Family Discussion of the Week: Models of Christ Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ. (Corinthians 11:1) Adults: Would you have the courage to tell others to do as you do in order to be a Christian? Why or why not? Kids: What can you do this week to be an example to others?

GIVE GOD THE GLORY

A curious feature of the first half of Mark's Gospel is the pattern of Jesus working a miracle, then telling the recipient of the miracle to keep still about it. Many theories have been offered: Mark is setting the stage for the great "secret" revealed when Peter will proclaim Jesus the Messiah at Caesarea Philippi; more skeptical commentators offer that Jesus, fully aware of human nature, knew that the way to spread the news was to tell people to keep it secret. The insight into this secret-keeping that serves us well, however, is that Jesus was initiating his public ministry according to the pattern that Paul describes. He was doing it for the glory of God-not for his own benefit, but for that of all. Paul would later write in Philippians that Jesus "humbled" himself to become like us. And we see this humility at work in today's healing of the leper. Jesus is trying to reveal the presence of God's reign among the people, not so that he himself might receive the glory, but so that God would be glorified through him. Imitating this pattern, which Paul encourages the Jewish and Greek Christian factions in Corinth to do, still serves us well today. Copyright @ J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

It is hard to believe that Lent, our "great annual Catholic retreat," is already upon us. This is a special time when we, as Catholics, recommit to the basic Christian disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in order to grow in our relationship with God and make more room for Him in our hearts and in our lives. We begin that journey this Ash Wednesday when we will have Masses at 7am, 12:10pm, 1:30pm (school Mass), and 7pm. There will also be a Service for Distribution of Ashes at 5:30pm. Recall that this is not a holy day of obligation; but Mass is still a noble way to start this great season of grace. It is also a day of abstinence from meat for Catholics 14 years and older (as are all the Fridays in Lent), and a day of fasting for Catholics age 18-59. Those obligated to fast may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain one's strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

I cannot encourage you enough to make a plan for your Lenten commitments in those areas of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (giving to the poor). Here are some opportunities in the parish to consider for your spiritual commitment during Lent: DAILY MASS (it has been a powerful Catholic tradition to commit to this pray more regularly during Lent); Daily Rosary is said at 11:35am in the main church from Monday through Friday; Stations of the Cross at 7pm on all Fridays during Lent; Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Friday, March 1st from 7:30am-7pm and March 26th at 1:00pm through Noon on March 27st (Tuesday/Wednesday of Holy Week); Operation Rice Bowl (given to all families with children in Faith Formation and the school as well as in the bulletin) to support Catholic Relief Services; "Four Pillars of the Catechism" Series in Lent on Wednesdays from 6:30-7:30pm; and the "Light is On for You" where confession is available at all participating local parishes from 5-7pm on Thursday, March 21st.

In addition to these communal opportunities, see my notes for the full Confession schedule for Lent. Also, our parish continues to have a deal with the **Hallow App** that you can sign up for \$1 through Lent. They have a Lenten Challenge called Pray40: He Leadeth Me where you will be guided through the 20th Century spiritual classic called "He Leadeth Me" by Fr. Walter Ciszek, SJ. It's an extraordinary account of a Catholic priest who persevered through solitary confinement and labor camps for 20+ years. His incredible spiritual reflections will help you give God total sovereignty of your life and help you grow experience true freedom in Christ. Scan the QR code and enter Our Lady of Peace Parish in Erie, PA and you will be given the special offer or stop by the office and we will be happy to assist you.

Whatever you decide for your plan, Lent should look different for us as Catholics so let's get ready to renew our spiritual health.... may God bless our week and Lent ahead! Fr. Rich

****OLD Palms** It's that time. . . return your old palms in the vestibule before Ash Wednesday so they can be burned for our ashes. I will burn the palms for this year's ashes on Tuesday, February 13th at 1:30pm with the OLP School community in the parking lot. All are welcome to join us as we prepare for Ash Wednesday.

