The prophet creates an urgency to make a choice: Are we content with the status quo, or are we to change our ways and pursue a new and better path? #### From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed parish feast week to you! Recently we established August  $22^{nd}$ , the Queenship of Mary, as our parish feast day. There are several reasons I proposed this feast date: **One-** It is a universal feast day of Mary that gets overlooked so it helps give more focus to this already established feast. **Two-** It is the 5th Glorious Mystery, the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth, which will give us a greater connection to the Rosary.

**Three-** It is a week after the Assumption of Mary into Heaven (August 15th) and so is the last day of this unofficial "octave of Mary" that happens every August which often gets overlooked (other than the Assumption itself).

**Four-** It provides a spiritual complement to our annual parish picnic which is always the Saturday after Labor Day and has become our biggest communal event of the year.

This year, we will have a **prayer service on Tuesday**, **August 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7pm**. It will include a call to worship summarizing the feast of the queenship of Mary and its connection to Our Lady of Peace; Solemn Evening Prayer; a homily by Fr. Dan Hoffman, our parochial vicar and native son of OLP; a witness by parishioner, Kristin Stravinsky; reciting a decade off the rosary (the 5<sup>th</sup> Glorious Mystery); and singing Marian Hymns.

I also share with you some information on the image of Our Lady of Peace. The image in church is a photograph of the carving in the school entrance. It was framed by the Parish Rosary Society and blessed on December 8, 2022. It has been moved to the sanctuary where it will remain through August  $22^{nd}$ .

#### Image of Our Lady of Peace:

•The picture is based on the sculpture in St. Mary Major Basilica in Rome.

•It was commissioned by Pope Benedict XV in thanksgiving for the end of the First World War and completed by Roman artist Guido Galli in 1918, a marble statue of Mary enthroned is perched high against the wall.

•Beneath the statue is the simple inscription, "Ave Regina Pacis" (Hail, Queen of Peace).

• Mary's left hand is raised up and out to the world in a gesture of "Basta! Enough! Stop the war and violence!"

• In her right arm, she holds Christ depicted as a small child dangling an olive branch, a symbol of peace, waiting for His mother's word to allow it to fall from His fingers and descend to the world.

•A dove, another symbol of peace, sits beside the throne (hidden just out of the frame) preparing to fly, one wing already raised and eyes fixed intently on the branch in Christ's hand.

• Mary's eyes look down, meeting the gaze of the viewer below. • The image conveys a strong sense of the centrality of Mary's intercessory role in the life of the Church: the dove waits for the branch to descend; the branch waits for Christ to release it; Christ waits on the word of His mother.

•The image also invites us into a deeper message of peace: Mary herself waits upon us.

\*\*Missionary Cooperative, Fr. Ernest Ukwueze, Apostles of Divine Charity, Africa, August 12th & 13th Last weekend we had the opportunity to learn about and support the mission activities of the Apostles of Divine Charity in Africa as part of our annual mission cooperative. The mission of the Apostles of Divine Charity is centered in its special concern for the poor and the less privileged. They work to make visible and practical the Mercy and the Love of God through the Works of charity and by means of the Corporal Works of Mercy. Our work in Africa includes: providing education to children and youth who would like to go to school but have no one to support them, providing healthcare services and ministering to orphans and vulnerable children. How do we do this? With your financial support we feed the poor, drill for clean water, offer food and clothing to the people, construct schools and vocation training centers, develop youth centers and provide care to the elderly as well as provide training for our Seminarians to do this important work of the gospel. There will be a special collection this week, August 12th/13th to support the Apostles of Divine Charity. You can also drop off a check at the office, please write "Mission Appeal" in the memo line.



\*\*National Eucharistic Congress The 3-year Eucharistic Revival in the United States culminates next summer with a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis on July 17-21, 2024. OLP reserved 25 early bird tickets at a cost of \$200 (rather than \$300 that they are now) for this once in a lifetime opportunity. As of this writing there are 15 spots available. I am working with the Diocese of Erie to put together a bus trip to the Congress that will eventually offer housing and transportation; for now, though, we need to have commitments for the congress tickets. So, you have until the end of August to claim the 15 remaining tickets at \$200. In September, they will be made available to the rest of the diocese on a first come first served basis. Please drop off payment of \$200/ticket at the parish office to claim a ticket(s). Checks should be made out to "OLP" with Eucharistic Congress in the memo line. Look for more information coming soon with details on the housing and transportation package. I will be helping lead the trip so I hope you will consider joining me for the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in the past 83 years. \*\*Deacon Luke Daghir Please keep Luke in your prayers as he begins his final year of formation in preparation of his ordination to the priesthood in May 2024. I was impressed with all he did at OLP in his 2 months with us. This week is the final week of his 8-part series on the Eucharist in this parish year of the Eucharistic Revival. I look forward to Deacon Luke returning at Christmas and Easter to celebrate with us. **\*\*Parish Library** We have turned my former office into the parish "library." It is available to you during parish office hours. Please check in with the office; they will let you into the library. You can then sign out any book that you would like to borrow (on the sheet in the library) and return it when you are done with it (to the office). This is different than the bookshelf in the office hallway which also has books that you are welcome to borrow but you do not have to sign them out. # Deacon Luke Daghir Article 8 of 8 on the Eucharist

*Editor's Note*: These columns this summer will explore the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas on the Eucharist through nature, landmarks, and other aspects in the Erie area. As the American Church enters deeper into the Eucharistic Revival (stage 2 - Year of Parish Revival) and Our Lady of Peace prepares for the series on *Mass to Mission*, this writing series will help to support both.

#### Aquinas, Tom Ridge Environmental Center, and the Eucharist

The Tom Ridge Environmental Center (TREC) at Presque Isle is an astounding educational facility. The TREC serves in helping one to know more and more about Presque Isle.

Recall last week how the focus was on Aquinas' view that we cannot love what we do not know. Also, how the contemplation of beauty and goodness is the beginning of love. The

TREC has a 75-foot observation tower, four-story high and 45-foot-wide green screen, and numerous interactive exhibits that all contribute to knowing more about the beauty and goodness of Presque Isle.

What the TREC is to Presque Isle, St. Thomas Aquinas is to the Church's understanding of the Eucharist. Aquinas offers prayers, hymns, and other writings about contemplating the beauty and goodness of the Eucharist. In a similar way as it is easy to drive past the TREC, losing sight of its wonderful

resources, so too it can be easy to pass by the teachings of Aquinas on the Eucharist.

Those who have been to the TREC would likely agree that one must go experience Presque Isle for themselves. One must feel the sand, hear the seagulls, listen to the waves

crashing, experience the sunset, see Misery Bay and Horseshoe Pond filled with ice-fishermen and see the ice dunes in the winter, and skip a rock across the water's surface. Presque Isle ought to be felt by our senses which ignites the mind and heart.

Aquinas believed that God provides according to man's condition. In other words, we come to grasp the spiritual and intelligible through our senses. That is why God provides the sacrament of the Eucharist through the sensible means of the appearances of bread and wine. This spiritual food and drink of Jesus' body and blood is presented to us with the appearances of what can assist us to climb the spiritual and intelligible realities of this heavenly nourishment.

Think about visiting the TREC to learn more, or at least to rekindle what is already known about Presque Isle. There are times when we can unintentionally let what is beautiful and good decrease in our minds and hearts because of frequency and proximity. The same

can occur with the Eucharist. May we, in this time of the Eucharistic Revival, come to know and love the Eucharist more through the encounter of the teachings of Aquinas.


