

Kids: Who needs help in your neighborhood or community? What could you and your family do to help?

NEVER LOSE HOPE

God's word speaks to our hearts today, acknowledging the sad fact that we lose hope at times, and encouraging us to trust in the Lord. Isaiah speaks of God's astonishing plan to use Cyrus, a Persian king, to deliver God's people from exile. After generations in captivity, the Israelites take new hope in this unexpected plan and praise God's might. Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians encourages Christ's followers there to remain faithful to their call. Never tiring, they continue their "labor of love and endurance in hope." The Gospel relates a heartbreaking reality in Christ's ministry: plots to humiliate and capture Jesus. Knowing their treacherous plans, Jesus does not despair. He remains faithful to God and persists in his own labor of love.

Happy Mission Sunday! In 1926 Pope Pius XI instituted Mission Sunday for the whole Church with the first worldwide Mission Sunday collection taking place in October 1927. The Mission Sunday collection is taken on the next to last Sunday during the month of October. WORLD MISSION SUNDAY joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass that Sunday, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism to be missionaries, through prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This year Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday reflects on the theme: "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). He reminds us that, "as Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves," as we "recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel." On World Mission Sunday, we join our Holy Father in supporting his missions. As we pray and respond here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions. In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each one of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.

May God bless World Mission Sunday and the rest of our week ahead!

We will also continue the prayer for peace with a Novena for peace, praying daily from October 25-November 2nd at Noon. Join us in person or follow along on Facebook daily.

- **Special Masses this Week Monday, Oct. 23rd- St. John of Capistrano, Priest (15th Century Franciscan Reformer); Tuesday, Oct.24th— St. Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop (19th Century Reformer Bishop in Cuba); Wednesday, Oct. 25th- Mass in Time of War and Civil Disturbance; Thursday, Oct. 26th- Mass for Persecuted Christians; Friday, Oct. 27th- Mass for Those in Prison; Saturday, Oct. 28th- Sts. Simon and Jude, Apostles.
- **Respect Life Month October is Respect Life Month in the US Catholic Church and so we pray for the recognition of the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death. Typically in our Catholic Social Justice Teaching we have a particular concern for life that is the most vulnerable- the unborn, the elderly, the imprisoned, the poor, those with mental illness, those will special needs, immigrants, the homeless. Please keep this intention in mind in a special way this month. U.S. Bishops' Pro-Life Chairman asks for "Radical Solidarity" with Mothers. This year, Bishop Michael F. Burbidge of Arlington, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities invites Catholics to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Respect Life Month by embracing "radical solidarity" with women facing difficult or challenging.
- **All Souls Day Memorial Service The memorial service for All Souls Day will be held on Friday, November 3rd at 7pm this year. We pray for all those who have died and had funeral services through Our Lady of Peace over the past year. We always welcome also praying for and with our parish families who have lost loved ones in the last year whose funerals were not at OLP. Any parishioners of OLP can notify the office if your spouse, parent or child died since last November 2nd and we will include them by name in our service and make a candle for them. The deadline to let us know is Monday, Oct. 23rd.
- **NOTES FROM "The One Hour to Peace from Mass to Mission" WEEK 3- On the first part of the Liturgy of the Eucharist:
- I. THE ONE HOUR TO PEACE....
 - -Communion with God is the greatest source of peace that is beyond all understanding which this world cannot give.
 - -The Mass is the most significant experience of Communion with God and the community of the Mystical Body of Christ which is the Church.
 - -THEREFORE the Mass is the One Hour to Peace.
- II. "Eucharist"- from Greek word which means "thanksgiving"
 -In the Preface Dialogue is the most explicit prayer of thanksgiving in the Mass
 - -"Let us give thanks to the Lord our God"... "It is right and just!"
- -"It is truly right and just, our DUTY AND OUR SALVATION, ALWAYS AND EVERYWHERE to give you thanks"

III. Preparation of the Gifts

- -Collection/Procession- reinforces the congregation's participation in the offering/sacrifice
 - -bringing fruit of their labor- bread and wine, money -but also the sacrifices in their lives and of their entire
 - -Every Mass is a renewal of our covenant relationship with God.
 - -He gives himself perfectly and completely to us in Christ at every Mass especially His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.
 - -We give ourselves, our lives, our struggles, our sweat, our tears, our joys imperfectly to Him- ALL represented by the gifts.
- -Priest invites Congregation to reinforce this... "Pray Brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father."
- -Congregation responds... "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all his holy church." The congregation gives the presider permission to offer the sacrifice for and with them.
- -As the priest prepares the gifts and mingles the water in the wine he says inaudibly- "By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."
 - -The purpose of Mass and our entire relationship with God is to be divinized- to be made more and more like God and that is only made possible by God becoming one of us. IT IS THIS TRANSFORMATION THAT ALLOWS US TO EXPERIENCE THE PEACE OF CHRIST!

