

SAVED BY GOD'S LOVE

From the Pastor's Desk...

Blessed 5th Sunday of Lent! This Sunday was traditionally called Passiontide and we continue the practice of covering the statues to take our liturgical fast of Lent even further. We have had the light over the cross to the side of the sanctuary off during Lent until this weekend. Now the light is on the cross to help us prepare for Holy Week and Good Friday when we will venerate this cross in a special way. Below I continue the deeper look at the Sacred Triduum and hope that it will encourage more of you to partake in these most holy days of the whole church year. Last weekend I focused on an introduction to the concept of the Sacred Triduum and a summary of Holy Thursday. This weekend I focus on Good Friday and Holy Saturday (next weekend will be the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday).

GOOD FRIDAY (March 29th) Morning Prayer at 7:00AM. Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday: it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the tabernacle is blown out, and the tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty. Jesus is gone. This is quite dramatic, reminding us that Good Friday is a solemn day of mourning and prayer.

The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass—it is a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Good Friday is the only day of the year on which no Masses are offered. These Good Friday services often take place at the time Jesus died (3pm) or during the time he hung on the cross (12-3pm). At OLP we begin the service at 1:30pm. It usually concludes around 2:45-3pm. The priests and deacon begin the service by prostrating themselves in front of the altar. A liturgy of the Word that includes the reading of John's version of the Passion begins the service. It continues with an extended Prayer of the Faithful where we pray for the church and world. Veneration of the Cross is next at this service, in which the priest and the faithful kneel before a cross and possibly kiss it or show some sign of reverence. It concludes with the distribution of Holy Communion and then concludes in silence as an invitation to continue to meditate on the truth that this day represents.

At OLP, we also have a **Tenebrae Service at 7pm**. It is a meditation on the passion and death of Jesus as well using the imagery of light and darkness.

HOLY SATURDAY (March 30th)- On this day Christ is in the tomb. There is no daytime Mass on Holy Saturday. It is still a day of fasting and sorrow before the Easter Vigil begins that evening. We recall, with Mary and the disciples, that Jesus died and was separated from them for the first time as He lay in the tomb. The faithful are expected to continue their Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday. In the Apostles Creed we pray "He descended into hell" (translated hades, that is, the temporary abode of the dead—not the eternal lake of fire) which describes what Jesus did in the time between his burial and Resurrection. Jesus descended to the realm of the dead on Holy Saturday to save the righteous souls—the Old Testament patriarchs, for example—who died before his crucifixion.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls Jesus' descent into the realm of the dead "the last phase of Jesus' messianic mission," during which he "opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before him." Before Holy Saturday, there were no souls enjoying the beatific vision of God in heaven! Christ's work on Holy Saturday is also known as the "Harrowing of Hell."

At OLP, we have Morning Prayer at 8am on this day as well as the traditional blessing of the Easter Foods (Baskets) at Noon.

- **The Feast of St. Patrick will be moved liturgically to Monday, March 18th in the Diocese of Erie since he is our diocesan patron saint (St. Patrick Church in downtown Erie was the first Cathedral of the Diocese). So the 7am and 12:10pm Mass that day will be for St. Patrick.
- **St. Joseph Table and Dinner OLP will continue its tradition of celebrating the Feast of St. Joseph, the patron of the Universal Catholic Church, with the traditional St. Joseph Table. The Table will be held on Tuesday, March 19th at 6pm in the cafeteria. We will gather for a short prayer service followed by a meatless meal. Part of the tradition of the St. Joseph Table is to provide food for those in need so you are asked to bring non-perishable food or monetary donations that will go to the West Millcreek Food Pantry.
- **Cabrini Movie This movie, by the same production company that produces "The Chosen", is about St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first canonized American citizen. Arriving in New York City in 1889, Italian immigrant Francesca Cabrini is greeted by disease, crime and impoverished children. She soon sets off on a daring mission to convince the mayor to secure housing and health care for society's most vulnerable. With broken English and poor health, Cabrini uses her entrepreneurial mind to build an empire of hope unlike anything the world has ever seen. It is showing at Tinseltown in Erie until at least March 20th but hopefully longer if it is well-supported.
- **"The Light is On for You" is Thursday, March 21st from 5:00-7:00pm (local churches are open and priests hearing confessions throughout Erie). See page 6 for participating churches.
- **Masses this Week Monday, Mar. 18th- St. Patrick, Bishop (Patronal Feast of the Diocese of Erie); Tuesday, March 19th- Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary; Wednesday, March 20th through Friday, March 22nd- Weekdays in Lent; Saturday, Mar. 23rd- St. Turibius of Mogrovejo- Bishop (16th Century leader in the Church of the New World in Peru).

**The Chrism Mass, which is Monday, March 25th at 1:00pm at St. Peter Cathedral, is one of the greatest celebrations and expressions of the community of our Diocesan Church of the entire church year. The oils, blessed by Bishop Persico, will be used for the sacraments at parishes for the next year and the priests of the diocese recommit ourselves to our priestly ministry. This is another liturgy that every Catholic should experience at least once. This is a great opportunity to show solidarity with our Bishop and your priests- we would love to pray with you there!

**24 Hour Adoration during Holy Week at OLP will be held from Tuesday, March 26th at 12:30pm to Noon on Wednesday, March 27th. Please consider signing up for a 30 or 60 minute slot, signup sheets are in the vestibule.

**Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) UPDATE We presently have 341 pledges for \$176,599 and \$92,379 paid. Recall that our overall goal is \$200,000 with our annual assessment from the Diocesan Church at \$144,333 and the cost of our church mortar pointing on the east side of the church building project being \$55,000.

**Lenten Confessions In addition to our normal weekly confession times (Wednesdays from 11:15am-Noon, Saturdays from 8:30-9am and 3:45-4:45pm) we have extra opportunities throughout Lent. They are Fridays from 6-7pm (before Stations) and after all Sunday Masses including 4:30pm.


**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021



The Sacred Triduum, the single celebration of the Lord's death and resurrection, brings rich symbols to us as we walk with Jesus in the garden, sit at the table for the Last Supper (institution of the Eucharist) and celebrate with joy as He is Risen. These special liturgies are not meant to be experienced in isolation from each other but as one celebration of Jesus Christ alive and present to us today. So make plans to be there today.
