

Family Discussion of the Week: **Commitment**

The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. (Matthew 13:44)

Adults: What would you be willing to "sell," or do without, in order to achieve your dreams for yourself or your family?

Kids: What good thing do you want so much that you would give up something else to get it?

MAKING WISE CHOICES

An old expression admonishes, "Be careful what you wish for." Another one warns about money "burning a hole in your pocket" as you try and determine all the possibilities about how you will spend it. If God were to grant you a wish, what would it be? Our readings are about making wise choices and following God's ways. When Solomon is given this opportunity, he does not make a rash or selfish decision but requests an "understanding heart" so that he might better govern the people with justice. The responsorial psalm is part of a long acrostic poem about the beauty of following God's law. Saint Paul speaks to the Romans about God's master plan, in which we each have a special calling and purpose. The Gospel provides several parables about the kingdom of heaven, and how we might take right action and necessary steps in order to obtain it.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

Dear OLP Family,

Greetings in Christ! I am so excited and grateful to be here! A lot has happened in my life since many of you knew me as the "Danny" or "Dan Hoffman" of years ago when I was a kid growing up in this wonderful parish and attending and graduating from OLP school in 1997. I write this letter to introduce or re-introduce myself to you and for you to get to know me better.

The LORD has been so good to me through all my life. I can't believe how fast the time goes! I just turned 40 this past March and have been a priest now for 14 years! OLP has always been a place of joy, encouragement, and love for me. I grew up in this parish. My priestly vocation was formed in this parish. My love of Jesus and His Church was fostered, increased, and continues to be matured in this parish. My grandparents, John and Patricia Hoffman, were founding members. My dad and mom, Tim and Patty, have been members since they got married. My dad is also an alumnus of OLP School. I have a brother and a sister, Sean and Megan. Both are married and doing very well. My brother and sister-in-law, Lindsey have two children and my sister and brother-in-law have been married for two years now and are excited to begin their family.

Growing up in this parish and school I learned a lot from and benefited from so many wonderful priests. They encouraged me and taught me in varied ways and have passed down to me the gift that the priesthood is. They showed me the gratitude of continually receiving this gift from the LORD and joyfully and generously living it for Jesus and for His people. It is amazing to think that I am now an OLP priest, and I couldn't be happier! Please God, may I carry on that tradition here of holy gratitude and joy and generous love of Jesus and His Church as His priest that was passed down to me. Hopefully, many of our young men from OLP can also follow in this beautiful call of the LORD Jesus and can receive this amazing gift too! Let's all keep praying for vocations...all vocations, to the holy priesthood, to the consecrated life, and to faithful and holy marriage and family life...from our OLP Parish family.

So...where have I been all these years? After graduating from OLP School in 1997 I went to Cathedral Prep, graduating in 2001. My priestly vocation was confirmed in many ways through my high school years; more on that later when I can tell my full vocation story. I began seminary right after high school and then went to St. Mark Seminary while studying at Gannon University. After 4 years I graduated from with a bachelor's degree in philosophy and 4 incredible years of prayer, formation, and fraternity at St. Mark Seminary. During that time, I was also graced to spend a semester in Rome for a study abroad program.

Following my time at St. Mark Seminary, Bishop Trautman assigned me to continue my studies at St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, MD. Here I completed my priestly formation and studies. It was also a very blessed four years where I was able to serve in various parishes in the Baltimore area and in the Diocese as I prepared for my life as a priest. During that time I was blessed to be at St. Agnes Parish in Morrisdale where one of our previous assistants, Fr. Bill Barron, is currently the pastor, and Queen of the World Parish in St. Marys, PA, where Fr. Michael Ferrick was the pastor. While in major seminary in Baltimore I was ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop Trautman on the Feast Day of Saints Philip and James on May 3, 2008.