IV. "Sanctus"

- -the prayer of thanksgiving of the presider in the Preface as well as the reminder of why we give thanks in the prayer compels the congregation to praise God with the angels and the saints in the Holy Holy
- -One of the oldest and most significant prayers in Christianity (400 AD)
- -Reminds us that every Mass is a union of Heaven and Earth
- -Comes from Isaiah 6:3 (Vision of Isiah), Rev. 4:8 and Matthew 21:9 (triumphant entry into Jerusalem)
- **Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021 Paragraph 15-16- "15. The Eucharist is a sacrificial meal, "the sacred banquet of communion with the Lord's body and blood." Its fundamental pattern is found in the Jewish celebration of the Passover, which involves both a meal and a sacrifice. The Passover meal is celebrated in remembrance of the Exodus, when the Israelites were told to sacrifice a lamb to the Lord and to mark the doorposts of their houses with the blood, so that the angel of death would pass over their houses and leave the Israelites unharmed. This marked a people set apart and chosen by God as his special possession. Each family was then to eat the lamb with unleavened bread as a reminder of the haste with which the Israelites had to prepare for their departure from Egypt and with bitter herbs as a reminder of their deliverance from slavery. At the Last Supper, Jesus reveals himself to be

the Paschal Lamb ("Behold the Lamb of God") whose sacrifice brings liberation from slavery to sin and whose blood marks out a new people belonging to God. All the sacrifices in the Old Testament prefigure and find their fulfillment in the one perfect sacrifice of Jesus. 16. The saving work of Jesus Christ, which has brought to fulfillment what was announced in figure in the Passover, is now re-presented in the celebration of the Eucharist. The Eucharist "makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior." As Pope St. John Paul II taught: "The Church constantly draws her life from [this] redeeming sacrifice; she approaches it not only through faith-filled remembrance, but also through a real contact, since this sacrifice is made present ever anew, sacramentally perpetuated, in every community which offers it at the hands of the consecrated minister."

**Quotes from the Saints on the Mass/ Eucharist

- St. Peter Julian Eymard: "Know, O Christian, that the Mass is the holiest act of religion. You cannot do anything to glorify God more, nor profit your soul more, than by devoutly assisting at it, and assisting as often as possible."
- St. John Vianney: "Martyrdom is nothing in comparison with the Mass, because martyrdom is the sacrifice of man to God, whereas the Mass is the Sacrifice of God for man!"
- **St. Lawrence Justinian:** "No human tongue can enumerate the favors that trace back to the Sacrifice of the Mass. The sinner is reconciled with God; the just man becomes more upright; sins are wiped away; vices are uprooted; virtue and merit increases; and the devil's schemes are frustrated."


Dear OLP families,

OUR FASCINATING FAITH Mission Month

Today we observe World Mission Sunday. In addition to being the month of the Rosary, October is devoted to the missions. During this month in 1492 the secular Franciscan Christopher Columbus brought the first Christians to the American continent. Various missionary saints such as Francis of Assisi, Paul of the Cross, and Teresa of the Child Jesus are commemorated during this month. Another October saint, Antonio María Claret, was Bishop of Cuba and founder of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (the Claretians).

All of our American countries were evangelized by religious missionaries as well as priests and lay women and men who left their families in Europe in order to dedicate themselves to serve our native and *mestizo* populations by bringing them the word of God. In time, new Christians also helped these foreign missionaries in their work. People like Juan Diego, Rose of Lima, and Martin de Porres responded to the call of Jesus, who asked us to take the Good News to all nations.

A missionary is not necessarily someone who leaves home to preach the gospel to others abroad. True missionaries unite their lives to the mission of Jesus by living the gospel whether at home, at work, in the parish, or if God asks, in other lands.




