

Family Discussion of the Week: Source of Strength

Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." (John 4:13-14)

Adults: Where have you found a source of "living water" for your own journey of faith? Kids: Name some times when your belief in Jesus helped make you stronger.

KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH

There's no better way to deepen our Lenten practice than to review the Ten Commandments. The first three, having to do with our right relationship to God, get the most ink. The one we busy people probably have the most problem with is keeping holy the Sabbath.

If we take this commandment literally, babies will go undiapered and dishes will stay on the table, or perhaps meals will not be served. The sick will go unattended and nothing that has anything to do with physical labor will be done. Is mental labor really work? How about changing that dirty diaper (poor baby!)?

We need to depend on God to discern how to observe real Sabbath time in our lives. The point of this commandment is that God has given us a great gift: one whole day per week when we are free to rest, worship God, sing, feast, love, and rejoice. As Psalm 19 proclaims: "The law of the LORD is perfect, / refreshing the soul" (19:8). Our Sabbath rest is a great gift, to be received from God with joy, not with nitpicking. Copyright © J. S. Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

In February I finished my seventh year as pastor at Our Lady of Peace Parish. My assignment here is now my longest as a priest in the Diocese of Erie (surpassing my 6 years and 8 months at St. Joseph in Warren, PA from 2010-2017). I am so grateful for the gift of leading this wonderful community in the mission of Jesus Christ and the opportunity it provides for me to pray, serve, learn and grow with you. One of the highlights of my experience at OLP has been participating in the Amazing Parish Movement for the last almost two years. The Parish Leadership Team or PLT (Mary Beth Whitman, Justin Miles, Gina Adams, Warren Beaver and newly added Fr. Dan Hoffman) have been an incredible source of support and inspiration for me in leading our parish and giving me hope and strength in knowing that I do not have to lead alone. I have shared with you in the past some of the basics about the Amazing Parish Model but for those who are new to the parish or maybe missed it, I want to offer a summary again. I share excerpts from an article in the Georgia Bulletin in 2019 about Amazing Parish and I remind you that the Our Lady of Peace PLT attended the Amazing Parish Summit in Denver in June 2022 and are planning to attend again in August 2024.

"What Amazing Parish does is provide pastors and their teams with tools to help transform their parish from maintenance mode to a mission-driven culture. It starts with a cohesive leadership team founded on three building blocks: a culture of prayer, a culture of healthy teamwork and a culture of active discipleship. These cultures are meant to seep into the very marrow of parish life, so that, for example, someone who visits a parish office encounters joyful discipleship (and not, as Pat Lencioni (the founder of Amazing Parish) notes, a somber, transactional environment). At the Amazing Parish Summit, the AP Team combined principles and best practices, offering solid insights in addition to possible activities and initiatives to implement. Amazing Parish now offers free coaching to help keep teams accountable (which OLP has benefited from for the last almost 2 years). At a time when trust, transparency, accountability, co-responsibility and ministry burnout are vivid concerns, Amazing Parish offers a practical response that recognizes and appreciates both pastors and the need for collaboration when it comes to shouldering the responsibilities of parish leadership. As Amazing Parish makes clear, it's not about the pastor sharing his authority but rather about the pastor sharing his burdens. He knows he has a team standing behind him—that "has his back"—and is also willing and empowered to call him out and challenge him when necessary. Everyone of us as disciples could benefit from that type of accountability in our lives."

I thank God, our PLT, staff and all of you for making my seven years at OLP a true time of blessing and growth and I hope and pray that we can keep growing in Christ to eternity!

May God bless our 3rd Week of Lent ahead!

The old chairs and tables are available for a suggested donation of \$5 per chair and \$20 per table. If you take 40/50 chairs, a cart will be included at no cost. Please contact the office if you are interested.

**Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) UPDATE We presently have 293 pledges for \$159,074 and \$78,555 paid. Remember our overall goal is \$200,000 with our annual assessment from the Diocesan Church at \$144,333 and the cost of our parish mortar pointing on the east side of the church building project being \$55,000.

**"Celebrating Today, Planning for Tomorrow" So far we have 218 households that have committed to \$82,378 in annual increase and another \$5,255 in one time gifts. Thank you to those who have participated in this campaign and please consider if you have not yet.

**Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we have extra opportunities during Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm. "The Light is On for You" is Thursday, March 21st from 5-7pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie).

**Stations of the Cross will be held on Fridays (March 15th will be Living Stations presented by the school) at 7pm.

Confessions will be heard from 6-7pm before Stations.

**Lenten Series: "The One Hour to Peace... the Four Pillars"
The series on the 4 sections (pillars) of the Catechism continues through Lent. No need to register. Join us for the last weeks even if you missed the first two. There is a presentation and small group discussion each night as well as an optional light dinner of soup and bread being served from 6-6:30pm. Sessions are held in the School Cafeteria. I hope you will consider joining us.

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021

Paragraph 51-52: "51. The lives of the saints and blesseds show us the importance of the Eucharist on our journey as disciples of Jesus. Many testify to the power of the Eucharist in their lives. We see the fruits of Holy Communion in their lives of faith, hope, and charity. It was their intimate union with Jesus in Holy Communion and frequently their prayer before the Blessed Sacrament that nourished and strengthened them in their journey to heaven. They teach us that "growth in Christian life needs the nourishment of Eucharistic Communion, the bread for our pilgrimage until the moment of death, when it will be given to us as viaticum." 52. Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young Italian teenager, who died at the age of fifteen and was beatified in 2020, used to say: "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven." Blessed Carlo attained sanctity at such a young age because the Eucharist was at the center of his life. He attended Mass daily and prayed each day before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration. He discovered the joy of friendship with Jesus and brought that joy, the joy of the Gospel, to others. He was an apostle of the Eucharist through the internet. He said: "To always be united with Christ: This is my life's program.""

St. John Damascene (d. 749 AD): "How can this come about?" Mary asked. "The Holy Spirit will come upon you," the angel answered, "and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow." And now you are the one who puts the question: "How can bread become Christ and wine His Blood?"
