CONFIDENCE IN GOD'S PROMISES

Our readings today explore how faith begins and how faith works. Faith begins with God's initiative of love, together with God's promise about the future. The passage from Hebrews urges readers to have an assured confidence in God, who promised and delivered a lasting legacy to Abraham. The book of Wisdom reminds readers of the God who promised and delivered freedom from slavery during the Exodus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus begins with the promise that "your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom," before describing how to live faithfully during times when God seems absent. God's promises mean that God is fully invested in our future. Living in these promises, we can confidently let go of fear and insecurity. We can anticipate that when God intervenes in our lives, it will be for our benefit. And we can become God's partners in fulfilling these divine promises. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Please keep Deacon Luke Daghir in your prayers as he returns to St. Mary Seminary in Baltimore for his final year of formation in preparation of his ordination to the priesthood in May 2024. August 5th was his last day with us. I was impressed to see all he did at OLP in his 2 months with us. Keep an eye out for his last two articles on the Eucharist that will be coming out as part of his 8-part series to help us get ready for "The One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission" experience in October. I look forward to Deacon Luke returning at Christmas and Easter to celebrate those great feasts with us.

The One Hour to Peace. . . from Mass to Mission fall program is part of the "Year of Parish" Eucharistic Revival that is happening in the Catholic Church throughout the United States. The 3-year Revival ends next summer with a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. We reserved 25 early bird tickets at a cost of \$200 (rather than \$300 that they are now) for this once in a lifetime opportunity. I am working with the Diocese of Erie to help put together a bus trip to the Congress that will eventually offer housing and transportation; for now, though, we need to have commitments for the congress tickets. So, parishioners of OLP have until the end of August to claim the 25 tickets at \$200. Beginning in September, they will be made available to the rest of the diocese on a first come first served basis. Please drop off payment of \$200/ticket at the parish office to claim a ticket(s). Checks should be made out to "OLP" with Eucharistic Congress in the memo line. Claim your ticket at the early bird price of \$200, first come first serve basis, as long as they are available. Then look for more information later this month with details on the housing and transportation package. I will be helping lead the trip so I hope you will consider joining me for the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in the past 83 years.

****Parish Feast Day** I mentioned earlier in the summer that we are officially declaring August 22nd, the Feast of the Queenship of Mary as our parish feast day. There will be a special prayer service at 7pm that night (Tuesday Aug 22nd) to celebrate our feast. There will be more information on the service next weekend but plan to be there.

Bring your chairs/blankets; drinks/popcorn available for purchase. **Special Masses this Week** Monday, August 14th- St. Maximilian Kolbe, Priest, Martyr (died 1941 at Auschwitz by lethal injection; born in Poland; founded Militia of Mary Immaculate; offered his life in exchange for the father of a family {that father attended Maximilian's canonization ceremony}); *Tuesday, August 15th*– The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary; *Wednesday, August 16th*. St. Stephen of Hungry (received the "holy crown" from Pope Sylvester II in 1000,renowned for his charity to beggars); *Thursday, August 17th*- Weekday; *Friday, August 18th*- Weekday; *Saturday, August 19th*- St. John Eudes, Priest (founded in 1643 the Congregation of Jesus and Mary {C.I.M.} for training the clergy, also founded the Sisters of Good Shepherd to assist morally endangered women).

Ernest Ukwueze, Apostles of Divine Charity, Africa, August 12th & 13th** This weekend is our annual mission cooperative and we have the opportunity to learn about and support the mission activities of the Apostles of Divine Charity in Africa. The mission of the Apostles of Divine Charity is centered in its special concern for the poor and the less privileged. They work to make visible and practical the Mercy and the Love of God through the Works of charity and by means of the Corporal Works of Mercy.

Our work in Africa includes: providing education to children and youth who would like to go to school but have no one to support them, providing healthcare services and ministering to orphans and vulnerable children. *How do we do this?* With your financial support we feed the poor, drill for clean water, offer food and clothing to the people, construct schools and vocation training centers, develop youth centers and provide care to the elderly as well as provide training for our Seminarians to do this important work of the gospel.

