From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Feast of the Epiphany and Merry Christmas! As we continue in the Christmas Season it is interesting to note that the traditional 12 days of Christmas (December 25-January 6) are not really a part of our liturgical calendar. To add further confusion, in most Catholic churches in the United States, we move the Feast of the Epiphany to the Sunday closest to January 6th. So that is why this Sunday we celebrate the Epiphany and remember the adoration of the Magi.

The recognition of the Christ child by the Magi (gentiles or non-Jews) from other countries was significant as a fulfillment of the Old Testament prophesies and reminds us that the Savior came for ALL peoples (the lowly shepherds and foreigners); and not just for the Jews or more exclusively for the Jewish religious and upper class. It reinforces the universality of our faith, and that Jesus came to save ALL peoples. Recall that the word "catholic" means universal, and the Epiphany is a good time to renew our prayer for all people to know the saving truth of Jesus Christ.

There is great symbolism and tradition surrounding the Epiphany. In some cultures, because of the connection with the gifts of the Magi, families exchange gifts on this day. Each gift from the Magi is symbolic of the different dimensions of the infant Jesus' identify and mission. Gold is associated with royalty to recognize Him as King of Kings, frankincense is associated with the worship of God in the temple to recognize His divinity, and myrrh, the oil associated with preparing the body for burial, to recognize His ultimate purpose to die for our salvation.

This weekend is the traditional time for the Epiphany Proclamation, the announcement of Easter and the movable feasts of the church. See the Proclamation below and make sure you mark the dates on your personal calendar and set aside those most important days of our liturgical year (Holy Week and Easter) for prayer and celebration with your parish family. Do not let those days be an after-thought; make them a priority around which to plan vacations, events, and other things that can keep us from worshiping.

The Christmas Season, and more specifically the Epiphany, is also the traditional time of year for house blessings. Fr. Dan and I are available to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us and set up a time to do so.

May God bless our conclusion to the Christmas Season and our week of Ordinary Time ahead!

Recall that the letter stand for the names of the Magi, Caspar, Balthasaar and Melchior, but also stands for the Latin phrase-

"Christus Benedicat Mansionem" which means "Christ bless this dwelling place."

**Epiphany Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts (for the year 2024)

"Know, dear brothers and sisters,

that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ,

so by leave of God's mercy

we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the fourteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the thirty-first day of March you will celebrate with joy Easter Day,

the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the ninth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the nineteenth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the second day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the first day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen."

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

<u>Paragraph 34 & 35</u>- "Transformation in Christ- The person who shares worthily in the Eucharist is enabled more and more to live the new law of love given by Christ precisely because Christ communicates himself in the sacrament of the altar. The foundation of our personal and moral transformation is the communion with himself that Christ establishes in Baptism and deepens in the Eucharist. In the celebration of the Mass, we are shown what love truly is, and we receive grace that enables us to imitate the love that Christ shows us. St. John Paul II noted that the moral life of the Christian flows from and is nourished by "that inexhaustible source of holiness and glorification of God" that is found in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist: "by sharing in the sacrifice of the Cross, the Christian partakes of Christ's self-giving love and is equipped and committed to live this same charity in all his thoughts and deeds."49 35. The personal and moral transformation that is sustained by the Eucharist reaches out to every sphere of human life. The love of Christ can permeate all of our relationships: with our families, our friends, and our neighbors. It can also reshape the life of our society as a whole. Our relationship with Christ is not restricted to the private sphere; it is not for ourselves alone. The 49 Pope John Paul II, Veritatis Splendor, no. 107. 22 very solidarity or communion in Christ's self-giving love that makes the Church and makes us members of the Church orders us beyond the visible community of faith to all human beings, whom we are to love with that very same love that forms our communion with the Lord. Otherwise, if we do not love all human beings in this way, our communion with the Lord is impaired or even contradicted. This love extends particularly and "preferentially" to the poor and the most vulnerable. We all need to be consistent in bringing the love of Christ not only to our personal lives, but also to every dimension of our public lives."
