****Precious Blood Returns** Bishop Persico has given permission to return to the communal distribution of the Precious Blood at Masses in the Diocese of Erie. So, at OLP the Precious Blood will be available at the 9am and 11am Masses starting Sunday, August 6th. We hope to make it available at the Saturday evening and 7:30am Sunday Masses eventually depending on whether we have enough ministers to help with the distribution.

****Special Masses this Week** *Monday, July 24th*- St. Sharbel Makluf (19th century Maronite Monk known as the "Hermit of Lebanon"); *Tuesday, July 25th*- St. James, Apostle (known as "the Greater" because he was the first of the two James' to follow Christ, also the first apostle martyred in 44 AD and venerated at Santiago de Compostella); *Wednesday, July 26th*- Sts. Joachim and Ann (parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary); *Thursday, July 27th and Friday, July 28th*- Weekdays in Ordinary Time; *Saturday, July 29th*- Sts. Martha, Mary and Lazarus (Jesus' friends from Bethany).



****Movie Highlight- My Only Son and Sound of Freedom** You know I like to support media efforts to provide positive, Christian movies, shows, music, etc. I bring to your attention two movies that were recently released by Angel Studios (who produces "The Chosen" Series on the life of Jesus) and that I would recommend:

ONE- "**My Only Son**" was released several months ago and is no longer in theatres. It depicts the three days of Abraham taking Isaac to Mount Moriah to sacrifice him. In scripture it only takes one verse, but this movie gives you a greater glimpse into what those three days may have looked like and the anguish that Abraham had to deal with in moving towards that sacrifice. Though done on a low budget, it is very effective and thought provoking.

TWO- "**Sound of Freedom**" is still in theatres and has received similar box office support as did "The Jesus Revolution" received last year (a movie starring Kelsey Grammar and Jonathan Roumie about the hippy Christian movement in the early 1970s). "Sound of Freedom" is a sobering look at the issue of human trafficking as it portrays the true story about a federal agent who leaves his job to start rescuing children who have been kidnapped. The goal of the movie is to heighten people's awareness of how prevalent human trafficking is even in the United States and the need to do something about it (human trafficking is only behind drug trafficking as far as profitable criminal activity in the United States!). The movie is startling while also being inspiring.

****OLP Raffle Update** Congratulations OLP Knights of Columbus winners of the July Early Bird family game package. Thank you to all who have sold/purchased tickets for the raffle. We hit 50% of our goal mark this week. Remember, the OLP Raffle is the main fundraiser of the parish and supports the programming, ministries and keeps the lights on and the a/c running. Our goal is 3,800 tickets and proceeds provide for the needs of the parish for the new fiscal year (2023/2024). Every ticket sold helps. Need more tickets, stop by the church office.

****Welcome to Our Lady of Peace, Fr. Dan Hoffman!** Fr. Dan is a native son of OLP who graduated from OLP in the late 1990s, entered seminary in the early 2000s and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Erie in 2009. He then earned a degree in Canon Law at the Catholic University of America. After that he spent several years at St. Luke Parish, Our Lady of the Lake in Edinboro, and the last year as pastor of a cluster of parishes out in McKean County in central PA. Please help me in welcoming Fr. Dan to OLP.

****Bishop Persico Letters to Erie County Parishes and Pastoral Letter on Pastoral Planning to the entire Diocese of Erie** Bishop Persico's 2nd letter to all Catholics of Erie County was read at all Masses last weekend. The Bishop's overall Pastoral Letter to the entire diocese regarding the pastoral planning was released on June 7, 2023 and can be found there as well. This is only the 2nd pastoral letter Bishop Persico has written to the entire diocese during his term of service (11 years) so it is important that you read it.



****Parish/School Movie Nights Wednesday, August 23rd- Encanto at dusk.** The movie is shown on the south OLP gym wall. Bring your chairs/blankets; drinks/popcorn available for purchase.

****Properties Update:**

- The stain glass windows are complete. I have heard a lot of positive comments as far as the exterior and interior impact so thank you again for supporting our CSA 2023.
- We recently completed the last project from our CSA 2022, delayed due to shipping issues. The new hardware for the church doors was installed including electrical locking which was recommended by the Safety Committee. The new hardware gets our doors up to code as well as being more secure. Additionally, more cameras were installed in the church to allow for broader video coverage.
- We are working to get handrails installed in the church sanctuary to allow greater accessibility for our ministers and others entering the altar area. We will fund this project through donations from Erie Gives 2023, which takes place on Tuesday, August 8th from 8am-8pm. Last year we were able to raise \$26,300 for renovations to the social room. Our goal for this year is \$25,000 for renovations to the sanctuary that increases the accessibility to the altar. Look for more details in the coming weeks.

