Second Reading - Whether we live, or whether we die, we do so for the Lord (Romans 14:7-9). **Gospel** - Forgive one another from your heart (Matthew 18:21-35).

Family Discussion of the Week: **Forgiveness and Mercy** Then Peter came and said to him, "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21-22) **Adults:** When someone hursts you, how do you forgive them? **Kids:** When have you forgiven someone who treated you unfairly?

MISSING THE POINT

"You missed the point," we might be tempted to shout at the servant in today's Gospel. His master had just forgiven a huge debt when he cried for mercy, and yet, when given the opportunity to show mercy himself, he instead acted violently and with retribution toward a fellow servant. Certainly, he had missed the point of his master's merciful actions toward him, and suffered the consequences as a result. He missed the point. He is not alone, however. We all "miss the point" sometimes—we miss the point of God's enduring covenant of love, and miss the mark in our call to live as though we are the Lord's, for this is who we are. God's love is always about what is just and right. As God's people, we are to live and die for the Lord, forgive even when it doesn't make sense to do so, and leave the rest in God's hands. From the Pastor's Desk...

Hopefully you received a letter from me last week inviting you to "The One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission." I truly believe this can be a transformative experience for our parish community. But we know transformation is only possible through God's grace and the work of the Holy Spirit; and we also know that God's grace and the Holy Spirit work much more powerfully in an environment of prayer and intentional seeking.

As we near The One Hour to Peace mission, I am asking everyone in the parish to join in prayer for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit and openness of hearts. We will begin with a day of prayer on Monday, September 18th from 7am-7pm; which includes Votive Masses (Mass with special readings) to the Holy Spirit, all-day Eucharistic Adoration and ends with a Holy Hour at 6:30pm. All focused on prayer for "The One Hour to Peace... From Mass to Mission."

We continue that prayer with a parish wide novena beginning on Friday, September 22nd as well as Masses that day will be offered for "A Spiritual Gathering." The Novena will be prayed publicly after the Angelus daily in the church and will be livestreamed on our parish YouTube channel as well. A copy of the Novena will be sent in our e-newsletter, copies will be available in the church or follow along each day on our Facebook page. The novena ends on Saturday, September 30th. On the weekend of September 30th/October 1st we will celebrate Votive Masses (Mass with special readings) to the Eucharist at all of our weekend Masses.

I cannot stress enough how important this prayer will be for the success of our parish experience with The One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission. I encourage you to make every effort to participate in this prayer and show your support on the prayer wall in the vestibule. All are invited to place an "I prayed today" tag on the prayer wall after praying for The One Hour to Peace mission. I am excited to see how God will use all of this to draw us deeper into His love and mission.

The Mass will include a special blessing for all those who work with the sick so please come if that's you and please help us get the word out. **Becoming Catholic/ New RCIA Year RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is the program through which adults become members of our Catholic faith through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). We are just beginning our study for this year, if you are interested in becoming Catholic, please contact Tammie Mang at 814-838-9983, Fr. Dan or myself at the parish office. ****Posture after Holy Communion** The 2003 decree states, they [the faithful], should kneel ...after the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) unless the Diocesan Bishop determines otherwise," In 2003, the then Bishop of Erie, the Most Reverend Donald W. Trautman, determined that the faithful in the Diocese of Erie would stand instead of kneel after the Agnus Dei and throughout the Communion Rite. Many parishes throughout the Diocese and US returned to the practice of kneeling as it can be increasingly difficult for many parishioners to stand for long periods of time during the distribution of Holy Communion. In October 2021, the Most Reverend Lawrence T. Persico formally changed the practice for the Diocese of Erie to return to the practice approved by the Holy See to kneel at Mass following the conclusion of the Agnus Dei. Those who receive Holy Communion may, upon returning to their place, either kneel or sit according to their choice until the beginning of the prayer after Communion, at which time all stand."

****Sprinkling Rite and Incense at Sunday Masses** The Liturgy Committee has reviewed the General Instruction for the Roman Missal (GIRM) which is the guiding document for all Catholics regarding the celebration of Mass, we have decided to incorporate two other practices during Ordinary Time. <u>ONE</u>- the first Sunday of the month we will celebrate the sprinkling rite at all Masses. We have generally done the sprinkling rite during the Easter Season. But the GIRM reminds us that it is appropriate to do it throughout the year to reinforce that our participation in EVERY Mass is really a renewal of our baptismal covenant with God where we are made new in Christ through the great mercy of the Father and the healing power of the Holy Spirit.

<u>TWO</u>- the third Sunday of each month we will use incense at our main "high" Masses (9am and 11am). We have used incense during the Christmas and Easter Octaves and at Pentecost and Christ the King (as well as a few other special times) as a way to reinforce the full solemnity of those great days in our liturgical calendar. But again, the GIRM invites the use of incense at any Mass which reminds us of the grandeur and importance of Mass on every Sunday.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Second Vatican Council and the Church Today

In the fifteenth chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, we read of what became known as the "Council of Jerusalem," which addressed the Christian communities of Gentile origin in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia. The letter proclaiming the results of that council's deliberations begins, "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us." Thus it is with every council of the Church. The "spirit of Vatican II" is none other than the Holy Spirit—Pope Francis in April 2013 called the Council "a beautiful work of the Holy Spirit." So while you might perhaps see one parish or another promote itself as a "Vatican II parish," in truth every parish must be a Vatican II parish.

Because we are human, implementation of any council of the Church takes time, and that of Vatican II will continue to move in fits and starts. There will be differences over the meaning and application of some of the Council's decisions for years to come. But those near-unanimous votes (by thousands of bishops!) made each document the law of the Church. When in doubt we can always consult with the Holy Spirit at whose inspiration the Second Vatican Council was convened, and under whose guidance its conclusions were reached. Copyright © J. S. Why do we go to Mass:

When we go to Mass, "we are truly – not metaphorically – standing at the foot of the Cross on Calvary, in the presence of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, who died once and for all for our salvation. When the priest elevates the host at the consecration, Christ looks out at us – at each of us, there present before Him – from Golgotha."

It is a breathtaking mystery that is made present on *every* Catholic altar *every single day of the year*-except Good Friday. Christ Jesus IS physically with us at every Mass. He is real, He is alive, and He stands before us, body, blood, soul and divinity shrouded behind the appearance of bread and wine, but substantially present in them. 


