

Family Discussion of the Week: Following the Example of Jesus

Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul; no one claimed private ownership of any possessions; everything they owned was held in common. (Acts 4:32)

DOUBT

The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number of things—from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes—are "proof that there is a God." We get so caught up in the story of "doubting Thomas" that we fail to notice that today's Gospel gives us John's account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas' disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God-the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as "God"-more remarkable. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

From the Pastor's Desk...

A blessed Divine Mercy Sunday to you! Today is also the last day of the Octave of Easter and the 2nd Second Sunday of Easter. I meant to say something about the use of the Bells at the Consecration before last weekend but time got away from me. As the Liturgy Committee reviewed the documents of the church that guide the entire Mass over the last year, we came to the Eucharistic Prayer and the option to use bells. After significant discussion it was decided to bring the bells back. The most compelling reasons to reinstate the bells were:

- Since my arrival at Our Lady of Peace, I have been asked by quite a few people if we would consider bringing the bells back during the Eucharistic Prayer. And I have always told them that I would address it with the Liturgy Committee at some point.
- 2. As we are In the midst of the Eucharistic Revival in the United States (2022-2025 AD) and coming off "The One Hour to Peace. . . from Mass to Mission" program last fall, it felt like an appropriate time to put greater emphasis on the Eucharistic Prayer where the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ and the bells help to do that.
- 3. It can be a great catechetical moment for children and their parents.
- 4. It is a practical help to call us to attention if our minds wander during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Below is a little more background to this practice since we have returned to the use of the bells. The custom originated during the 11th through the 13th centuries, when theologians were attempting to define more precisely the way in which Christ is present in the Eucharist. As Catholics continued to meditate on this profound mystery, various liturgical practices were introduced in order to signal His presence on the altar under the appearance of bread and wine. For example, in the 12th century, priests began the practice of elevating the host following the consecration. In France and England, a dark curtain was sometimes drawn to create a background against which the Eucharistic host could be seen more clearly. At early morning Masses, when it was still dark, a candle was often lit to illuminate the Eucharist at its elevation.

According to the Church's liturgical books, the first ringing may take place prior to the consecration, as a sign that this important moment in the Mass is about to take place. Typically, this pre-consecratory bell is rung when the Holy Spirit is called upon to sanctify the bread and wine (called the epiclesis), just before the celebrant begins the Institution narrative, in which Jesus' words at the Last Supper are recounted. Following this, there are usually two more times when the altar bell is rung: after the consecration of the bread and after the consecration of the wine. The bells after each consecration may be rung once or three times. We are opting for 3 rings.

Growing up at St. George, one of my favorite parts of being an altar server was ringing the consecration bells and I know the altar servers at OLP are very excited to begin this custom. So, I hope this can be another way that the Eucharistic Revival in our National Catholic Church can help us grow in Eucharistic Amazement!

May God bless our 2nd Week in Easter ahead! Fr. Rich

**Updates on Fr. Dave Whiteford and Fr. Kyle Seyler Bishop Persico extended Fr. Dave's leave of absence from 6 months to indefinite last month so please keep Fr. Dave (who was parochial vicar at OLP from 2022-2023) in your prayers and if you want to send him a note of encouragement and support feel free to drop it off at the parish office and we will forward it to him.

Fr. Kyle (who was parochial vicar at OLP from 2017-19) was reinstated to full priestly ministry last summer. He was assigned the parochial vicar at the Epiphany of the Lord Parish in Meadville while residing at Our Lady Queen of the Americas Church in Conneaut Lake. Several have asked me about Fr. Kyle over the last 6 months which reminded me that I had not publicly shared the good news of this reinstatement! Thank you for your continued prayers for Fr. Kyle over the last 5 years. **Cursillo and Divine Mercy Encounter Retreats the women of Cursillo 261 in your prayers this weekend as they participate in the retreat this weekend at Our Lady of Mercy Church in Harborcreek. Also, it's not too late to sign up for the Divine Mercy Encounter Retreat that will take place April 26-28 at St. Joseph Bread of Life Church in Erie. It is for anyone age 15 or older (including young adults and adults) and Fr. Dan and Sarah Beaver will be helping lead the April retreat. **Divine Mercy Sunday The Octave of Easter ends next Sunday, April 7th. The fact that it is the last day of the Easter Octave is reason enough to be joyful, BUT it is also the celebration of a relatively new feast in our Catholic calendar called Divine Mercy Sunday. In April 2000, Pope John Paul II declared the 2nd Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday in the Universal Church. In 1931, Our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina (Helen Kowalska) near Krakow, Poland. She writes about this vision in "The Diary of St. Faustina, Divine Mercy in My Soul." In the vision she saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her: "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You... I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory" (47, 48) "I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: 'Jesus, I trust in You' " (327). The image painted to St. Faustina's description will be displayed in Church throughout this week. Jesus also asked St. Faustina to promote a new prayer for devotion to Divine Mercy. This led to the Divine Mercy Chaplet which we will sing during our Divine Mercy Holy Hour next Sunday at 3pm. There are pamphlets that teach how to say this prayer (as well as explaining the Divine Mercy Devotion) at

the doors. We will also have an hour of confessions from 2-3pm next Sunday as well. Hopefully, this feast can motivate all of us to learn more about this great devotion to God's love and mercy, but even more importantly to ask for it!

