

THE RESPONSIBILITY OF OUR FAITH

Today is a day simply to ponder the fact that in baptism, we were claimed by God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The first reading from Deuteronomy prompts us to fix in our hearts the truth that God is the Lord of both heaven and earth and there is no other god. Saint Paul reminds us that, because we received the Spirit of adoption in baptism, we are now children of God. In the Gospel Jesus charges us with the responsibility to make other disciples. These realities make today's solemnity a day of praise, adoration, and responsibility. It is a fitting day to thank God for the absolutely free gift of faith that we were given in baptism. It is also a day to ask God for strength to take on the responsibility of sharing that faith with others.

Other notes from the pastor...

Memorial Day Mass/Praying for the Dead/Purgatory Join your OLP family on Monday at 9am to not just commemorate those who have given their lives in service to our country, but, more importantly, to pray the most effective prayer we have in our Catholic tradition for them... come join in offering Mass for **them. We do so, following the example of Judas Maccabee in the Bible. Remember that in the Second Book of Maccabees, Judas takes up a collection for an expiatory sacrifice for those who had died in battle against the Greeks. It was found out that those slain had worshiped false gods and Judas makes atonement for them so that they might be freed of sin. Scripture says that "in doing this he acted in a very excellent and noble way." (2 Macc. 12: 38-46) This event in the Bible shows the efficaciousness of praying for the dead. It reaffirms our fundamental Catholic belief that in a mysterious way, our prayers can assist those who have died and are experiencing the purifying process of purgatory. The Catechism, in its section on the final purification, or purgatory (#s1030-1032) explains it this way: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the

holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." So to all those who ask "does the Catholic Church/do we still believe in Purgatory?"- hopefully the example of Judas Maccabee and 2,000 years of tradition of praying for the dead help you to see the answer to your question is YES!

**Newly ordained Fr. Luke Daghir will lead a Corpus Christi Holy Hour on Saturday, June 1st at 7pm at OLP to pray in Thanksgiving for his ordination and to pray for more vocations to the priesthood. He will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at the 11am Mass on Sunday, June 2nd with a light reception after. Everyone is invited to both of these prayers with Fr. Luke! We also look forward to hosting Luke's parents that weekend as his family will join us from St. Marys, PA.

**A Eucharistic Procession will again be held on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ on Sunday, June 2nd at 2pm at St. Peter Cathedral in downtown Erie. Bishop Persico is scheduled to lead the procession. This has been a great unifying celebration for the Catholic Community of Erie and I hope many of our OLP members will make the effort to be a part of it!

**Eucharistic Caravan Beginning in May through July there are four Eucharistic Processions making their way across the United States with the ultimate destination of Indianapolis, Indiana where the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years will take place July 17-21. 



Be cautious about sharing personal info A scam is being perpetrated across the country by malicious individuals preying on churches and members of the clergy.

The scam plays on your natural inclination to be helpful. Any communication asking you to purchase gift cards should be considered a scam. Always verify such requests by calling the parish directly. Don't use phone numbers in the fraudulent email or text. Always look for the parish's official phone number found on the diocesan website or in the parish's Sunday bulletin. When personal data can be misused by scam artists, please be aware that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Erie, its clergy, parishes and schools will never solicit your personal or business info by any method.

Should you receive an unsolicited request for money or personal information - including a request for gift cards of any type - exercise extreme caution. Contact the person or parish by using official contact information only.