Deacon Luke Daghir Article 7 of 8 on the Eucharist

Editor's Note: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - Year of Parish Revival) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on *Mass to Mission*, this writing series will help to support both.

Aquinas on Knowing and Loving Erie and the Eucharist

Recently I was at Wegmans and a person was wearing a t-shirt that said, "It's Okay to Love Erie." This is a clever and humorous phrase that can be read differently in July than in January. Aquinas' understanding was that we cannot love what

we do not know. In order to love Eric, one has to know Eric.

The Aquinas, Erie, and the Eucharist series has explored various aspects of Erie such as the Bicentennial Tower, State Street, Presque Isle and its protection of Erie, the many restaurants, the mural on the Methodist Towers, Lake Erie Wine Country, and the Erie sunsets. According to Aquinas, knowing Erie helps one to love Erie more.

Without question, Aquinas had a towering mind that could know things with clarity. However, he also had a heart that was in love with Jesus which increased his desire to know even more.

Early biographers of Aquinas noted that he would make frequent visits to the tabernacle to pray. During these visits, Aquinas would sometimes place his head against the tabernacle. The imagery could not be clearer: the great mind of Aquinas, that knew many things, rested in the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist which ignited in his heart a greater love. Aquinas knew the goodness of the Eucharist which only increased his love for the Eucharist.

Aquinas thought that "love demanded some apprehension of the good that is to be loved." Those from Erie, and those who visit Erie, develop an apprehension of the good of Erie which leads to greater love. The same can be said of the Eucharist in which those who develop an apprehension of the good found in the Eucharist are better able to fall in love with the Eucharist.

In addition, Aquinas also believed that "the contemplation of spiritual beauty or goodness is the beginning of spiritual love." When one contemplates the beauty and

goodness of Eric, love of Eric naturally follows. The same occurs in contemplating the beauty and goodness of the Eucharist in which greater love of the Eucharist follows.

We cannot love what we do not know. May we, with the help of God's grace, come to know more about Eric and the Eucharist and in doing so fall more deeply in love with each. -Deacon Luke Daghir

OUR FASCINATING FAITH The Documents of Vatican II—Divine Revelation

The contemporary biblical scholarship that we now take for granted in homilies that we hear at every Mass received a big boost in the Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (*Dei Verbum*). This document was promulgated on November 18, 1965 after it was approved by a vote of 2,344 to 6. *Dei Verbum* is the logical successor to Pope Pius XII's 1943 encyclical on the interpretation of the Bible. This Constitution starts by exploring the nature of divine revelation-how God reveals what God wants us to know. It calls this revelation the Word of God, and teaches that it comes to us from both sacred scripture and the sacred tradition of the Church. Every baptized Christian can understand the Word of God and apply it to their lives. But it is the special duty of the Church to teach authentic interpretation of this divine revelation, so that scripture, tradition, and the *magisterium* (teaching authority) of the Church are intimately linked. In the light of all this, the Church encourages diligent study of the scriptures, using the best means at our disposal, and in accordance with the mind of the Church. By these means, we will come to know more fully the living Word of God. In its final chapter, Dei Verbum proclaims that the sacred scripture and the Body of Christ are venerated with the same vigor; how we celebrate the Eucharist is the prime example of Word and Sacrament equally honored. Enthusiastic reception of this Constitution unleashed an unprecedented flood of Biblical literacy among the faithful. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Office for the Protection of Children/Youth

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Requirements for working with children - Working alongside the Bishop, the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth reinforces the ongoing implementation of policies and procedures that protect children. All clergy, employees, and volunteers in the Diocese of Erie who work with children must undergo criminal record checks. The diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children and Youth screening guidelines and abuse prevention training programs emphasize the importance of knowing the employees and volunteers who have access to children in our schools and parishes. Parents should remain vigilant in insisting that those with access to their children have gone through an application process and obtained the required clearances and trainings before being granted access to their children.
