Family Discussion of the Week: Source of Light

For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as Children of light - for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. (Ephesians 5:8-9) *Adults:* What are you doing in your life right now to move toward light rather than darkness? *Kids:* How can you let the light of your faith in Jesus shine for others to see?

COMMUNAL RESPONSIBILITY

The people of God forgot the covenant and flouted God's laws. They did not listen to the prophets among them, who spoke for God in warning them. Prophets are sent from God to remind us why we are here, but they are often, even in our own time, mocked, disregarded, and mistreated rather than thanked and listened to.

The book of Chronicles tells the results of these sins: the destruction of the temple and all of Jerusalem, murder, mayhem, and finally exile to a foreign land. Why are these stories in the Bible? Just to inform us of what happened to our ancient forebears? What good would that be unless there were a message and a warning for us as well? Are we people who follow the teachings of God, who obey the words of Christ in the second covenant in his blood? Or do we continue to wreak works of darkness and violence? We are reminded by these readings that we will be judged as a people, not just as individuals.

Serra Prayer for Vocations

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Laetare Sunday to you! We are less than a month away from THE SACRED TRIDUUM! Sundown on Holy Thursday (March 28th) through sundown on Easter Sunday (March 31st) is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. MARK YOUR CALENDARS NOW! Usually I wait until Palm Sunday to promote the Triduum the following week, but this year at the encouragement of the Liturgy Committee, I wanted to start promoting it sooner as a way to reinforce how important and special it is. I also challenge you to attend these special liturgies this year (especially if you have not experienced them before). When our parish comes together for these days in prayer and communion with each other, there is a palpable grace and presence of the Holy Spirit that everyone should experience and that increases as more of us gather. I will explain more about the Sacred Triduum and Holy Thursday in this week's column, and then explain Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter in the next two weeks.

This three-day period is referred to as the Easter Triduum, also known as the Sacred Triduum, or Paschal Triduum. The word "triduum" comes from the Latin word triduum, which comes from tris ("three") + dies ("day"). Basically, the Sacred Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins. Our bishops reinforce this: "Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery" (USCCB)

It is known as the "Paschal Mystery" because it is the ultimate fulfillment of the ancient Jewish Passover (or Pasch), which was a reminder of how God brought the Jews out of slavery in Egypt. The spotless lamb was slaughtered at the Passover meal and consumed—that same night the destroying angel "passed over" the homes marked with the blood of the Passover Lamb, and those covered by the Blood were saved. This was the Old Testament prefigurement of Jesus' work at the Last Supper—where he inserted himself as the Paschal Lamb and Calvary, where the sacrifice was offered to save us from our slavery to sin. With the Holy Eucharist, we consume the victim that died for our sins. The Paschal Mystery is, therefore, God's plan of redemption for the fallen human race through the passion, death, and resurrection of the God-man Jesus Christ. It is one marvelous event stretched out over three days.

HOLY THURSDAY, March 28th- The evening Mass on Holy Thursday (at 7pm at OLP) is referred to as The Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church re-lives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified. After the homily there is an optional "washing of the feet" ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant—just as Jesus did with his disciples. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated Host is kept, away from the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated. (our altar of repose takes place in the school cafeteria). Many parishes will create space for people to stay and pray with the reposed Eucharist at this altar of repose late into the night, remembering Jesus' request in the Garden of Gethsemane for someone to "watch and pray" with Him. (We have Adoration from 8:15-11pm at which time we pray Night Prayer (Liturgy of the Hours) and then public prayer ends).

May God bless our 4th Week of Lent ahead!

Part of the tradition of the St. Joseph Table is to provide food for those in need so you are asked to bring non-perishable food or monetary donations that will go to the West Millcreek Food Pantry.

