

GOD'S LAW AND GOD'S LOVE

The secret to our Sunday readings today lies in the Gospel Acclamation: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him" (John 14:23). That single line from John's Gospel gets right to the heart of today's readings, reminding us of the intimate relationship between the law ("keeping God's word") and God's love. While human nature tends to resist burdensome rules, our readings show us the wisdom of God's plan that guides us with the rule of law. In Exodus, the law boldly prevents injustice, protecting the most vulnerable members of society. In Thessalonians, the law elevates our behavior and saves us from "the coming wrath." In Matthew's Gospel, the law swaddles us in God's compassion. In loving God, neighbor, and self, we imitate God and bring blessing to a fractured world.

"The One Hour to Peace from Mass to Mission" Update: When we began planning for this community wide formation experience, I set a goal of getting 500 people from our community to be a part of it. If everyone who signed up for the one-day session on November 4th attends, we will have reached approximately 425 participants (not including the school and faith formation youth who are participating and would bring the total over 1,000). I knew that it was an incredible goal, but wanted to share it as is the level of commitment the team has. There is still time for you, too, to make a commitment to be a part of this movement. Now that we are this close to the goal, I would love to see 100 or more attend the one-day retreat option this week on November 4th. Attending one session could be the start of a new experience of Jesus and His Church for someone who is searching, struggling, or just needing a jump start in their relationship with God. You can be that jump start when you invite someone to The One Hour to Peace, leading someone closer to God and the eternal life with Him!

- **This weekend we have the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick as part of the I I am Mass. In this sacrament we pray for healing for those receiving the sacrament as well as the grace to "suffer well." We pray to be strengthened in the virtue of hope so the cross of our sickness does not tempt us to despair. Remember, this sacrament is NOT FOR EVERYONE but for those who fit in one of the following categories:
- those who are dangerously ill through sickness or old age (physical or psychological)
- a sick person...before surgery whenever the surgery is necessitated by a dangerous illness
- elderly people...if they are weak, though not dangerously ill
- sick children...sufficiently mature to be comforted by the sacrament

sick people who have lost consciousness or who have lost the use of reason...if they would have requested it had they been in possession of their faculties.

Of course, if a sick person who received this anointing recovers his/her health, he/she can in the case of another serious illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may also be repeated. If this applies to you or someone you know, join us for this special Mass of healing and grace. Please arrive early so you can sign in. All are encouraged to join us as we pray with and for those in our community who are carrying the cross of significant physical or psychological illness.

**Quotes from USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

Paragraph 21- "The reality that, in the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ without ceasing to appear as bread and wine to our five senses is one of the central mysteries of the Catholic faith. This faith is a doorway through which we, like the saints and mystics before us, may enter into a deeper perception of the mercy and love manifested in and through Christ's sacramental presence in our midst. While one thing is seen with our bodily eyes, another reality is perceived through the eyes of faith. The real, true, and substantial presence of Christ in the Eucharist is the most profound reality of the sacrament. "This mysterious change is very appropriately called by the Church transubstantiation." Though Christ is present to us in many ways in the liturgy, including in the assembly gathered, the presiding minister, and the word proclaimed, the Church also clearly affirms that "the mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique." As St. Paul VI wrote, "This presence is called 'real' not to exclude the idea that the others are 'real' too, but rather to indicate presence par excellence, because it is substantial and through it Christ becomes present whole and entire, God and man." In the sacramental re-presentation of his sacrifice, Christ holds back nothing, offering himself, whole and entire. The use of the word "substantial" to mark the unique presence of Christ in the Eucharist is intended to convey the totality of the gift he offers to us."

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

Day of the Dead (All Souls Day - November 2)

During the month of October, Mexico and other Latin American countries prepare for the celebration of All Saints Day (November 1) and All Souls Day (November 2). In these countries, these two feasts are a mixture of ancient Christian rites and Meso-American devotions. They assert that death is a natural part of the cycle of life and that the deceased are not forgotten by their loved ones. This is the basis of the Catholic devotion to the saints: God is God of the living and not the dead (Matthew 22:32).

At the end of October and the beginning of November, families spend time in the cemetery, visiting the graves of their relatives and friends, washing the headstones, placing bouquets of marigolds, and lighting candles. This custom is similar to that of the Christian Romans who did the same with the tombs of martyrs and relatives in the catacombs.

Often we cannot go back to the graves of our loved ones, so the custom of the altars of the dead has become important in our churches and homes. Many Latinos construct and adorn small altars and dedicate them to the souls of their loved ones who have died. On the altars are found decorated colored paper, photographs of the deceased, religious articles, food, drink, and other things that the deceased enjoyed during their lives. These altars are testimony to the fact that deceased Christians do not forget us and we do not forget them either. The love of God unites us forever.


