They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day (John 1:38b-39)

Adults: What qualities do you have that would cause others to recognize you as a disciple of Jesus?

Kids: What does it take to be a follower of Jesus?

THE LAMB OF GOD

"Behold the Lamb of God!" We hear this phrase every Sunday at Mass, but there's a good chance that many Roman Catholics do not know who in the Bible originally spoke it. The phrase appears only in the Gospel of John, on the lips of John the Baptist, who utters it twice. In today's Gospel reading, John proclaims Jesus as the Lamb of God, and two of John's own disciples then follow Christ. A little bit later Andrew, who heard John and then followed Jesus, brings his brother Simon to be re-named Cephas, or Peter. A careful look at these Bible verses shows us the mission of everyone baptized into the Body of Christ: we must always proclaim our faith in Christ, so that others will follow him. We may not know how the will of God might work through those we bring to Christ; that is not the point. The point is that our ongoing mission as a church is to bring others to Christ, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

During this week we enter the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (Held annually January 18-25th). Ecumenism is the name we give to the movement and effort to seek greater unity among all Christians (efforts at unity among people of all religions is called "Interfaith"). Certainly, part of that effort is to initiate ways we can pray, serve, and stand for justice together with Christians from other denominations. We have seen this in action over the past few years as Bishop Persico united with other Christian leaders in Erie to pray for racial justice in our community and country. But it also involves engaging in dialogue and study with other Christians in the effort to find ways to overcome that which still divides us. The Holy Spirit, that gave birth to the church, is the key to bringing greater Christian Unity. So, we pray for the Holy Spirit to inspire us and our leaders to be instruments of this unity that God desires. We will offer the Mass for Christian Unity this Thursday, January 18th (7am and 12:10pm) for this intention.

Last weekend I included an insert in the bulletin that was a Statement from the Office of the Bishop to the Clergy and People of the Diocese of Erie regarding the Declaration Fiducia Supplicans on December 22, 2023 (which addresses informal blessings of persons in same sex unions). If you missed it, you can find copies at the doors of the church or on the OLP website. It is a very thorough and clear summary of the Vatican's declaration. I remind you that the English word "Blessing" is not the same as the informal prayer we are being permitted to offer with those in same sex unions. Many people use the word "blessing" when wanting to get their marriages outside of the church recognized or "convalidated" as it is called in church language. It happens when couples who were married outside of the church for different reasons are now wanting and able to have their marriage sacramentally recognized in the church. This brings the marriage to the level of a sacrament. I have celebrated many such convalidations with couples over my 22 years of priestly ministry. I am concerned that the everyday Catholic who uses "blessing" for such convalidations, will hear this new declaration from the Vatican and be mislead that the informal blessings being discussed are the same as convalidations. This informal prayer is the same type of prayer we would have with people in any need (including same sex attractions or unions). For this reason, I encourage you to read and understand the Bishop's statement and the Vatican declaration and make the distinction. If you have any questions or concerns on this, please contact myself or Fr. Dan to discuss it further.

**Christmas Thank You's I would like to again thank everyone who helped make our Christmas a beautiful celebration and season. Shane and myself, we thank all who gave us personal Christmas cards and gifts. We were overwhelmed by your thoughtfulness and generosity, and thank God for you, our OLP Parish family! **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has designated January 22nd as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn (the anniversary of the date of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court Decision that had legalized abortion in the entire United States of America). We will have Eucharistic Adoration from 7:30am (after 7am Mass) until 6:30pm. At 6:30pm we will have a Holy Hour for Unborn Life. Even though Roe was overturned in the summer of 2022, we need to keep praying and fasting that abortion will be made illegal in Pennsylvania and in all other states.

Saturday is the Day of Encounter, where we encounter God through the sacraments, Adoration, and others. Sunday is the Day of Commission, where we as a community are empowered to evangelize and share our faith. The weekend includes talks, exposure to different types of prayer, Mass, community, and much more. The weekend runs from 10am on Friday to 5pm on Sunday, and retreat participants stay onsite for the weekend." See www.divinemercyencounter.com for more information. The other DME retreats in 2024 will be in April, July and November in Erie and August 11-13 in St. Marys, PA.

**House Blessing Cards for 2024 are available. You are encouraged to take the card home, say the prayers with those in your household and then fasten them over the main door of your house. Recall that the letters stand for the names of the Magi, Caspar, Balthasaar and Melchior, but also stand for the Latin phrase- "Christus Benedicat Mansionem" which means "Christ bless this dwelling place." Fr. Dan and I are available to come to your homes and bless them with you. Feel free to call either one of us and set up a time to do so.

**Epiphany Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts (for the year 2024) Last weekend was the traditional time for the Epiphany Proclamation. Please mark the dates on your personal calendar and set aside those most important days of our liturgical year (Holy Week and Easter) for prayer and celebration with your parish family. Do not let them be an after-thought; make them a priority around which to plan vacations, events, and other things that may keep us from worshiping.

"Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the fourteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the thirty-first day of March you will celebrate with joy Easter Day,

the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the ninth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.]

On the nineteenth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the second day of June the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the first day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen."

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

Paragraph 36 & 37- "It is the role of the laity in particular to transform social relations in accord with the love of Christ, which is carried out concretely in actions that work for the objective common good. Lay people, "conscious of their call to holiness by virtue of their baptismal vocation, have to act as leaven in the dough to build up a temporal city in keeping with God's project. [Consistency] between faith and life in the political, economic, and social realm[s] requires formation of conscience, which translates into knowing the Church's social doctrine." Lay people who exercise some form of public authority have a special responsibility to form their consciences in accord with the Church's faith and the moral law, and to serve the human family by upholding human life and dignity.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that the "Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognize Christ in the poorest, his brethren." Preaching on Matthew 25, St. John Chrysostom observed: "Do you wish to honor the body of Christ? Do not ignore him when he is naked. Do not pay him homage in the temple clad in silk only then to neglect him outside where he suffers cold and nakedness. He who said: 'This is my body' is the same One who said: 'You saw me hungry and you gave me no food." St. Teresa of Calcutta is an outstanding example in more recent times of someone who learned to recognize Christ in the poor. It was her deep faith in the Eucharist and her reception of Holy Communion that motivated her loving care of the poorest of the poor and commitment to the sanctity of all human life. In beholding the face of Christ in the Eucharist, she learned to recognize his face in the poor and suffering. Mother Teresa is said to have asserted: "We must pray to Jesus to give us that tenderness of the Eucharist. Unless we believe and see Jesus in the appearance of bread on the altar, we will not be able to see him. in the distressing disguise of the poor.""












As we continue through the pastoral planning for the Diocese and especially Erie County Bishop Persico calls us to a weekend of prayer on January 13th and 14th.

Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month - Child Sex Trafficking is a form of child abuse that occurs when any child under age 18 is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is traded for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be anyone including friends, gangs, family members, foster parents, perceived trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk to your child openly about this reality and build resiliency. Address the myths and misconceptions that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Social media and gaming platforms are increasingly becoming the tool traffickers and other predators use to target, groom, and recruit victims. At some point your child will likely be confronted with inappropriate messages or see things online that they know are wrong. Teach your child how to handle these situations. 


