Kids: What are some surprising ways in which you meet Christ in your daily life?

CONSEQUENCES

Actions have consequences. As children, we were often told that if we would do something, then we would receive a present or a reward. If we didn't, it might result in a punishment. Geometry also uses the "If-Then Statement." That is what our scriptures are like this Sunday. In each reading, there is a suggested action on our part, which will result in a desired outcome. There is a feminine personification of God as Wisdom, Psalm 63 and the intimate thirsting for God, the letter to the Thessalonians on believing in Christ, and Matthew's parable of the wise and foolish virgins. In the world of instant everything, we are not good about being patient, and our follow-through can be terrible. 

From the Pastor's Desk...

Congratulations to everyone who participated in The One Hour to Peace. . . from Mass to Mission Program in October! We had a lot of positive feedback from our 400+ participants and we pray that it will continue to bear fruit in our parish celebrations of the Mass and a renewed commitment of our community and to the mission of the Church.

There are many people to thank for making this incredible experience happen! I start with members of our Liturgy Committee where the idea for this effort all began. About 5 years ago this committee, led by Julia Cooney started researching programs to take a deeper dive into the beauty and meaning of the Mass. Then the US Bishops announced the plan for a National Eucharistic Revival. Once we heard there would be a year to focus on a parish revival, we decided Fall 2023 was the time to do it. A committee was formed to plan this program from members of our parish Eucharistic Revival Committee (ERC), the Parish Leadership Team (PLT), staff (PS), and Pastoral Council (PC). That group has been working since last fall to plan and execute the experience we had from October 1- November 4. I have never been a part of a parish initiative in my 22 years of priestly ministry that was this comprehensive and got this many people involved. Well done!

So back to my gratitude.... I wish I could list everyone by name but let me just say that there were about 72 people who helped in one way or another between planning, small group leaders, hospitality and babysitting (this includes our catechists and school teachers who helped bring the program to our youth!). I would like to single out a few people who led the effort. I begin with Herb Morrow (PC), Gina Adams (PLT) and Mary Beth Whitman (PLT) who chaired the program. These 3 were also weekly session facilitators as were Warren Beaver (PLT) and Cheryl DiPietro (PC) who I am also very grateful to. I also thank Justin Miles who organized all the hospitality. This core group put in many hours behind the scenes, and I cannot thank them enough.

I am also extremely grateful to the other volunteers. We could not have done this without you AND we can't forget to thank the over 425 people who participated in the experience. Thank you for responding to our invitation to go deeper!

Over the next two weeks we will have two ways we want to continue to build on the momentum from The One Hour to Peace. . . from Mass to Mission.

ONE- We will have a "Liturgical Ministries Fair" in the vestibule where you can sign up for the various liturgical ministries here at OLP. We have a particularly significant need in the area of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Altar Servers. So please consider becoming a part of these important ministries and we will follow up with you about training.

TWO- We are selling some OLP apparel so that you can show your parish pride! Over the next two weekends orders will be taken. Proceeds from these sales will be directed toward OLP Youth Ministry.

**Weekend of Prayer for Pastoral Planning in the Diocese of Erie The following quote is from Bishop Persico... "As we continue the efforts of pastoral planning, it is imperative that we keep before us and our people that the reason for planning is to provide vibrant communities of faith for future generations. With this in mind, I have determined to call the whole family of the Diocese of Erie to prayer. On the Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time, the weekend of November 11- 12, 2023. All parish celebrations of the diocese will be oriented around prayer for the pastoral planning process.

**"An Evening of Hope" OLP is hosting this event on Tuesday, November 14th from 6-8pm to celebrate the 100th birthday of Fr. Jim Peterson who founded Maria House Projects. Come hear a mother and son's perspective on dealing with addiction and the hope of recovery. Light refreshments will be served at the end of the program.

****Holy Land Pilgrimage/ Eucharistic Congress to Indianapolis July 2024** This week our pilgrimage to the Holy Land would be happening had we not had to cancel due to the increased violence and aggression. We continue to pray for peace and a just solution to the conflict over there. I will be rescheduling a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, most likely about year from when peace returns. But great news that the daughter of parishioners Len and Mary Alice Grieco, Alison, has made it to Egypt and is finally safely out of Gaza where she was working with Catholic Relief Services.

So, our next trip is to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis next summer (July 17-21, 2024) which is part of the 3-year Eucharistic Revival initiated by the US Bishops. This is the first Eucharistic Congress in the US in 70 years, so I encourage you to consider joining our group as it is not too late to sign up. Call the parish office for more details. **Special Masses this Week Monday, Nov. 13th- St. Francis Xavier Cabrini, Virgin (20th Century Italian missionary to the United States who was the first American citizen to be canonized); Tuesday, Nov. 14th- Ordinary Time; Wednesday, November 15th- St. Albert the Great, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (13th Century Dominican); *Thursday, Nov., 16th*- St. Margaret of Scotland (11th Century Scottish Queen); Friday, Nov. 17th- St. Elizabeth of Hungary (13th Century Patroness of Catholic Charities); Saturday, Nov. 18th- St. Rose Philippine Duchesne (19th Century French missionary who worked and died in Missouri).

<u>Paragraph 24</u>- "When we receive Holy Communion, Christ is giving himself to us. He comes to us in all

humility, as he came to us in the Incarnation, so that we may receive him and become one with him. Christ gives himself to us so that we may continue the pilgrim path toward life with him in the fullness of the Kingdom of God. The fourteenth-century Orthodox theologian Nicholas Cabasilas described this sacrament by saying, "unlike any other sacrament, the mystery [of the Eucharist] is so perfect that it brings us to the heights of every good thing: here is the ultimate goal of every human desire, because here we attain God and God joins himself to us in the most perfect union." OUR FASCINATING FAITH Keeping Track of All the Saints

During this month of All Saints' Day, it is interesting to learn how the Church keeps track of all those who have been officially named (or "canonized") saints. There is a liturgical book, the Roman Martyrology, first published in 1584, in which canonized saints' names are listed by their feast day. This day is usually determined by their date of death (the day of their birth into eternal life), but in cases of a conflict with the well-established feast day of another saint, a different day may be chosen, such as a birthday or a significant date from the saint's life. With more than five thousand entries now in the Roman Martyrology, conflicts are bound to occur, and generally only the most prominent are listed on local religious calendars. All other things being equal, a saint from a particular region or country (or for whom there is a particularly strong tradition of veneration) tends to take precedence over a less local or less-familiar saint. Once listed in the *Martyrology*, a saint may be publicly venerated throughout the Church, and have church buildings named after them.

Deceased women and men are canonized when there is a strong degree of certainty that their souls are with God in heaven. Because the Church recognizes that there are many more saints than could possibly be canonized or even listed, we celebrate all the saints, known and unknown, on November 1, All Saints' Day.

On the weekend of November 18-19, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).