****OLP Serves** On August 19th, teams of volunteers from OLP will be sent to serve other members of our parish by completing small projects and work around their homes that they are unable to do on their own. This is a model that our parish has participated in over the years through Young People Who Care (YPWC) in Frenchville as well as Catholic Heart Work Camps throughout the country and ServErie throughout the city. Members of our Parish Outreach Committee thought it would be great to apply this model to serve the needs of our own parish community. So, this weekend we are asking you to help us in one of three ways:

One- Help us identify projects that fellow parishioners might need assistance with. People are not always comfortable asking for help, so your help is needed in identifying who we could offer to help.

Two- Volunteer for Saturday, Aug. 19th, 8:30AM to 4:00PM.

Three- Make a donation to cover the cost of supplies and materials for those parishioners who might need help purchasing their supplies. Donations should be dropped at the office and labeled OLP Serves.

OLP Serves is a great way to help our parish grow as a community and to grow in grace by serving and being willing to be served. Please join me in praying for this initiative and considering in what ways you can be a part of it.

The cost is \$20 per child or \$25 per family; which includes snacks each day as well as crafts and supplies. Please complete one form per child.



Deacon Luke Dagher Article 4 of 8 on the Eucharist

Editor's Note: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - *Year of Parish Revival*) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on *Mass to Mission*, this writing series will help to support both.



Aquinas, Gratitude, the Our Father, and the Eucharist

For Aquinas, gratitude is a special virtue that is under the cardinal virtue of justice. Justice is the virtue by which we give another their proper due. Gratitude involves giving thanks to someone that is properly due to them. All that we have in life has been given to us in some capacity. Ultimately, all that is good comes from God.

There is much to be grateful for in the Erie area. Presque Isle, the Bayfront, a beautiful spring, summer, and fall, and even the winter which provides for ice-fishing, 2-hour delays, sled-riding and a good snowball fight are worth being grateful for. Splash Lagoon, Tom Ridge Environmental Center, Waldameer, the Zoo, and numerous museums are just a few of many places to be thankful for.

Aquinas saw gratitude as giving thanks to our benefactors and he believed that we are bound to give thanks to every benefactor in our lives in a fitting way. For instance, Aquinas believed that smaller things, such as favors, are best responded to in gratitude by saying “thank you” sooner rather than later.

However, there are times when Aquinas thinks it is best to regard the disposition of the giver (in other words their interior atmosphere) and respond in gratitude at a more meaningful time when the person can best receive the gratitude due to them.



Aquinas thought that the Eucharist has three names. The first name is that of *sacrifice* (Christ’s sacrifice on the cross). The second name is *communion* (the present reality of the Body of Christ, the people, coming together). The third name is *Eucharist* (thanksgiving) because it anticipates the wonderful thanksgiving that is to come in heaven at the Wedding Feast of the Lamb. Therefore, gratitude is at the very heart of the sacrament of the Eucharist.

A pitfall in the spiritual life is to fall to ingratitude from the many riches provided for by God. Aquinas’ advice is to enter more deeply into the prayer of the Our Father, which we pray together at every Mass. In the Our Father, we pray “Give us this day our daily bread.” According to Aquinas, the words “Give us” are a beautiful reminder that all good things come from God and this acknowledgment helps lead us toward gratitude.

Ultimately, gratitude leads the soul to spiritually smile like Rudy Daniels’ joyous smile painted on the Methodist Towers in downtown Erie. There is much to be grateful for in Erie. However, there is much more to be grateful for in the Eucharist which is a great gift that is given to us by our greatest benefactor - who is God.



OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Second Vatican Council - More than Documents

The Second Vatican Council was a remarkable spiritual event. Three years of preparation in small commissions followed by four major sessions beginning October 11, 1962 and concluding December 8, 1965, comprising 168 general congregations in St. Peter's Basilica and numerous committee, subcommittee, and informal meetings hashing through documents and amendments to be voted on by the Council Fathers under the leadership of two popes. Apart from the documents themselves, this multi-year event had a transformative influence on all who participated. A palpable "spirit of the Council" arose that guided and inspired the direction of the proceedings right from Pope Saint John XXIII's opening address. Indeed, his inspiring opening prayer has been repeated at countless Church gatherings in the years since. Vatican II was not merely a deliberative body; it was a solemn spiritual assembly whose voice echoes through every one of the Council's constitutions and decrees, each of which received near-unanimous approval. The spirit of this gathering animated the work of all whose task it was to implement the Council's decisions in the months and early years after its conclusion. Any attempt at interpreting the Council's documents must first take into account this animating spirit and give it due consideration.


