PEOPLE OF THE COVENANT

If there is one word that stands out in today's readings, it is "covenant." God's faithfulness and goodness serve as examples to us of how to live. Genesis tells the story of Noah and of God's covenant not only with all people, but with all of nature. Never will the cleansing waters of the flood bring their destructive power to all the earth again. The sign, the reminder to both God and nature, is the rainbow in the heavens.

The psalm reminds us of this compassion of God, and begs God to remember us, not because of our goodness, but because of God's goodness and fidelity to the promise. God shows us how to be good, not by decree, but by example.

This Sunday, February 18th we will celebrate the Rite of Sending with our RCIA candidates at the I I am Mass. We "send" the candidates to the Rite of Election with Bishop Persico which takes place at St. Peter Cathedral that same day at 3pm. These rites are the beginning of the Period of Enlightenment which is the catechumens (those preparing for Baptism) and candidates (those preparing for Eucharist and Confirmation) final period of preparation for entering full communion with us in the Catholic faith (at the Easter Vigil- March 30th). Thank you to those who have supported this campaign and please consider if you have not yet.

****Night to Shine** Thank you to all who volunteered or donated to the "Night to Shine" prom event for our special needs community. We had 160 guests who were celebrated with a red carpet introduction, dinner, dancing and a special message from Demi and Tim Tebow before they were all crowned kings and queens of the prom (they all received crowns and tiaras). Each honored guest has a buddy so the parents of the guests can be treated to an adult social during the prom event. It is always a special night and OLP has been blessed to sponsor it for the last 5 years. A special thank you to Linda Hennigan, Michelle Ohmer and Mary Beth Whitman who helped organize the event! Also, we are looking to solidify the revenue source to cover the \$20,000 it costs to put on this event each year. The Tim Tebow Foundation has helped us regularly with covering some of the costs but once a community gets the event established over a few years, they no longer financially support it. So, if you know of any charity foundations, business or other organizations who might want to consistently support this or you yourself are interested, please contact me or Mary Beth Whitman at the office to discuss further.

**Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) Last weekend we invited you to make a commitment to support the CSA. These gifts support our parish by funding our annual contribution to support vital diocesan ministries. Our Lady of Peace keeps 100% of gifts raised beyond our contribution for the needs of our parish. Your gifts allow OLP and the Church in northwest Pennsylvania to continue building up the body of Christ. More specifically, this year's CSA project for Our Lady of Peace Parish is the mortar pointing on the east side of the church building. The cost of that project is \$55,000. Our annual contribution to the Diocesan Church ministry is \$144,333. So our overall goal for CSA 2024 is \$200.000.

****Lenten practices:** The Diocese of Erie offers the following information regarding observation of Lent in 2024:

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 14 and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 28, 2024. 1. Traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the church. Daily Mass is encouraged.

2. Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

3. In 2024, St. Patrick's Day (March 17 – Principal Patronal Feast Day of the Diocese of Erie) falls on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In recognition of the importance of this day for the faithful, Bishop Persico has directed that St. Patrick be liturgically observed (at daily Mass, Divine Office, etc.) throughout the diocese on Monday, March 18, 2024. 4. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.) ****Lenten Confessions** In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we will have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Thursday, March 21st from 5-7pm, local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie.

****Masses this Week** Monday, Feb. 19th, Tuesday, Feb. 20th, and Saturday, February 24th- Lenten Weekdays; Wednesday, Feb. 21st- St. Peter Damien, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (11th Century Benedictine Reformer); Thursday, Feb. 22nd- the Chair of Peter the Apostle; Friday, Feb. 23rd- St. Polycarp, Bishop and Martyr (2nd Century disciple of St. John).

****Lenten Series: "The One Hour to Peace... the Four Pillars"** We are excited to introduce a new series in formation for Lent that will overview the 4 sections (pillars) of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. There will be a presentation and small group discussion each night as well as an optional light dinner of soup and bread being served from 6-6:30pm. Sessions will be held in the School Cafeteria. I hope you will consider joining us.

Wednesday, Feb. 21st The Creed 6:30-7:30pm Wednesday, Feb. 28th The Sacraments 6:30-7:30pm Life in Christ (Morality)6:30-7:30pm Wednesday, Mar. 6th Wednesday, Mar. 13th Prayer 6:30-7:30pm **Silence at Mass In response to the Lenten invitation to more silence, the liturgy committee has decided to emphasize the liturgical moments of silence already included in the Mass but not always observed during Lent. These moments include: a.) the invitation to examine our conscience during the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass ("Let us acknowledge our sins and so prepare our hearts to celebrate these Sacred Mysteries"); b.) at the start of certain prayers when the priest says, "Let us pray" (so we can all speak to God in our own words before the priest "collects" them all into one); c.) after each of the Scripture readings (to "digest" the Word of God); d.) after the homily (to allow the priest's words to sink in); and e.) after all have received Communion (to receive God's loving embrace, to thank God and love Him back). The goal of these moments of silence is to allow God to make a more lasting impression on us during Mass. The hope is that we do not just have a superficial encounter with God at Mass that is lost as soon as we leave the doors of the church, but that we allow God's grace and presence to penetrate our very being at a depth that changes us and stays with us. This might feel like an ambitious goal, but that's what our church and our God desires for us. So let's embrace these silent moments at Mass... or more importantly let God embrace us more fully through them.

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021 Paragraph 48: "We also need to keep in mind that "the celebration of the Eucharist presupposes that communion already exists, a communion which it seeks to consolidate and bring to perfection." The Eucharist is the sacrament of ecclesial communion, as it both signifies and effects most fully the communion with Christ that began in Baptism. This includes communion in its "visible dimension, which entails communion in the teaching of the Apostles, in the sacraments and in the Church's hierarchical order." Likewise, the reception of Holy Communion entails one's communion with the Church in this visible dimension. We repeat what the U.S. bishops stated in 2006: If a Catholic in his or her personal or professional life were knowingly and obstinately to reject the defined doctrines of the Church, or knowingly and obstinately to repudiate her definitive teaching on moral issues, however, he or she would seriously diminish his or her communion with the Church. Reception of Holy Communion in such a situation would not accord with the nature of the Eucharistic celebration, so that he or she should refrain. Reception of Holy Communion in such a situation is also likely to cause scandal for others, weakening their resolve to be faithful to the demands of the Gospel."

Grooming Behavior - Children and young people can be groomed online or in the real world, by a stranger or by someone they know. This could be a family member, a friend or someone who has targeted themlike a teacher, faith leader or sports coach. Grooming is when someone builds a relationship, trust and emotional connection with a child or young person so thy can manipulate, exploit, or abuse them. Grooming can take place over a short or long period of time. Some common tactics are pretending to be younger, giving advice or showing understanding, buying gifts, giving attention, taking them on trips, outings, or holidays. To prevent your child from grooming behavior, teach them about healthy relationships, how to stay safe online, and who are the trusted adults they can go to for help.
