

Family Discussion of the Week: Living in the Spirit

And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues (Acts 2:4) **Adults:** When have you felt filled with the Spirit and emboldened to act with courage? **Kids:** When have you felt strength from outside of yourself to do what was right?

ALL ARE SENT

Fifty days after Easter Sunday we celebrate the fulfillment of all God's promises in the feast of Pentecost, a feast that has sometimes been called the birthday of the church. One last time we are reminded that we Christians have received the Holy Spirit, not for our own benefit, but to enable us to follow our Christian vocation.

The centerpiece of the scriptures for Pentecost is the account in Acts of the Apostles of the sending of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The other readings for this Sunday help us to understand what it means to live out our Christian vocation. Paul's letter shows us the gifts and fruits that the Holy Spirit gives to us.

John's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has sent all his disciples to share his forgiveness and peace, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

From the Pastor's Desk...

Happy Birthday, Church of God! As we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, we continue to ask for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to breathe new inspiration, strength and joy into our parish community! Please specifically pray for our parish staff who will be welcoming a new member in June (Andy Heinlein, our part time Outreach Coordinator), and our Pastoral Council (PC) and Parish Leadership Team (PLT) as we will all be gathering this week to discern goals for our parish in the next one to three years. Pray that we can keep in mind the new ways that God is calling us to be church and renew the spirit of evangelization in our community that goes beyond the normal ways of just maintaining our mission that the Catholic Church has gotten complacent in over the last 50 years. I will certainly keep you posted on the discussion and discernment of the group.

Also pray for our efforts to define the roles of staff, PLT and PC and how we all work together. Amazing Parish who is coaching us in their leadership model which emphasizes the creation of the PLT, admittedly does not have clear vision on exactly how the PLT and PC work together so OLP is in a bit of a pioneering spot to create what makes sense for us. Because this effort is still ongoing and we believe we need some time to try out our new plan, I, with the support of PLT and PC, have decided to suspend new nominations to the Pastoral Council until next year. Normally we would have already taken nominations and would be choosing, by lot, the new members this week. I am grateful to the present PC members who were eligible, and who said yes to extending their time for one year. Next spring we will start a new process for appointing Pastoral Council members. I hope that makes sense and please do not hesitate to speak to me or any of our Parish Leadership Team Members (Fr. Dan Hoffman, Mary Beth Whitman, Gina Adams, Warren Beaver, Justin Miles) or Pastoral Council Members (Justin Miles-Facilitator, Nancy Sherwood- Vice, Fr. Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction to end the Easter **Season On Sunday, May 19th we will have **Exposition of the** Blessed Sacrament following the 4:30pm Mass (around 5:15pm). At 6pm there will be a Liturgy of the Word Service that will include the readings from the Pentecost Vigil that was reintroduced to the Catholic Liturgy in 1980s but has not been celebrated to any extent that I have seen in my priesthood. The Service will be followed by Benediction. This will be the official conclusion of the Easter Season; so come celebrate the birthday of our church and the last prayer of Easter before we enter the long season of Ordinary Time. (There will be birthday cake afterward-around 6:45-7pm!)

- **Thank you to all who supported our 10th Annual Faithful to the Finish 5K last weekend. We had a beautiful morning with over 100 participants. He will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving with us at 11am Mass on Sunday, June 2nd, with a light reception after. Everyone is invited to both of these prayers with Fr. Luke!
- **A Eucharistic Procession will again be held on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ on Sunday, June 2nd at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral in downtown Erie. Bishop Persico is scheduled to lead the procession. This has been a great unifying celebration for the Catholic Community of Erie and I hope many of you will make the effort to be a part of it! **Eucharistic Caravan In May through July there will be 4 Eucharistic Processions that will be making their way across the United States with the ultimate destination of Indianapolis, Indiana where the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years will take place from July 17-21. The Seton Route Procession will start in Connecticut and pass through Pennsylvania. I am encouraging members of the OLP community to join in part of this Procession on Tuesday, June 18th in New Castle, PA (Diocese of Pittsburgh). There will be a mass at St. Vitus Church at 9am and then a procession of the Eucharist from 9:45-11am to St. Mary Church. Those who want to carpool or caravan will meet at OLP at 7am to depart.





Please Be Alert for Scams to Parishioners:

Be cautious about sharing personal information

A scam is being perpetrated across the country by malicious individuals preying on churches and members of the clergy.

The scam plays on your sympathies or natural inclination to be helpful. Any communication asking you to purchase gift cards should be considered a scam. Always verify such requests by calling the parish directly. Don't use phone numbers in the fraudulent email or text. Always look for the parish's official phone number found on the diocesan website or in the parish's Sunday bulletin. In this age when personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, its clergy and entities such as parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business information by any method unless initiated by you.

Should you receive an unsolicited request for money or personal information - including a request for gift cards of any type - exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or entity by using official contact information only.