**Faithful to the Finish 5K Our 10th Annual 5K will be in person this year on Saturday, May 11th at 8am at Presque Isle. Remember that all money raised by our 5K will go towards building up the Parish Endowment which we started with the Catholic Foundation of NWPa several years ago. Fr. **The Annunciation of the Lord is transferred this year to Monday, April 8th since it falls during Holy Week (March 25th). Holy Week and the Easter Octave take liturgical precedence over this Solemnity so April 8th is the first available day after those special weeks.

**Catholic Services Appeal 2024 (CSA) UPDATE We presently have 368 pledges for \$184,596. Recall that our overall goal is \$200,000 with our annual assessment from the Diocesan Church at \$144,333 and the cost of the mortar pointing on the church building is \$55,000. **Resurrection at OLP Our God of the Resurrection is constantly seeking to bring new life to us individually and as a church. And I believe He continues to do that at OLP. Many responses were given but a few highlights included "The One Hour to Peace. . . from Mass to Mission" experience we had last October in which over 465 people participated over 5 weeks, our wonderful youth ministry that is thriving under the leadership of Sarah Beaver, our great liturgies and music ministry, our office staff that pray and support visitors to OLP every day, our welcoming environment at Mass and community gatherings, the comradery and community at social gatherings like the parish picnic and the appreciation dinner, the growing Children's Liturgy at the I I am Mass that brings energy and life to our parish family, our RCIA program and the genuine faith and conversion seen in our candidates, the support and formation we are receiving through the Amazing Parish Movement that OLP has been participating for the last two years, and the 12 local outreach ministries in Erie that OLP regularly supports (Emmaus Soup Kitchen, Sunday Suppers, City Mission, etc).



**Catholic Church of Erie County Restructuring Remember that we are part of a bigger church community (the Diocese of Erie) and that there is a big announcement coming in regard to restructuring of the Catholic Church in Erie County on April 11. This will not likely impact OLP directly (other than probably looking at adjusting our Mass schedule) but we still want to be praying for our brothers and sisters in Christ who will be affected in a significant way. So please pray for Bishop Persico and our local church community as this announcement approaches for openness, surrender and trust that God is working and moving in all of this.

**Quotes from the USCCB's Pastoral Letter "The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church" NOV 2021 Paragraph 58-59 (END): "We have offered these reflections on the Eucharistic faith and practice of the Church as a starting point. There is much more that could be said, but what is most important is that we enter more deeply by faith and love into this great Mystery of Mysteries. Let us all ask the Lord to call us into a time of Eucharistic renewal, a time of prayer and reflection, of acts of charity and sincere repentance. The Lord is with us in the Eucharistic Mystery celebrated in our parishes and missions, in our beautiful cathedrals and in our poorest chapels. He is present and he draws near to us, so that we can draw nearer to him. The Lord is generous to us with his grace; and so we, by his grace, should always humbly ask him to give us what we need. 59. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Risen Christ says to us, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give a gift from the spring of lifegiving water (Rev 21:6). Brothers and sisters, let us thirst for the Lord who first suffered thirst for us (Jn 19:28). Let us adore Jesus who ever remains with us, on all the altars of the world, and lead others to share in our joy!"

Beginning with this year's celebration of the Sacred Triduum and the Easter Season we have re-instituted the practice of ringing the bells at Mass during the Eucharistic Prayer.

Why? Fr. Rich, Fr. Dan, Deacon John, and our Liturgy Committee all agreed that this would be another great way to highlight this sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our Christian faith, especially during these years of Eucharistic Revival.

The Church has this practice of ringing the bells during the Epiclesis (when the priest places his hands over the bread and wine to call the Holy Spirit upon them) and the two elevations of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus after Jesus' own words are prayed during the Consecration. This highlights and focuses us on the great miracle, gift, and mystery that we have just witnessed, are called to adore, and very soon to receive.



Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments - Child Abuse Prevention Month - Reporting Child Abuse: It is every adult's moral responsibility to report known or suspected abuse or neglect of a minor to the responsible authorities. Physical and sexual abuse of minors are pervasive societal problems, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. In the 2022 Pennsylvania statewide report there were 4,992 substantiated reports of child abuse and 440 more cases in the court system. 2,056 or 38.2% of the substantiated reported were for sexual abuse, 1,501 were physical abuse. 62.2% of the victims were female. Parents remain the persons most responsible for abuse of their children. To report child abuse, call Childline at 1-800-932-0323 (anytime 24/7). For particular questions on reporting abuse in the Diocese of Erie, you may call the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth at 814-824-1195.


