They lend themselves especially well to a reflection on the vocation to ordained priesthood. The scriptures for today help us understand the role of the ordained in the life of the Church. They also encourage us to pray for an increase in the number of candidates for priestly ordination, for "the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few" (Matthew 9:37).

\*\*OLP Serves On August 19th, teams of volunteers from OLP will be sent to serve other members of our parish by completing small projects and work around their homes that they are unable to do on their own. This is a model that our parish has participated in over the years through Young People Who Care (YPWC) in Frenchville as well as Catholic Heart Work Camps throughout the country and ServErie throughout the city. Members of our Parish Outreach Committee thought it would be great to apply this model to serve the needs of our own parish community. So, this weekend we are asking you to help us in one of three ways:

**One-** Help us identify projects that fellow parishioners might need assistance with. People are not always comfortable asking for help, so we need your help in identifying those we can assist.

**Two-** Volunteer for Saturday, August 19th from 8:30AM to 4:00PM.

**Three-** Make a donation to cover the cost of supplies and materials for those parishioners who might need help purchasing their supplies. Donations should be dropped at the office and labeled OLP Serves.

OLP Serves will be a great way to help our parish grow as a community and to grow in grace by serving and being willing to be served. Please join me in praying for this initiative and considering in what ways you can be a part of it.

\*\*OLP Raffle Our annual parish fundraiser is underway. Each ticket sold supports the programs and mission of our parish. There is a grand prize of \$10,000 with five other prizes adding up to \$15,000 as well as monthly early bird drawings (July 14, and August 18). Remember to turn in the BONUS yellow ticket for every 10 tickets purchased, giving you another chance at all the prizes. We are off to a good start with 466 sold tickets towards our goal of 3,800 tickets.

\*\*Year of Parish Revival Sunday, June 11<sup>th</sup> was the beginning of year two of the National Eucharistic Revival which focuses on the parish level (last year was diocesan level). One big aspect of our parish level focus at OLP will be the "One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission" formation experience in the Fall which we have been talking about and which we will focus more on in September. In addition to that, we will also be sending out more emails to the parish that celebrate different aspects of our Eucharistic faith (you should have already received some on special feasts over the last half year), there will be bulletin inserts to offer catechesis as well as food for thought on the Eucharist and we will sprinkle in some

Eucharistic reflections in our homilies and holy hours. So keep your eyes open for these nuggets that I hope will help our parish continue to grow in Eucharistic Amazement!

I also share with information on the goals of the parish year of Eucharistic Revival from the National Eucharistic Revival.

"The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1324). In the Eucharist, we truly encounter the Lord Jesus and are plunged into his Paschal Mystery, and through this encounter our lives are transformed (cf. Desiderio Desideravi, nos. 10–11, 21). The Eucharist is not an object but a person who is alive and transforms lives. The person of Jesus Christ is at the heart of this Eucharistic moment in the United States. This is the work of revival. It is not an institutional work. We cannot demand revival but we can invite it, pray for it, and respond to it.

Beginning this summer, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, we arrive at the most pivotal year of the three-year National Eucharistic Revival called for by the bishops of the United States. God wants to bring revival to his Church through a rekindled relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist, and this year, that invitation reaches the pews and beyond. The purpose of the Year of Parish Revival is to discern how we

might 'heal, form, convert, unify, and send' our parishioners through a 'rekindled relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist.'" There are four pillars that uphold the movement of Eucharistic revival in the United States: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries. This is the task of local parishes in this Year of Parish Revival: to revive their parishioners in their love with Jesus in the Eucharist and to send them forth to share this love with others. We must remember the power and responsibility of the local parish, especially in light of the jarring statistics about Eucharistic beliefs among Catholics. Seven in ten Catholics believe the Eucharist is merely a symbol, an encounter with an "it" instead of a "who." This reality should break our hearts, not because of what it means for Mass attendance or stewardship but because so many Catholics are missing the opportunity to know Jesus Christ. As our hearts break, we should remain hopeful and empowered. We can directly impact these numbers. One thing is certain, though: in this movement of Eucharistic revival, the bishops of the United States are asking every parish to take one step further than their current efforts. The desired fruit is a Eucharistic encounter that leads to belief and becomes visible in practice. Revival requires encounter, and that encounter needs to happen—this year and every year following—in parishes across our country. "The parish is not an outdated institution," Pope Francis reminds us in Evangelii Gaudium. An encounter with Jesus, our Eucharistic Lord, is powerful because it changes us. It gives us our very character. The Year of Parish Revival offers pathways to encounter with, belief in, and worship of Jesus in the Eucharist."



## OUR FASCINATING FAITH Saint John the Baptist's Fire

On June 24 we remember Saint John the Baptist, who became famous preaching repentance and baptizing with water while insisting that the Messiah would come and baptize the world with fire and the Holy Spirit. Today, he is one of the most celebrated saints in the world; his feast coincides with the arrival of summer in the Northern Hemisphere.

The feast of Saint John is celebrated in Spain and Portugal with bonfires. For example, in order to celebrate "San Xoan" as the Galicians call him, fires are lit in holes dug in the ground during the vigil of the feast and people dance around them. Eventually, they try to jump over the fires nine times during the night for good luck. The pleasure of celebrating the feast of Saint John and the arrival of summer came to America with the Spaniards and the Portuguese.

In 1509, Juan Ponce de León originally named the island of Puerto Rico in honor of Saint John. There they play a water game on his feast. At midnight on June 23, the faithful throw themselves into the water three times with their backs to the ocean, facing the land, seeking purification and celebration. All this celebrating reminds us that a life of conversion is meant to be happy and fulfilled in the Lord, who calls us to be prophets like John.

The cost is \$20 per child or \$25 per family; which includes snacks each day as well as crafts and supplies. Please complete one form per child.


