AN APPROACHABLE GOD

Many years ago, there was a very popular Christian poster that did nothing but list names for God from the scriptures. While it included powerful names like "Lion of Judah" and "Wonderful Counselor," as a whole it was a sharp contrast to the simple and beautiful images present in our scriptures today. The prophet Zechariah prefigures the Christ coming in meekly and mildly on an ass—the vision we might have of Palm Sunday. In Romans Saint Paul reveals to us our truer selves, calling us to embrace the Spirit of Christ, put aside our fleshly beings, and live more fully in Christ. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus bypasses the learned, and God reveals things to the childlike. We are presented with a simple, straightforward approach to God, and to finding God.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed feast of Our Lady of Peace! This is one of the non-universal feast days for Mary under our parish title, Mary, Queen of Peace, or Our Lady of Peace (as well as January 24th). For this reason, I had proposed this date to be our parish patronal feast day and have communicated that to you as well as some of our parish leaders over the past few years (and even to the diocese as they have been re-creating a diocesan calendar of feast days and asking for our feast day). Unfortunately, I have not been at peace with that decision (no pun intended), as the middle of summer is a challenging time to gather the parish for events around the feast date. So, more recently I proposed another option to our parish leadership team, staff and liturgy committee and they agreed to commit to August 22nd as our new official feast day. There are several reasons I am more at peace with this date:

One- It is a universal feast day of Mary that gets quite overlooked so it will help us give more focus to this already established feast.

Two- It is also a Mystery of the Rosary, the 5th Glorious Mystery, the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth, which will give us a greater connection to the Rosary.

Three- It is a week after the Assumption of Mary into Heaven (August 15th) and so is the last day of this unofficial octave of Mary that happens every August which again often gets overlooked (other than the Assumption itself).

Four- It provides a spiritual compliment to our annual parish picnic which is always the Saturday after Labor Day and has become our biggest communal event of the year.

This year, we will have a prayer event on Tuesday, August 22nd and more information will be coming out in the next few weeks about it. In the meantime, I share with you the information that will posted next to the image of Our Lady of Peace in the church. It was framed by the Parish Rosary Society and blessed on December 8, 2022.

Image of Our Lady of Peace:

- The picture is based on the sculpture in St. Mary Major Basilica in Rome.
- The sculpture was commissioned by Pope Benedict XV in thanksgiving for the end of the First World War and completed by Roman artist Guido Galli in 1918, a marble statue of Mary enthroned is perched high against the wall.
- Beneath the statue is the simple inscription, "Ave Regina Pacis" (Hail, Queen of Peace).
- Mary's left hand is raised up and out to the world in a gesture of "Basta! Enough! Stop the war and violence!"
- •In her right arm, she holds Christ depicted as a small child dangling an olive branch, a symbol of peace, waiting for His mother's word to allow it to fall from His fingers and descend to the world.
- •A dove, another symbol of peace, sits beside the throne (hidden just out of the frame) preparing to fly, one wing already raised and eyes fixed intently on the branch in Christ's hand.
- Mary's eyes look down, meeting the gaze of the viewer below.
- The image conveys a strong sense of the centrality of Mary's intercessory role in the life of the Church: the dove

waits for the branch to descend; the branch waits for Christ to release it; Christ waits on the word of His mother.

•The image also invites us into a deeper message of peace: Mary herself waits upon us.

May God bless our new parish feast day and our week ahead!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We are all called to be missionaries in some way. Deacon Luke Daghir Article 2 of 8 on the Eucharist

Editor's Note: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - Year of Parish Revival) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on Mass to Mission, this writing series will help to support both.



Aquinas, Presque Isle, the Eucharist, and Protection

Lake Erie can be calm and peaceful in one moment then turn rough and dangerous the next. The bay remains more at peace from the weather conditions because of the protection from

Presque Isle. Historically, it wasn't just protection from the weather that Presque Isle provided to the harbor.

During the War of 1812, Presque Isle and its sandbar offered protection for the construction of ships in the bay. British war ships could be seen nearing Erie, but they were unable to enter the bay due to Presque Isle and the sandbar's defense.

These protective conditions enabled Daniel Dobbins to construct ships within the bay. Ultimately, the Battle of Lake Erie would be won at Put-In-Bay by the American fleet which was led by Oliver Perry.



For Aquinas, the Eucharist protects us in a similar way as Presque Isle has protected the bay. Aquinas wrote both a *Preparation For* and *Thanksgiving After Mass* prayer that focuses on the Eucharist. (these prayers can be found on page 327 in the Breaking Bread hymnal).

In his post-communion prayer he would pray, "May [the Eucharist] be a firm defense against the snares of all my enemies, both visible and invisible."

One of the effects of the Eucharist, according to Aquinas, is that we are given spiritual medicine. For Aquinas, the Eucharist preserves us from inner decay and thus protects us from spiritual death. In addition, the Eucharist preserves us from sin by strengthening our spiritual lives as we become more united to Jesus.



In a similar way as Presque Isle has protected the bay from weather and enemies, Aquinas believed that the Eucharist protects us from spiritual warfare. This is because the Eucharist points towards Christ's Passion, that we enter into at every Mass, in which He conquered the enemy. May each of us have a bay-like humility that is open to being protected by Jesus in the reception of the Eucharist as Presque Isle has protected Erie.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Second Vatican Council—Not "Out of Nowhere"

Prior to the convening of the Second Vatican Council, there had long been trends in the Catholic world that advocated for reform. For example, the liturgical movement had started at the beginning of the twentieth century and had spread from the monasteries across Europe and into the universities and even dioceses and parishes in the United States. The latest of several international liturgical conferences preceding Vatican II had received high praise from Pope Pius XII in 1956. The biblical movement had started even earlier and also garnered worldwide support. The pastoral and scholarly contributions of these global movements to the preparatory commission for the liturgy document led to its acceptance by the Council fathers as the first topic to be addressed by the Council. Two additional twentieth-century movements deserve mention: the ecumenical movement, which influenced several of the later Vatican II documents, and the "new theology" movement, which included the idea of *ressourcement* (going back to the original sources like the Bible and the Church Fathers). Adherents of this latter movement had encountered strong resistance from Church authorities but by 1960 were gaining influence. The theme of VBS 2023 is