The best day of my life occurred on June 12, 2009. That's my priesthood ordination day! My classmate, Fr. John Miller, and I were ordained priests forever by Bishop Trautman at St. Peter Cathedral that evening in front of a packed crowd of family, friends, and many brothers and sisters in Christ, many of them were you from OLP. This sacred gift and trust of the priesthood is the greatest gift that I can ever receive this side of Heaven and I will always treasure it as the pearl of great price. I continue to be so overwhelmed and blown away that Jesus would choose me to receive it and to show His love and mercy for the Church and the world in such a beautiful way. I am definitely not worthy of this gift, but I am so grateful, and this gift truly unlocks in me the radiant joy of Christ that He is calling me to have as His son, His disciple, His friend, and His priest.

My first priestly assignment was to be the assistant pastor at St. Michael Parish in Greenville, PA. Though it was only a one-year assignment, it left a great mark in my life. I really love those people and I was with two great priests to continue to help me in friendship and love: Msgr. Andrew Karg, my pastor, and Fr. Paul Schill, the senior associate. After that year I was sent to The Catholic University in America in Washington, DC to continue my studies in Canon Law. Those two years, August 2010 through August 2012, were wonderful. I am very grateful for the knowledge and the degree I earned (a J.C.L., which is a License in Canon Law), but I am more grateful for the experience of priestly ministry I was able to have in D.C. helping at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, assisting at a local parish, and providing priestly ministry to the Missionary of Charity Sisters.

Once I returned to Erie, I began to work at St. Mark Catholic Center in various roles there as vice-chancellor, defender of the bond, and judge in the marriage tribunal. I was also living and assigned as the assistant pastor at St. Luke Parish with Fr. John Malthaner. I became an "east side Crusader" for a time! This was also a blessed assignment. After a year, I received the call from Bishop Persico to become the pastor of Our Lady of the Lake Parish in Edinboro.

My time as pastor of Our Lady of the Lake in Edinboro will always hold a very special place in my heart. It is true that you will never forget the first parish you had the gift of being the pastor at. Jesus provided me here some real stability here and an amazing parish family of great love and joy. This assignment also included being the chaplain of the Campus Ministry Program at Edinboro University (now Penn West). I absolutely loved my ministry to these students and working eventually with FOCUS missionaries (The Fellowship of Catholic University Students). I learned a lot about myself and how to be a better priest and pastor during these nine years at Our Lady of the Lake. When I found out I was being moved I was really devastated and heartbroken to say goodbye to these wonderful people and this great parish. It was here where the greatest part (at least for me) of being a priest was solidified in my heart, and that is the grace and gift of being a spiritual father to so many. I love all my spiritual children and I love being a spiritual father!

Last year, I was assigned as pastor to the Catholic Parishes of Potter and McKean Counties. This included the parishes of St. Eulalia in Coudersport, St. Gabriel the Archangel Parish in Port Allegany, St. Bibiana Parish in Galeton, and the two mission churches

of St. Augustine in Austin and Sacred Heart in Genesee. This was a beautiful assignment with amazing people, but very difficult and overwhelming for me at the same time. Just the amount of territory and locations was very daunting. I gave it a good go though, and I hope and pray that Jesus worked through me there and made a difference in the hearts and souls of my children there too. I love them and Jesus was very good to me through them. They are in great hands now with their new pastor, Fr. Chris Wheeler.

This leads now to one of the best surprises in my priestly life when I found out that Bishop Persico wanted me to come back home and be the assistant pastor here at OLP! I am also assigned my Tribunal duties as a judge and to assist in the Campus Ministry at Penn St. Behrend. It still seems like a dream to me, and I am so grateful! Thank you to Fr. Rich and the OLP Staff for having me. Thank you all for welcoming me with open arms and loving hearts! As your priest what is nearest and dearest to me is offering my spiritual fatherhood to you by giving you God through the reverent and joyful celebration of the sacraments, especially Holy Mass, in being totally available to you as the Father's mercy and love for you in hearing your confessions and offering to you His forgiveness and healing in these sacraments of healing and anointing, and in great joy and conviction without compromise preaching and teaching the whole Truth of the great treasure of our Catholic Faith. I just want to be with you and totally give myself in love to you and to be loved by you.

