## Sunday's Readings:

**Entrance Antiphon** - He fed them from the fat of the grain, / and he satisfied them with honey from the rock, / Alleluia. / Rejoice in God our help, / be joyful in the God of Jacob.

**First Reading** - Strengthen by that food, he walked to the mountain of God (1 King 19:4-8).

**Psalm** - The Lord gave them bread from heaven (Psalm 78).

**Second Reading** - For as often as you eat the bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord. (1 Cor 11:23-26).

Gospel - They recognized him in the breaking of the bread. (Luke 24:13-35).

#### Family Discussion of the Week: **The Challenge to Forgive** A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not;" but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir;" but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father? They said, "The first." (Matthew 21:28-31) *Adults:* When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?

Kids: Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?

## THE MYSTERY OF MERCY

For the past several weeks, the word of God has drawn us into the mystery of mercy. Today's readings deepen our reflection, reminding us how blessed we are to know God's kindness and sharing practical ways to show compassion to others. The prophet Ezekiel cautions God's chosen people, emphasizing that bad behavior naturally leads to painful consequences. The psalm responds prayerfully: "Remember your mercies, O Lord." In this prayer, we ask for the mercy of recognizing our sins and receiving the strength to act differently. In his letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul invites us into a daunting challenge of mercy: "humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." If we scoff at Paul's challenge as impossibly naïve, the Gospel gives us a chance to reconsider. Our natural instincts of self-preservation might reject merciful behavior initially, but like the son in today's Gospel of mercy, we can change our minds.

#### From the Pastor's Desk...

This weekend is the kickoff for "The One Hour to Peace... from Mass to Mission" here at Our Lady of Peace Parish. To bring more focus and intentionality to our prayer for this great formation experience we are celebrating the Votive Mass (Mass with special readings) for the Eucharist at all Masses this weekend. It is not too late to be a part of this first week of sessions. Even if you have not signed up or cannot make all five sessions, just come when you can.

I would like to share with you part of the pastoral letter that the US Bishops wrote back in November 2021 called **"The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church."** I hope to share parts of this letter throughout the rest of the Eucharistic Revival in the United States (June 2022-June 2025).

"As we continue to welcome people back to the communal celebration of the Mass, it must be acknowledged that no document (or formation program like 'The One Hour to Peace from Mass to Mission'- Fr. Rich's addition) can exhaust the mystery of the gift of the Eucharist. Nevertheless, at various times, it is desirable to reflect on certain facets of the mystery that are relevant to contemporary issues and challenges and that help us to appreciate more deeply the gift of grace that has been given to us. At this particular moment for the Church in the United States, with its many challenges, we would like to reflect on Christ's gift of himself in the Eucharist and our response to that gift."

THE GIFT - At the Mass of the Lord's Supper celebrated on Holy Thursday, the priest prays these words: "For he is the true and eternal Priest, who instituted the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice and was the first to offer himself as the saving Victim, commanding us to make this offering as his memorial. As we eat his flesh that was sacrificed for us, we are made strong, and, as we drink his Blood that was poured out for us, we are washed clean."

The words of the liturgy on the night the Church commemorates the institution of the Eucharist speak to us of the Mass as the re-presentation of Christ's unique sacrifice on the Cross, the reception of Christ truly present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist, and the marvelous effects of communion in those who receive this gift."

## OUR FASCINATING FAITH St. Francis of Assisi (October 4)

Francis was born in 1882 in Assisi, Italy, into the Bernardone family, wealthy merchants engaged in the cloth trade. At the age of twenty he joined the army; after a failed expedition he was captured and suffered a complete breakdown. During his recovery he began to discover God in ordinary life. His encounters with God in the contemplation of nature grew more and more frequent, and he realized that true wealth is in heaven. He began giving away his possessions—and his father's—to the poor. This so enraged his father that he beat Francis and brought him before the bishop. There, Francis stripped naked, renounced his father's goods, and declared that God alone was now his father. Heeding a vision in which he was called by God to "Repair my house," Francis went to rebuild a small church called the Portiuncula. Over time, he was given to understand that what God desired was a spiritual rebuilding of the Church. This call he heeded as well, ultimately founding the Order of Friars Minor (Franciscans) and contributing greatly to the renewal of the universal Church. Francis embodied the essence of living poor in order to embrace the poor. He died in 1226 at the age of forty-four, carrying on his body the stigmata of Christ's passion. ---Miguel Arias, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

# respect life

In the Gospel of John, shortly before he is to suffer his Passion, Jesus proclaims to his disciples: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn 13:34). And it is love for one another that Jesus says will be the identifying characteristic of his disciples.

The Church's entire social doctrine is guided by the fundamental principle that every human life has innate dignity and incomparable value: "Every human being is the object of God's infinite tenderness, and he himself is present in their lives."[1] As disciples of Christ, we are called to make a sacrificial gift of ourselves for the sake of our neighbor, for "to love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it."[2]

Fulfilling Christ's command to love one another takes shape in our practice of solidarity. Solidarity is the means by which we put our love for others into action, making the good of others our own. Solidarity "is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people… On the contrary, it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good…to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all."[3]

## PRAYER FOR RADICAL SOLIDARITY

O Blessed Mother, at the angel's word you went in haste to the aid of your cousin Elizabeth. Although pregnant yourself, you placed her needs before your own. By your example of radical solidarity, teach us to reverence and protect those in need, without conditions or expectations. Ask your Son to give us unfailing determination to witness to the profound dignity of every person, at every stage and in every circumstance. In that first Eucharistic procession, you carried Jesus to Elizabeth in her time of need. Obtain for us the grace to bring Christ to any expectant mother who is alone and afraid.

May our support help them to find hope and strength in the Lord. Amen.




