CHOOSE LIFE

Today's first reading, psalm, and Gospel concentrate heavily on vineyards. For those of us who don't drink wine or have never set foot in a vineyard, these scriptures may seem inaccessible. But if we consider the tremendous importance of wine to the ancient world, we hear the scriptures asking us to make a life-ordeath decision. Choosing death means forsaking our relationship with God and taking upon ourselves all the anxiety of faithlessness. Choosing life means paying attention to the kingdom of God on earth, striving to pursue "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious." Today's vineyard metaphors invite us to identify our highest priority in life and tend to it. If we ask, God will help us order our lives correctly so we are free to cultivate our vineyards in love.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

As our parish makes our way through the parts of the Mass each week in our "The One Hour to Peace from Mass to Mission," I would like to reinforce some of the points of emphasis here in my bulletin article.

Last week's session focused on the Introductory Rites at Mass. The three main points of emphasis are:

ONE- The Procession for Mass begins at home. Prompted by the Holy Spirit, every person who will be a part of the Mass begins their procession at home or wherever they are coming from. They make a choice to leave their present activities or rest to gather with their spiritual family to enter into this most substantial continuation of the Incarnation that the world knows. They come to enter into the greatest prayer known to humanity where they will engage in all types of verbal prayer (ACTS- Adoration, Contrition, Thanksgiving and Supplication (Includes Intercession for others and Petition for self)). They come to renew their covenant relationship with God. They come to thank God for the past week's graces and seek forgiveness for the past week's transgressions. They come to ask God's inspiration and grace for the week ahead where they will seek "to glorify Lord by their life." They come to gather with a community that needs their support and prayer and presence, and a community who's support, love and prayer they also need. This point encourages us to consider how we can better enter into this procession from home and when we enter the threshold of the church, to leave behind the distractions, concerns, challenges and just business of life and so allow ourselves to be as present to God and the community that gathers in the present moment as we can.

The gathering of the congregation brings up a challenging dimension of the gathering rites- that it is a moment to prayerfully prepare ourselves to encounter God and to commune with the Mystical Body of Christ that is the church which most people prefer silence AND it is a moment to gather as community and to recognize Christ in each other which requires talking and fellowship. Most of us probably prefer one of these options but we have to try to create an atmosphere that respects and appreciates both.

TWO- the Four Main Places Christ is Present at Mass.

I. In the Congregation that gathers. We have all been given new birth in Christ in our baptism and become temples of the Holy Spirit so Christ is present in each of us.

2. In the Presider at Mass who uniquely brings the person of Christ to us as he leads the community in offering the prayer of the Mass with Christ the Son to the Father through the Holy Spirit.

3. In the Word of God proclaimed. God speaks to us and is present to us in the Word and we have the challenge to have the eyes and ears to see and hear Him there.

4. In the Eucharist Christ is truly and most substantially present. It is not that the others are not real, BUT we call this the "real presence" because it is the fullest sense of Christ's presence. It is the SUBSTANTIAL SENSE which is philosophically like the soul that part of something that animates it or makes it what it is.

THREE- the Congregation is called to "full and active participation" at the Mass. This was a point of emphasis at Vatican II, the last ecumenical council of the Catholic Church that took place from 1962-65. Prior to Vatican II, some

thought that the congregation had become more of spectator rather than a participant. We are not at Mass to just watch the prayer or quietly observe, but rather to actively enter into each moment by prayer, song, active listening and making the prayers of the mass our own through intentionality and focus.

Remember that it is not too late to be a part of this first week of sessions. You do not have to register and if you cannot make all 5 sessions over the next 5 weeks just come when you can.

May God continue to bless "The One Hour to Peace... From Mass to Mission"... and the rest of our week ahead! Fr. Rich

- **The Annual Rosary March is Sunday, October 8th at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral. Recall that October is the month of the Rosary and all are encouraged to learn more about this powerful devotion and the great intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary and to commit to praying it throughout this month.

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021 Paragraph 9- "The mission of the Lord's entire life on earth was to glorify the Father by bringing us salvation. In the Nicene Creed recited at Mass, we profess "For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." The salvation offered in the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Christ is nothing less than sharing in the very life of God, in the communion of love among the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. There is no greater gift that God could possibly give us. In Christ, we are sharers in the divine nature (2 Pt 1:4). The Church Fathers referred to this participation in the divine life as "divinization." The eternal Son of God made this possible by becoming man and uniting humanity to his divine Person. St. Augustine explained, "the maker of man was made man, so that man might be a receiver of God." In fact, Pope Francis reminds us that "in the bread of the Eucharist, 'creation is projected towards divinization, towards the holy wedding feast, towards unification with the Creator himself."

Fruit of the Second Vatican Council: The Synod

October 11 is the anniversary date of the opening of the Second Vatican Council and the feast day of Pope St. John XXIII. One of the fruits of Vatican II appeared immediately after the Council, in Pope St. Paul VI's establishment of the Synod of Bishops as a way to keep alive the experience of the Second Vatican Council. "Synod" (pronounced "SIN-id") is a word based on Greek roots meaning "coming together." Paul VI instituted the Synod of Bishops as a way of consulting with the bishops of the world on important matters. Since 1965 the Synod has been gathered by popes eighteen times.

Pope Francis has expressed a special interest in developing this idea of consultation as a model for the Church. "A synodal Church is a Church which listens," he has said. He has engaged the Synod of Bishops in these conversations, broadened and deepened the consultation that takes place in their deliberations, and given added weight to the documents they produce. Now, in preparation for the 2023 "Synod on Synodality," Pope Francis solicited input from all the dioceses around the world well before the bishops met to address the question about how to make the Church more synodal—more collaborative—in the long term: How can we become a Church that "walks together"? You should have received an invitation from your bishop and pastor to participate over a year ago. This autumn, it will be fascinating to see the outcome of all this input from around the world. In the Gospel of John, shortly before he is to suffer his Passion, Jesus proclaims to his disciples: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn 13:34). And it is love for one another that Jesus says will be the identifying characteristic of his disciples.

The Church's entire social doctrine is guided by the fundamental principle that every human life has innate dignity and incomparable value: "Every human being is the object of God's infinite tenderness, and he himself is present in their lives."[1] As disciples of Christ, we are called to make a sacrificial gift of ourselves for the sake of our neighbor, for "to love someone is to desire that person's good and to take effective steps to secure it."[2]

Fulfilling Christ's command to love one another takes shape in our practice of solidarity. Solidarity is the means by which we put our love for others into action, making the good of others our own. Solidarity "is not a feeling of vague compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people... On the contrary, it is a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good...to the good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all."[3]

PRAYER FOR RADICAL SOLIDARITY

O Blessed Mother, at the angel's word you went in haste to the aid of your cousin Elizabeth. Although pregnant yourself, you placed her needs before your own. By your example of radical solidarity, teach us to reverence and protect those in need, without conditions or expectations. Ask your Son to give us unfailing determination to witness to the profound dignity of every person, at every stage and in every circumstance. In that first Eucharistic procession, you carried Jesus to Elizabeth in her time of need. Obtain for us the grace to bring Christ to any expectant mother who is alone and afraid.

May our support help them to find hope and strength in the Lord. Amen.






