

Family Discussion of the Week: Come, Follow Me

Kids: When has it been difficult to be a follower of Jesus?

FOLLOWING THE PATH OF JESUS

We are invited to reflect on the path of discipleship offered by Jesus in our readings today. Jesus, now seen by the disciples as Messiah and Christ, begins to describe most fully what this means: he will not march into Jerusalem filled with God's power like a conquering general. His path is like that of Jeremiah; he will be rejected and mocked. His path is like that described by Paul, offering his body as a living sacrifice. Jesus summons his followers down the same path of death and resurrection, to live the radical paradox that "whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Loving and trusting God will entail self-surrender, leading us to joy in service to others. Happy Labor Day Weekend! As our country pays tribute to the contributions and achievements of American Workers on this civil holiday, it is also a good time for us as Catholics to pray for the sanctification of human labor (as we believe that work should help sanctify us), to pray for the unemployed who are seeking work to sustain themselves and their families, and to pray that more people in our country will see that our human dignity is affirmed in our work and will seek employment. **OLP Parish Picnic The OLP Raffle winners will be drawn at our parish picnic on Saturday, September 9th so purchase your raffle tickets for your chance at the cash prizes. The picnic starts with an outdoor Mass at 5pm. Dinner will follow around 6/6:15pm, Bingo and Kids Activities at 7pm, Basket Raffle winners and Bonfire at 8:15pm, the drawing of our Grand Prize for our parish raffle at 9pm with fireworks to follow. There will be activities/games for the children and youth and I am excited that local band, Rooftop Project, will be playing music for us again this year from 6:15-8:15pm. These last two years have had the best attendance since I arrived and

many said they reminded them of the energy and excitement of the festival years in the 1970s and 80s... let's keep that energy going through the Holy Spirit!

**The OLP Raffle is the main fundraiser of the parish supporting the work and mission of OLP. If we each do our part, we can reach our goal of 3,800 tickets and continue the good work happening in the parish and our community. That's just (2) tickets for each of the 1,900 registered families. When we all work together, incredible things can happen. Remember for every 10 tickets bought/sold you receive a bonus ticket for all the prize giveaways. **The Lord's Prayer at Mass Over the years questions have been asked about what we are to do at Mass. The Liturgy Committee would like to share some information on "What is the congregation supposed to do during the Our Father?"

The universal norm throughout the world is not to change posture during the Our Father. However, in 2003, the Diocese of Erie recommended worshipers to hold one's hands out (hands out and palms up known as the orans position) during the Our Father. It was clarified in 2003 that holding hands at the Our Father was not the norm or to be expected (families could choose to hold hands but should not impose on others). Also not expected or required was the raising of hands together after the Our Father as the congregation says "for the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever" (which had become a common practice for some).

So, the bottom line for posture during the Our Father is that choosing either option (hand out/palms up or not) is legitimate. If you have any questions on this or want further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me, Fr. Dan or our director of liturgy and music, Brian Kuzmin.

**New School Year and OLP School The new school year has begun; and I want to wish our students, families, teachers, administrators and staff, a blessed and grace-filled new school year! Here are a few updates on the OLP school:

One- Fr. Dan Hoffman will be teaching 8th grade religion this year in tandem with Mary Beth Ek. Also, Fr. Dan is assigned to sacramental duty (chaplain) at Penn State Behrend while remaining the Parochial Vicar here. Please understand that he will not be able to be a part of our Sunday evening activities (although he will be able to celebrate the 4:30pm Mass every so often).

Two- Emily Fluegel, OLP parishioner, has been hired as the new Vice Principal. Please keep Emily in your prayers as she takes on this new position to assist the principal, Shivani Suri.

Three- Lisa Panighetti, also an OLP parishioner, has taken a new position as Vice President of Curriculum for the Erie Catholic School System (ECSS- of which OLP School is part of). Lisa is returning to Erie Catholic School System (she was principal at OLP from 2017-21) after two years working for the Diocesan Catholic Schools Office.

**National Eucharistic Congress The 3-year Eucharistic Revival in the United States culminates next summer with a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis on July 17-21, 2024. OLP reserved 25 early bird tickets at a cost of \$200 (rather than the current \$300) for this once in a lifetime opportunity. I am working with the Diocese of Erie to help coordinate a bus trip to the Congress that will eventually offer housing/transportation. Tickets are available to the whole Diocese on a first-come, firstserved basis. To reserve yours, drop off payment of \$200 per ticket at the parish office. Checks should be made out to "OLP" with Eucharistic Congress in the memo. Look for more info with complete package details. I will be helping lead the trip so I hope you will consider joining me for the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in the past 83 years.



OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Documents of Vatican II—Church Meets World

While the entire Second Vatican Council was convened precisely to bring the Church into conversation with the contemporary world, the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World (Gaudium et Spes) explicitly addresses the subject. Ratified by a vote of 2,309 to 75 and promulgated on December 7, 1965, this document was not foreseen by the planners of the Council. Instead, it grew out of the deliberations on the floor of the first session, and is the only Vatican II document originally drafted in a modern language (French). It is also the first document issued by such a council to address the entire world.

Gaudium et Spes sets out to describe the condition of the peoples of the world, and then recommends ways that the Church can address the issues that confront them. In establishing this dialog between world and Church, it outlines the mission of the Church. If the Church is to fulfill its mission, we must recognize that there is no division between the sacred and the secular. We must make the joys, hopes, sorrows, and anxieties of all peoples our own; we must overcome every type of discrimination; we must heal the rift between science and faith. The hopeful vision of the Constitution on the Church in the Modern World is not the Church against the world, but the Church with the world. Especially in our own divisive days, we must reclaim this hopeful vision and make it our own.

The Documents of Vatican II—More Decrees

The <u>Decree on Appropriate Renewal of Religious Life</u> (*Perfectae Caritatis*) calls on men and women in religious life to rediscover their founding charisms and to adapt with the rest of the Church to the changing times.


The Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity (Apostolicam Actuositatem) is the first document addressing the laity ever to be produced by an ecumenical council, and received the highest degree of support from the Council fathers. It teaches that each layperson has a ministry rooted in his or her baptism, not simply a share of the ministry of the ordained. That is, laypeople are agents of the Church's activity, and not merely objects of it.

The <u>Decree on the Eastern Catholic Churches</u> (*Orientalium Ecclesiarum*) provides the Roman view on the main Eastern Rite Churches and proclaims the equality of the Eastern and Western traditions. It expresses an ardent desire for reconciliation.

The <u>Decree on the Church's Missionary Activity</u> (Ad Gentes) proclaims that the whole church is missionary; each of the baptized has been charged to spread the gospel. It also encourages the embracing of local customs and finding the seed of the gospel within them.

The <u>Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests</u> (*Presbyterorum Ordinis*) calls on priests to support the laity—a ministry not only *for* them but *with* them—and reaffirms celibacy for Latin Rite priests.

The Case for Jesus

Scholars have questioned the historical truth of the Gospels, claiming that they were originally anonymous. Others have even argued that Jesus of Nazareth did not think he was God and never claimed to be divine.

In *The Case for Jesus*, Dr. Brant Pitre, goes back to the sources - the biblical and

historical evidence for Christ - in order to answer several key questions, including:

- ~Were the four Gospels really anonymous?
- ~Are the Gospels folklore? Or are they biographies?
- ~What about the so-called "Lost Gospels," such as "Q" and the Gospel of Thomas?

Pitre shows how the divine claims of Jesus of Nazareth can only be understood by putting them in their ancient Jewish context.