It is July 17-21, 2024. Find more details at www.eriercd.org/EucharisticRevival.html. ****Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021**

Paragraph 53-54: "53. Likewise, St. José Sánchez del Río, a Mexican teenager who was martyred at the age of fourteen and canonized in 2016, was so filled with love of Christ and his Church that he was willing to give up his life rather than renounce Christ and his Kingship. While imprisoned, St. José was able to receive the Blessed Sacrament when it was smuggled into his cell along with a basket of food. Strengthened by this viaticum, he was able to endure torture and to remain faithful to Christ when his captors told him he must renounce his faith or be executed. He replied to his persecutors: "My faith is not for sale." We encourage all, especially our young people, to learn about the lives of these holy teenagers. In the midst of many distractions in our life, Blessed Carlo and St. José Sánchez del Río teach us to focus on what is more important than anything else. 54. There are many people who have been attracted to the Catholic Church and entered the Church because they came to believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Our first U.S. born saint, Elizabeth Ann Seton, is one of these converts. She was drawn to enter the Catholic Church after she witnessed the devotion of Catholics to the Blessed Sacrament. She wondered about that devotion. God's grace led her to faith in the Real Presence. While still an Episcopalian, she found herself at worship in her church in New York looking out the open window and praying to Jesus in the tabernacle one block away in a Catholic church. On the night after her entrance into the Catholic Church and her First Communion, St. Elizabeth Ann wrote in her journal: "At last GOD IS MINE and I AM HIS." For the rest of her life, her deep faith and pioneering service to the Church in our young nation was nourished by the Holy Eucharist."

**Fr. Rich at OLP for 7 Years and Amazing Parish

In February I finished my seventh year as pastor at Our Lady of Peace Parish. My assignment here is now my longest as a priest in the Diocese of Erie (surpassing my 6 years and 8 months at St. Joseph in Warren, PA from 2010-2017). I am so grateful for the gift of leading this wonderful community in the mission of Jesus Christ and the opportunity it provides for me to pray, serve, learn and grow with you. One of the highlights of my experience here has been participating in the Amazing Parish Movement for the last almost two years. The Parish Leadership Team or PLT (Mary Beth Whitman, Justin Miles, Gina Adams, Warren Beaver and newly added Fr. Dan Hoffman) have been an incredible source of support and inspiration for me in leading our parish and giving me hope and strength in knowing that I do not have to lead alone. I have shared with you in the past some of the basics about the Amazing Parish Model but for those who are new to the parish or maybe missed it, I want to offer a summary again. I share excerpts from an article in the Georgia Bulletin in 2019 about Amazing Parish and I remind you that the Our Lady of Peace PLT attended the Amazing Parish Summit in Denver in June 2022 and are planning to attend again in August 2024.

"What Amazing Parish does is provide pastors and their teams with tools to help transform their parish from maintenance mode to a mission-driven culture. It starts with a cohesive leadership team founded on three building blocks: a culture of prayer, a culture of healthy teamwork and a culture of active discipleship. These cultures are meant to seep into the very marrow of parish life, so that, for example, someone who visits a parish office encounters joyful discipleship (and not, as Pat Lencioni (the founder of Amazing Parish) notes, a somber, transactional environment). At the Amazing Parish Summit, the AP Team combined principles and best practices, offering solid insights in addition to possible activities and initiatives to implement. Amazing Parish now offers free coaching to help keep teams accountable (which OLP has benefited from for the last almost 2 years). At a time when trust, transparency, accountability, co-responsibility and ministry burnout are vivid concerns, Amazing Parish offers a practical response that recognizes and appreciates both pastors and the need for collaboration when it comes to shouldering the responsibilities of parish leadership. As Amazing Parish makes clear, it's not about the pastor sharing his authority but rather about the pastor sharing his burdens. He knows he has a team standing behind him-that "has his back"-and is also willing and empowered to call him out and challenge him when necessary. Everyone of us as disciples could benefit from that type of accountability in our lives."

I thank God, our PLT, staff and all of you for making my seven years at OLP a true time of blessing and growth and I hope and pray that we can keep growing in Christ to eternity!
