

Family Discussion of the Week: Bread for Others

NOURISHING FOOD

Manna in the desert, water from a rock, bread, wine. God provides food to nourish our bodies and our souls, to bring us into union with the Divine. This is what we celebrate on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Israelites who journeyed through the desert for forty years knew physical hunger, but they were also hungry for more—they needed to know that God was with them as they made their way through the dangerous desert. We too experience hunger. We need to be assured that the Lord is with us as we navigate the circumstances of our lives, some of which feel dangerous, if not to our bodies, certainly to our spirit. Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ to you! I encourage you to check out more information in my notes about some special opportunities for prayer today to celebrate the unique presence of our God in the Eucharist. I also want to emphasize that today is also the beginning of year two of the National Eucharistic Revival which focuses on the parish level (last year was diocesan level). One big aspect of our parish level focus at OLP will be the "One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission" formation experience in the Fall which we have been talking about and which we will focus more on in September. In addition to that, we will also be sending out more emails to the parish that celebrate different aspects of our Eucharistic faith (you should have already received some on special feasts over the last half year), there will be bulletin inserts to offer catechesis as well as food for thought on the Eucharist and we will sprinkle in some Eucharistic reflections in our homilies and holy hours. So keep your eyes open for these nuggets that I hope will help our parish continue to grow in Eucharistic Amazement!

I also share with information on the goals of the parish year of Eucharistic Revival from the National Eucharistic Revival

"The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1324). In the Eucharist, we truly encounter the Lord Jesus and are plunged into his Paschal Mystery, and through this encounter our lives are transformed (cf. Desiderio Desideravi, nos. 10–11, 21). The Eucharist is not an object but a person who is alive and transforms lives. The person of Jesus Christ is at the heart of this Eucharistic moment in the United States. This is the work of revival. It is not an institutional work. We cannot demand revival but we can invite it, pray for it, and respond to it.

Beginning this summer, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, we arrive at the most pivotal year of the three-year National Eucharistic Revival called for by the bishops of the United States. God wants to bring revival to his Church through a rekindled relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist, and this year, that invitation reaches the pews and beyond.

The purpose of the Year of Parish Revival is to discern how we might 'heal, form, convert, unify, and send' our parishioners through a 'rekindled relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist." There are four pillars that uphold the movement of Eucharistic revival in the United States: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries. This is the task of local parishes in this Year of Parish Revival: to revive their parishioners in their love with Jesus in the Eucharist and to send them forth to share this love with others. We must remember the power and responsibility of the local parish, especially in light of the jarring statistics about Eucharistic beliefs among Catholics. Seven in ten Catholics believe the Eucharist is merely a symbol, an encounter with an "it" instead of a "who." This reality should break our hearts, not because of what it means for Mass attendance or stewardship but because so many Catholics are missing the opportunity to know Jesus Christ. As our hearts break, we should remain hopeful and empowered. We can directly impact these numbers. One thing is certain, though: in this movement of Eucharistic revival, the bishops of the United States are asking every parish to take one step further than their current efforts. The desired fruit is a Eucharistic encounter that leads to belief and becomes visible in practice. Revival requires encounter, and that encounter needs to happen—this year and every year following—in parishes across our country. "The parish is not an outdated institution," Pope Francis reminds us in Evangelii Gaudium. An encounter with Jesus, our Eucharistic Lord, is powerful because it changes us. It gives us our very character. The Year of Parish Revival offers pathways to encounter with, belief in, and worship of Jesus in the Eucharist."

- **For the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will be held on Sunday, June 11th from 5:15-6pm followed by Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction.
- **Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession There will be a procession held in downtown Erie for the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) which is Sunday, June 11th at 2PM. It will start and end at St. Peter Cathedral. Adoration will also be held in the Cathedral during the Procession if you are unable to participate in the procession itself. This will begin the second year of the revival which focuses on the parish (whereas the first year focused on a diocesan level).
- ***The One Hour to Peace"... from Mass to Mission is an exciting parish wide formation experience coming this fall. By diving deeper into your faith and the most important hour of every week, you will find yourself less worried, more restful and energized in your daily life. You will realize that one hour with your parish family is not just one more "thing" to add to your busy schedule but is the way that we support each other through life's struggles and challenges. More information will be

coming in early fall but for now, pray and plan to join us for a 5-week journey beginning in October.

**OLP Serves On August 19th, teams of volunteers from OLP will be sent to serve other members of our parish by completing small projects and work around their homes that they are unable to do on their own. This is a model that our parish has participated in over the years through Young People Who Care (YPWC) in Frenchville as well as Catholic Heart Work Camps throughout the country and ServErie throughout the city. Members of our Parish Outreach Committee thought it would be great to apply this model to serve the needs of our own parish community. So, this weekend we are asking you to help us in one of three ways:

One- Help us identify projects that fellow parishioners might need assistance with. People are not always comfortable asking for help, so we need your help in identifying those we can assist.

Two- Volunteer for Saturday, August 19th from 8:30AM to 4:00PM.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Every year Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus falls on the first Friday after the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The devotion to the Sacred Heart comes from a French nun, Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, to whom Jesus showed his heart in June 1675. He told her that his heart burned with love for human beings but Christians only offended him with insults, ingratitude, and indifference. Thus, the Sacred Heart of Jesus is shown with a flame of fire and surrounded by a crown of thorns.

How many times have we, as the Church or as individuals, pierced the heart of the Lord, our Spouse? Even so, the image of the heart of Jesus, pierced with thorns and aflame with love for us, continues to sing and call to us to be completely his. If we return to him, Jesus promises twelve blessings of peace, consolation, fervor, and other graces. The promises are generally for the good of our families, the conversion of sinners, and an increase in the faith. All of these promises focus on the infinite love of Jesus, who has our names engraved on his heart because of the love he has for us. Christ manifests himself as a spouse who desires the best for his bride, the Church.
