

Sunday's Readings:

Entrance Antiphon - To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. / In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. / Nor let my enemies exult over me; / and let none who hope in you be put to shame. First Reading - We are the clay and you, O Lord, are the potter: we are the work of your hands (Isaiah 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7).

Gospel - Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. (Mark 13:33-37).

Family Discussion of the Week: God's Faithfulness

God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Corinthians 1:9)

Adults: How do you know when you're following Christ and living his teachings faithfully? Kids: What good thing might God be asking you to do right now?

MARK'S JESUS

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and tersest of all four. The discourses of Jesus tend to be terser as well. Mark's portrayal of Jesus has none of the poetry of the Sermon on the Mount or the Sermon on the Plain as in Matthew or Luke, nor the extensive, reflective "I Am" discourses as in John. Mark's Jesus "cuts to the chase," we would say today. This is reflected quite well in today's passage.

It is no accident that the dialogue of Jesus at this point in the Gospel according to Mark-the concluding words about the end of the world-immediately before his passion, is riddled with exclamation points and an overall sense of urgency.

We would do well to re-tool our own way of living this Advent, for we live in a world urgently in need of hearing the message of Jesus proclaimed. It's time for us to "wake up!" and get out into the world to do

A blessed Advent to you! This year we have a short Advent Season since Christmas falls on a Monday which makes the 4th week in Advent only one day. Recall that, like Lent, Advent is a preparatory and penitential season and so we are encouraged to renew our commitments in the basic areas of Christian discipleship- prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Here are some opportunities to do that...

- **Special Masses this Week Monday, Dec. 4th- St. John Damascene, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (8th Century opponent of Iconoclasm); Tuesday, Dec. 5th- Advent Weekday; Wednesday, Dec. 6th- St. Nicholas, Bishop (4th Century bishop in Myra in Asia Minor and popularized as Santa Claus); Thursday, Dec. 7th- St. Ambrose, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (4th Century Bishop of Milan and baptized St. Augustine); Friday, Dec. 8th- the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary; Saturday, Dec. 9th- St. Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin (16th Century peasant visionary of Our Lady of Guadalupe).
- **Medical Emergency Volunteers Designated Seating There is a specially designated seat (last row on left of center aisle) for our medical emergency volunteer at the weekend Masses. It is indicated by a small plaque and first aid stickers. Please allow our volunteers to sit there. They will have a special lanyard that identifies them as such.
- **Safety Committee/Active Shooter Training Our parish safety committee is organizing an Active Shooter Training that will be held on Saturday, December 9th from 9-11am in the school cafeteria. Ushers, Liturgical Ministers of Hospitality and parish medical emergency volunteers are asked to attend but the training is also open to the entire parish. The training is relevant for dealing with active shooters in any environment and not just at the church or school. Please contact the parish office to register if you do plan to attend.
- **Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021 Paragraph 28- "The obligation to attend Mass each Sunday, the Lord's Day, on which we commemorate the Resurrection of Jesus, and on other holy days of obligation, is therefore a vital expression of our unity as members of the Body of Christ, the Church. It is also a manifestation of the truth that we are utterly dependent upon God and his grace. A third-century instruction on the life of the Church points out one of the consequences of willful absence from Mass: "Let no one deprive the Church by staying away; if they do, they deprive the Body of Christ of one of its members!" St. John Paul II, writing of Sunday as "a day which is at the very heart of the Christian life," further asserts, "Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human." We have been reborn in Baptism and nourished by the Eucharist so that we may live in communion with God and one another, not only today but also in the fullness of the heavenly Kingdom. To worship God on Sundays, then, is not the mere observance of a rule but the fulfillment of our identity, of who we are as members of the Body of Christ. Participation in the Mass is an act of love."

(91) **Our Lady of Peace Communal Feedback to Proposed Plan for **Erie County Restructuring** Here is the letter to Bishop Persico that our parish leadership provided in response to the Proposal for the next phase of restructuring of Catholic Churches in Erie County.

"Dear Bishop Persico, Greetings from Our Lady of Peace Parish! I write to you on behalf of our leadership at OLP to offer our institutional feedback regarding the preliminary plan for Erie County that was proposed in late August 2023. I first want to mention that our parish was very grateful for the opportunity to give feedback both individually and as a parish. We appreciate your willingness to hear our input and to allow it to be a factor in your final decisions. I specifically asked for input from our community leadership (Parish Leadership Team, Parish Staff, and Pastoral Council) in three areas and so will provide the feedback according to those areas.

The Process: I. We believe that the plan did not incorporate enough spiritual prayer and support as part of the process leading up to the proposal. We acknowledge that a prayer was written back in 2014 for overall pastoral planning in the Diocese of Erie and that prayer has been encouraged throughout, but we believe we could have been more intentional in creating a prayer plan so that along every step we ensure that we are all seeking the outpouring of the Holy Spirit to guide this process (MY Addition now... Since the initial proposed plan the diocese did initiate a weekend of prayer for the pastoral planning process which occurred on November 11-12, 2023).

2. We believe it would have been helpful to identify who was on the committee for creating this recent proposal either before the August meeting or at the meeting. From 2014-2017 there was a very clear communication of the committee and process, the more recent steps seemed to lose some of that clarity about who was involved.

The Plan: 1. We believe the information sent out as criteria 2 days after the meeting should have been shared during the meeting. But we also believe that the criteria was too vague and so a quick summary of why each decision was made would have been helpful at the meeting to allow the leaders at the meeting to try to help understand/defend the proposal. Without understanding the criteria and why decisions were made, that defense is harder.

2. We believe the plan needs a greater vision for where all this is going. If we knew where we wanted to be in 25 years, we could make better informed decisions based on that final vision. The impression presently is that we are making short-term decisions that do not have future vision in mind.

- 3. We believe the plan should have gone further. To continue to restructure every five to ten years in small steps creates a constant environment of anxiety and concern about what is next and is hard to build continuity and momentum. Another consideration in going further could be to ensure that every parish in Erie County is affected in this plan so that there is a sense that we are all in this together.
- 4. We have some concern about abandoning the poor in the inner city if churches like St. Joseph, St. Paul, St. Stephen. etc. are not going to be as active in that regard moving forward.
- 5. We believe that St. Julia Parish should not be a stand alone parish and should be merged with St. Jude Parish. And if there is to be a parish that is set aside for Diocesan Administrators to serve, there should be an explanation of why St. Julia is being selected versus other parish options.

Our Lady of Peace Parish Future: In regard to the concern about the inner-city connections remaining and consideration of this next step of restructuring in Erie County going further than the preliminary plan, we at Our Lady of Peace Parish are proposing that each of the big three suburban west deanery Millcreek parishes line up with a coinciding urban parish who they could give more direct support to regarding ministry to the needy.

St. George with St. Joseph Bread of Life, Sacred Heart and St. Paul

St. Jude with St. Andrew and St. Julia Our Lady of Peace with Blessed Sacrament and St. Stephen of Hungary

We also feel that a plan for the use of potentially unused buildings in the future should be considered regarding city-wide ministry. Could we open a center for evangelization, a center for social ministry, a center for formation, a center for spirituality (including retreats), a center for youth ministry, etc for use not only by Erie County Catholics but the entire diocese. These type of ideas however cannot be determined by one parish or cluster but would require a collaborative group to propose and figure out.