**Stations of the Cross will be held each week on Friday (Feb 16, 23, March 1, 8, 15 (Living Stations), and 22) at 7pm. Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm before Stations. **Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) This weekend

(February 10th and 11th) we invite you to make a commitment to support the CSA. These gifts support our parish by funding our annual contribution in support of vital diocesan ministries. Our Lady of Peace keeps 100% of gifts raised beyond our contribution for the needs of our parish. Your gifts allow OLP and the Church in northwest Pennsylvania to continue building up the body of Christ. More specifically, this year's CSA project for Our Lady of Peace Parish is the mortar pointing on the east side of the church building. The cost of that project is \$55,000. Our annual contribution to the Diocesan Church ministry is \$144,333. So our overall goal for CSA 2024 is \$200.000.

******Celebrating Today, Planning for Tomorrow"** So far we have 133 households that have committed to \$50,207 in annual increase and another \$3,105 in one time gifts. Thank you to those who have participated in this campaign and please consider if you have not yet.

****Lenten practices:** The Diocese of Erie offers the following information regarding observation of Lent in 2024:

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 28, 2024.

1. Traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.

2. Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

3. In 2024, St. Patrick's Day (March 17 – Principal Patronal Feast Day of the Diocese of Erie) falls on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In recognition of the importance of this day for the faithful, Bishop Persico has directed that St. Patrick be liturgically observed (at daily Mass, Divine Office, etc.) throughout the diocese on Monday, March 18, 2024.

4. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday also are days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)

****Lenten Confessions** In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Thursday, March 21st from 5-7pm, local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie.

****Masses this Week** *Monday, Feb. 12th* and *Tuesday, Feb. 13th*. Weekdays in Ordinary Time; *Wednesday, Feb. 14th*. Ash Wednesday; *Thursday, Feb. 15th*, *Friday, Feb. 16th* and *Saturday, Feb. 17th*. Lenten Weekdays.

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

Paragraph 45-47: "While all our failures to do what is right damage our communion with God and with each other, they fall into different categories, reflecting different degrees of severity. This brings us to the distinction between venial and mortal sins. Venial sins are those sins and everyday faults that, although they reflect a degree of selfishness, do not break the covenant with God. They do not deprive the sinner of friendship with God or of sanctifying grace.61 Venial sins are not to be taken lightly, but they do not destroy communion because they do not destroy the principle of divine life in us. Indeed, reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins, while also helping us to avoid more serious sins.62 Pope Francis brought attention to this medicinal character of the Eucharist when he pointed out that it "is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak." He also warns us against the Pelagian error of forgetting our constant need for grace and thinking that living a holy life depends on our own force of will. There are some sins, however, that do rupture the communion we share with God and the Church, and that cause grave offense to human dignity. These are referred to as grave, or mortal, sins. One commits a mortal sin by freely, knowingly, and willingly choosing to do something that involves grave matter and that is opposed to charity, opposed to love of God and neighbor.

One is not to celebrate Mass or receive Holy Communion in the state of mortal sin without having sought the Sacrament of Reconciliation and received absolution. As the Church has consistently taught, a person who receives Holy Communion while in a state of mortal sin not only does not receive the grace that the sacrament conveys; he or she commits the sin of sacrilege by failing to show the reverence due to the sacred Body and Blood of Christ. St. Paul warns us that whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body (See Code of Canon Law, c. 916; Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches, c. 712. The exception to this rule is a situation in which the person has both a grave reason to receive and no opportunity to confess; however, the person is obligated to make an act of perfect contrition and to resolve to confess at the earliest opportunity) and blood of the Lord. A person should examine himself, and so eat the bread and drink the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself. To receive the Body and Blood of Christ while in a state of mortal sin represents a contradiction. The person who, by his or her own action, has broken communion with Christ and his Church but receives the Blessed Sacrament, acts incoherently, both claiming and rejecting communion at the same time. It is thus a counter sign, a lie - it expresses a communion that in fact has been broken."

**Quotes on the Mass/ Eucharist

St. Bernadine of Siena (1380-1444): "Prayer is the best preparation for Holy Communion. Prayer is the raising of the mind to God. When we pray we go to meet Christ Who is coming to us. If our Creator and Savior comes from heaven with such great love, it is only fitting that we should go to meet Him. And this is what we do when we spend some time in prayer."