You will all get to know me more in my time here, but just a few fun facts about me. I have really become a runner and am grateful that I just trained for and finished my first marathon! I can't wait to run another one! I have always loved to hike and go on outdoor adventures. I love to travel and live life to the fullest. I am a huge sports fan. I hope this doesn't disqualify me right off the bat, but I love the Cleveland Browns, the Cleveland Guardians, and the Notre Dame Fighting Irish. I enjoy good music, great movies, and sitting down with a great book.

The greatest love of my life is Jesus Christ! He is my life and my joy, and I am all His and because I am all His I am all yours too. Thank you for allowing me to be your assistant pastor, your priest, and your spiritual father on this journey of ours together to the perfect joy and love of Heaven! The greatest call we all have is to be saint forever in Heaven and I am so blessed to be walking this pilgrimage with you. I love you all very much!

Deacon Luke Daghir Article 5 of 8 on the Eucharist

Editor's Note: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - Year of Parish Revival) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on Mass to Mission, this writing series will help to support both.



Aguinas, Grapes, Wine, and Unity

Lake Erie Wine Country spans some 50 shoreline miles with over 30,000 vineyard acres.

This abundance of vineyards creates the largest grape-growing region found east of the Rocky Mountains. The 50 mile stretch is from Silver Creek, NY to Harborcreek.

In autumn, the smell of grapes in North East and Harborcreek is simply amazing. The view from the vineyard vistas is also breathtaking. Aquinas thought that the beauty of grapes and wine had meaning that is worth considering.

For instance, Aquinas saw the bread and wine utilized in the Eucharist as signifying spiritual eating. In Baptism, water is used to signify spiritual cleansing and rebirth.



It is estimated that between 600-800 grapes are needed to make a bottle of wine. Think of the countless bottles of wine found at the many wineries in the Erie area and just try and visualize the thousands upon thousands of grapes that were needed to make all that wine.

Aquinas thought that this multitude of grapes coming together to form a bottle of wine signified how there are many believers who form one Church. Concerning bread, the same can be applied, for it takes a multitude of grains. For Aquinas, grapes and grain help to signify the coming together into unity which St. Paul had written of: "we, though many, are one body (1 Cor. 10:17)."

Lake Erie provides an astounding environment for growing grapes. In the spring, the cold lake holds off the grapevines from budding too early with the likelihood of frosts. In the fall, the warm lake lengthens the growing season. The lake water has a positive impact on the production of wine. For Aquinas, the addition of water with the wine to be consecrated at the altar has significance



because at the crucifixion of Jesus, both water and blood poured forth from His side (John 19:34).

For Aquinas, these multi-meanings signified in grapes, wine, grain, and water help us to spiritually enter deeper into the mystery of the Eucharist. Next week, across the Diocese of Erie, the Precious Blood will be reintroduced (see the bulletin for more details). May the thought of Aquinas help us to see what is signified in the appearances of bread and wine so as to enter deeper into the reality of the Body and Blood of Christ that brings us into greater unity.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Documents of Vatican II—The Sacred Liturgy

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concilium) is the first document approved by the Council—by a vote of 2.147 to 4 on December 4, 1963. Built on a foundation of strong liturgical and biblical scholarship, Sacrosanctum Concilium proclaims the primary place of the liturgy (the "source and summit") in the life of the Church. In insisting on the central role of the faithful in the celebration of liturgy, the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy set the tone for the rest of the Council, which would continue to address the baptismal dignity and mission of the laity in future documents. The goals of the Constitution were to reinvigorate the Christian life of the faithful, to adapt—where possible—to the needs of today, to encourage the union of all Christian believers, and to promote the mission of the Church to all people. The reforms proposed by Sacrosanctum Concilium would touch the life of every Catholic in profound ways: by emphasizing the importance of sacred scripture, by opening the door to inculturation of the liturgy—especially by its celebration in the native tongue of the people—and by stressing the participation of all believers in the Paschal Mystery (the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ) here and now. The Council could not have started with a stronger message to the Church and the world that the winds of change were blowing through the windows opened by Pope Saint John XXIII. Copyright © J. S. 
