

Jesus prayed, "I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me." (John 18:20-21)

#### LOVE ONE ANOTHER

In the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday of Easter we are met with an extraordinary challenge: Jesus commands us to "love one another as I love you" (John 15:12). The letter from John echoes this command. Of course, we are to love those in our family, those we work with, those we like. But the scriptures make clear that we are also to love those we never notice, those we purposely avoid, and even those we are tempted to despise.

In this Sunday's selection from the Acts of the Apostles Peter shows us how far God's love extends, and how far our love should extend in response. Peter realizes that God no longer "shows partiality" to the Jews, sharing divine love exclusively with them. Christ has revealed that God's love extends to all people, and so should ours. 

Sanibel Stravinsky, our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade catechist, and Rose Girard/
Nicole Nowakowski our 3<sup>rd</sup> grade religion teachers at the school,
for all the work they did to get our children ready for this
special moment.

\*\* Masses this Week Monday, May 13<sup>th</sup>- Our Lady of Fatima; Tuesday, May 14<sup>th</sup>- St. Matthias, Apostle; Wednesday, May 15<sup>th</sup>- 47<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Dedication of Our Lady of Peace Church; Thursday, May 16<sup>th</sup> and Friday, May 17<sup>th</sup>- Weekdays in Easter; Saturday, May 18<sup>th</sup>- St. John I, Pope and Martyr (6<sup>th</sup> Century).

- \*\*Pentecost Sunday Next Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup> is the great feast of Pentecost, the last day of the Easter Season and the traditional "birthday" of the Church (the church is 1,991 years old if you go with the traditional date of the Resurrection and Pentecost as 33 AD). You are encouraged to wear red since it is the liturgical color of all feasts of the Holy Spirit and we will celebrate with full solemnity.
- \*\*Solemn Evening Prayer & Benediction to end the Easter Season Also, on Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup> we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament following the 4:30pm Mass (around 5:15pm) and then Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction at 6pm. This will be the official conclusion of the Easter Season so come celebrate the birthday of our church and the last prayer of Easter before we enter the long season of Ordinary Time. (There will be birthday cake afterward!).
- \*\*Deacon Luke Daghir Ordination to Priesthood will be Friday, May 24<sup>th</sup> at 7pm at St. Peter Cathedral and everyone is invited to celebrate this Mass with him. The following weekend, Fr. Luke will lead a Corpus Christi Holy Hour on Saturday, June 1<sup>st</sup> at 7pm at OLP to pray in Thanksgiving for his ordination and to pray for more vocations to the priesthood. He will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving with us at 11am Mass on Sunday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>, with a light reception after. Everyone is invited to both of these prayers with Fr. Luke!
- \*\*Marian Opportunities for May Being a Marian Parish, it is good to remember that we seek to honor Mary in a special way throughout the month of May. It began at Our Lady of Peace with our school celebration of Mary's Day on May 2nd. Other opportunities to honor Mary the rest of the month are:

- 5. Weekday Rosary at OLP in church starting at 11:40am.





## Please Be Alert for Scams to **Parishioners:**

## Be cautious about sharing personal information

A scam is being perpetrated across the country by malicious individuals preying on churches and members of the clergy.

The scam plays on your sympathies or natural inclination to be helpful. Any communication asking you to purchase gift cards should be considered a scam. Always verify such requests by calling the parish directly. Don't use phone numbers in the fraudulent email or text. Always look for the parish's official phone number found on the diocesan website or in the parish's Sunday bulletin. In this age when personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, its clergy and entities such as parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business information by any method unless initiated by you.

Should you receive an unsolicited request for money or personal information - including a request for gift cards of any type - exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or entity by using official contact information only.
