Discipleship is not about seeking places of honor or titles of esteem. Rather, Jesus' followers are to focus on humble service. **Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

<u>Paragraph 22-23</u>- "When the Eucharist is distributed and the minister says, "the Body of Christ," we are to look not simply at what is visible before our eyes, but at what it has become by the words of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit—the Body of Christ. The communicant's response of "Amen" is a profession of faith in the Real Presence of Christ and reflects the intimate personal encounter with him, with his gift of self, that comes through reception of Holy Communion.

The Church's firm belief in the Real Presence of Christ is

reflected in the worship that we offer to the Blessed Sacrament in various ways, including Eucharistic Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction; Eucharistic Processions; and Forty Hours Devotions. In addition, the practices of reverently genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, bowing one's head prior to the reception of Holy Communion, and refraining from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Communion are clear manifestations of the Church's Eucharistic faith."

OUR FASCINATING FAITH The Basilica of St. John Lateran

The solemnity that we celebrate every November 9, the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, honors the Roman Catholic Church's "mother church," the pope's diocesan home church. No, not St. Peter's Basilica! Rather, on one of Rome's seven hills stands the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome, the Basilica of Saint John Lateran. Since this church is the pope's diocesan cathedral, it is significant in the history of Catholicism, and the commemoration of its dedication is a solemnity observed in all the Roman Catholic churches around the world. The engraving over its east entrance reads, "Mother and Head of All Churches in the City and throughout the World." Attached to the basilica is a large baptistry, whose inscription reminds us of our universal call to holiness: "Think not your sins too many or too great: birth in this stream is birth to holiness." As we celebrate the commemoration of the dedication of this great church, let us be one with all who have been born to new life in the waters of Holy Baptism. 
