

TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice. The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. Some false prophets were extremely popular and quite wellversed in scripture, and even held positions of authority. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. Elsewhere, we also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. Today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths. Copyright © 1. S. Paluch Co., Inc.



A Blessed Catholic Schools Week to you! The Catholic Schools Week (CSW) theme is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." Catholic schools have an irreplaceable role in the Church's evangelizing mission. Building on the central goal of Catholic schools to form saints, Catholic schools teach and embrace the whole person, body, mind, and spirit. The fact that all members of a Catholic school community share the Christian vision of faith that Christ is the foundation of Catholic education is what unites the school as a faith-filled community.

While faith is the binding element in Catholic schools, the Church reiterates that parents are the first teachers of their children. Holding this tenet, Catholic school communities expand beyond the walls of school buildings to envelop the family as an integral part of the school community. Together teachers, administrators, staff, students, and parents fuel the light of faith by integrating culture with faith and faith with living.

So, this week we will celebrate the gift that the school is to our parish and community. There are special activities planned each day at the school. We kick off the celebration with Catholic school students helping with the ministries at the I I am Mass today. **I have been asked to be a celebrity judge for St. Martin Center's biggest fundraiser "Erie's Best Coffee" which will be held on Sunday, February 25th from I lam-2pm at the Ambassador Conference Center. Each judge is asked to raise \$1,000 for St. Martin Center. SMC is a ministry of Catholic Charities that works for the poor of our community. Over the last year I have often referred to my **Hallow App experience with the Hallow App and recommended it to those who are looking for something to support and grow their prayer life. In November we decided to participate in Hallows Holy Day special which allows our parishioners to pay \$1 for a subscription for Advent through Lent (a fraction of the \$9.99/month or \$69.99/ year rates). Just as we were ready to promote this offer, I found out that the voice actor that they were using for the Advent Challenge was Liam Neeson who was a vocal activist for legalizing abortion in Ireland about 6-7 years ago (which unfortunately did happen). After consulting with the Parish Leadership Team (PLT) at OLP, we decided not to promote the Advent offer and I reached out to the president of Hallow to discuss my concerns. I had a great conversation with the co-founder who gave a very thorough and thoughtful response which included the following:-one, acknowledgment that Hallow did not handle this situation well: two - a thorough moral analysis which had the support of several of their content theologians and included references to St. Thomas Aguinas among other doctors of the church. This showed me it was not something they took lightly; three- a humble recognition and regret that they put pastors in a difficult situation since in parishes it's not just individual consumers who can decide on their own but pastors and parish leaders who have a responsibility to oversee and protect their flock. After bringing this back to our PLT and considering the response from Hallow (who was willing to reimburse OLP the \$500 we paid if we were not satisfied with their response), we decided to continue our agreement with them which allows for the \$1 signup and wait until January to promote Hallow's Prolife content as well as the upcoming Lent opportunities. If you want to discuss this further with me or anyone on our PLT (or want to see a copy of Hallow's response), please contact me or the office. As a reminder, members of the PLT are myself, Fr. Dan Hoffman, Mary Beth Whitman, Gina Adams, Warren Beaver and Justin Miles.

**Divine Mercy Encounter (DME) Retreat February 9-11, 2024
"DME (Divine Mercy Encounter) is a three-day retreat program.
Each day has a different focus: Friday is the Day of Invitation, focusing on how God is inviting us into relationship. Saturday is the Day of Encounter, where we encounter God through the sacraments, Adoration, and others. Sunday is the Day of Commission, where we as a community are empowered to evangelize and share our faith. The weekend includes talks, exposure to different types of prayer, Mass, community, and much more. It runs from 10am on Friday to 5pm on Sunday, and retreat participants stay onsite for the weekend." **Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

Paragraph 42 & 43- "While it is all too obvious that in our current world the Kingdom has not been fully established, our communion with the Lord shows that the Kingdom of God is not simply something we await at the end of time. The Kingdom is already present, if not in its fullness: "The kingdom has come in the person of Christ and grows mysteriously in the hearts of those incorporated into Him," until its fulfillment when he comes again in glory. The mystery of the Kingdom remains present in the Church because she is joined to Christ as the members of a Body are to their Head. In the communion which is the Church, "the Kingdom of heaven, the Reign of God, already exists and will be fulfilled at the end of time."

God has not only called us out of sinful indifference to do whatever we can to contribute to the coming of the Kingdom; through Christ he has given us the grace we need to do this. The Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church explains: Men and women who are made "new" by the love of God are able to change the rules and the quality of relationships, transforming even social structures. They are people capable of bringing peace where there is conflict, of building and nurturing fraternal relationships where there is hatred, of seeking justice where there prevails the exploitation of man by man. Only love is capable of radically transforming the relationships that men maintain among themselves.""
