

We are called to be "dead to sin, and living in Christ Jesus." In the Gospel passage from Saint Luke, Jesus bids us to take up our cross, and to receive others as if we were receiving Christ. Deacon Luke is starting a bible study this summer which I encourage you to consider. He will also be writing an 8-part series on the Eucharist to help us continue to prepare for our "One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission" experience in the Fall. - 1. Bishop Persico has reassigned me as pastor of OLP for a term of 6 years effectively immediately until July 31, 2029. I am very excited about this and look forward to continuing the good things that we are about here at OLP together.
- 2. At Fr. Dave Whiteford's request, Bishop Persico has granted Fr. Dave a leave of absence from active ministry for personal reasons effective immediately. Let's keep Fr. Dave in our prayers, that the Lord may provide him with what he needs to return to active ministry soon. I regret that Fr. Dave's abrupt departure did not allow us to say goodbye. 

#### Deacon Luke Daghir Article 1 of 8 on the Eucharist

Editor's Note: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - Year of Parish Revival) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on Mass to Mission, this writing series will help to support both.



#### Aguinas, the Bicentennial Tower, and State Street

The view from the Bicentennial Tower provides a beautiful vantage point of Erie. A slight glimpse over Presque Isle's tree line opens the vastness of the lake. Many of the boats that are docked,

indirectly. Many of the major Eucharistic celebrations, like Erie's 12th or 26th streets that directly

and the differing buildings of Erie can be seen like a panorama. My favorite view from the Bicentennial Tower is looking southward down State Street. All the streets of Erie are directly or indirectly connected to State Street. Bayfront, 6th, 12th, 18th, 26th, and 38th all find themselves directly aligned to State Street.

St. Thomas Aquinas provides a Bicentennial Tower view of the sacrament of the Eucharist. Aquinas' contributions, which will be explored throughout this series, have significantly helped the Church to speak about the Eucharist. Aquinas was able, with help from God, to see out beyond - like how one can see out beyond the bay standing atop the Bicentennial Tower.

Aquinas' writings are like State Street in Erie. Although
Aquinas' writings were from the 13th century, the saints, theologians,
and the Catholic faithful have found themselves connected to his Eucharistic writings either directly or

connect to State, find themselves directly connected to Aquinas. For example, the celebration of *Corpus Christi* and Benediction for Adoration both utilize prayers or hymns written by Aquinas.

Later in Aquinas' life, he had an experience with Jesus that is simply captivating. One of Aquinas' brother friars saw Aquinas praying before the crucifix with tears streaming down his face. Next, the brother friar heard Jesus speak from the crucifix saying, "You have written well of me, Thomas (Aquinas). What reward will you receive from me for your labor?"

Aquinas responded, "Only You, Lord."

Pope Francis has shared that "the saints are concrete proof that it is possible to put the Gospel into practice." Aquinas is concrete proof that, with the help of God, we also can grow in Eucharistic belief, awe, and amazement.

#### **OUR FASCINATING FAITH**

#### The Second Vatican Council—Origins

Conditions in the world after World War II crystallized trends begun in the nineteenth century and often associated with the Industrial Revolution. The age of empires was receding and modern society was rapidly evolving, but horrors such as the Holocaust were perpetrated as well. Having lived through the midst of this political and social upheaval Angelo Roncalli—Pope Saint John XXIII—saw clearly the need for the Church to respond to the new reality in the world or be left behind. So on January 25, 1959, less than three months into his pontificate, the Good Pope announced his decision to convene an ecumenical council to help the Church better comprehend and communicate the Gospel in the light of the signs of the times. What became known as the Second Vatican Council evolved into a vast cooperative effort among the Church's leaders (more than three thousand bishops!) and some four hundred eighty theologians and experts, along with hundreds of invited Catholic and non-Catholic observers. The outcome was the most consequential event in the life of the Catholic Church in perhaps four centuries. We will explore this Council in further detail in upcoming installments of this series.
