionally considered the birthday of the church).
- \*\*Memorial Day Mass/Praying for the Dead/Purgatory Join your OLP family on Monday at 9am to not just commemorate those who have given their lives in service to our country, but to more importantly to pray the most effective prayer we have in our Catholic tradition for them... come join in offering Mass for them. We do so, following the example of Judas Maccabee in the Bible. Remember that in the Second Book of Maccabees. Judas takes up a collection for an expiatory sacrifice for those who had died in battle against the Greeks. It was found out that those slain had worshiped false gods and Judas makes atonement for them so that they might be freed of sin. Scripture says that "in doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way." (2 Macc. 12: 38-46). This event in the Bible shows the efficaciousness of praying for the dead. It reaffirms our fundamental Catholic belief that in a mysterious way, our prayers can assist those who have died and are experiencing

the purifying process of purgatory. In its section on the final purification, or purgatory, the Catechism (#s1030-1032) explains it this way:

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." So, to all those who ask "does the Catholic Church/do we still believe in Purgatory?"- hopefully the example of Judas Maccabee and 2,000 years of tradition of praying for the dead help you to see the answer to your question is YES!

- \*\*Marian Opportunities for May Being a Marian Parish, it is good to remember that we seek to honor Mary in a special way throughout the month of May. That began at Our Lady of Peace with our school celebration of Mary's Day on May 5th. Some other opportunities to honor Mary the rest of the month are...
- Monday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church- 9am Mass which will also be offered for Living and Deceased Veterans since it is Memorial Day. This is a newly instituted feast by Pope Francis in the last 5 years.
- 2. Wednesday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary- we will celebrate our normal daily Masses at 7am and 12:10pm.
- 3. **Weekday Rosary** at OLP in the main church starting at 11:40am.

- \*\*Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession There will again be a procession held in downtown Erie for the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) which is Sunday, June 11th at 2pm. It will start and end at St. Peter Cathedral. Adoration will also be held in the Cathedral during the Procession if you are unable to participate in the procession itself. This will begin the second year of the revival which focuses on the parish (whereas the first year focused on a diocesan level).




